#### **COMPLAINT**

Plaintiff, George Lawton ("Lawton"), by the undersigned attorneys, makes the following averments:

1. This civil action is brought pursuant to the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act of 1994, 38 U.S.C. §§ 4301-4335, as amended ("USERRA").

#### **PARTIES**

- 2. Lawton maintains a residence in Newark, New Jersey, within the jurisdiction of this Court.
- 3. Defendant, the Newark Public Schools ("NPS"), maintains a place of business at 2 Cedar Street, Newark, New Jersey, within the jurisdiction of this Court.

#### JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 4. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this action pursuant to 38 U.S.C. § 4323(b)(3).
- Venue is proper in this district under 38 U.S.C. § 4323(c)(2) because the NPS is a 5. political subdivision of the State of New Jersey and maintains a place of business within this jurisdiction.

#### **CLAIMS FOR RELIEF**

- 6. In 1993, Lawton joined the United States Naval Reserve ("USNR") and continues to serve in the USNR.
- From 1997 through August 2005 Lawton had worked continuously for the NPS as a 7. substitute teacher.
- By letter dated July 15, 2005, the NPS offered Lawton a full-time teaching position 8. in its Academy of Vocational Careers for the 2005-2006 academic year.
- By letter dated August 17, 2005, Lawton notified the NPS in writing that he was 9. being mobilized for service with his USNR unit and deployed overseas until at least April 2006.

Lawton informed the NPS that he wished to secure the full-time teaching position offered to him by the NPS upon his return from active duty.

- By letter dated August 20, 2006, Lawton notified the NPS in writing that his 10. active duty status had been extended through August 2007, and that he would secure his full-time and substitute teaching positions upon his return from active duty.
  - 11. On or about September 30, 2007, Lawton completed his active military duty.
- 12. Beginning in August 2007, through a series of personal visits and telephone contacts with NPS officials, Lawton applied for reemployment and sought information concerning both immediate reemployment as a substitute teacher, and commencing employment in the previously offered full-time teaching position. Lawton received no information from the NPS and was not reemployed.
- On October 10, 2007, Lawton contacted John Shackelford ("Shackelford"), Co-13. Ombudsman Director of the New Jersey Committee for Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve concerning the NPS's lack of cooperation in reemploying Lawton. Shackelford contacted the NPS to explain the NPS' obligations and Lawton's rights under USERRA, but the NPS took no action.
- In November 2007. Lawton was informed by the NPS that his file had been 14. "purged" from the NPS's list of substitute teachers and that he would have to file a new substitute teacher application. Lawton complied, submitting the new substitute teacher application package to the NPS on or about November 16, 2007. To date, Lawton has received no response.
  - The NPS violated Sections 4312 and 4313 of USERRA by failing to promptly 15.

and properly reemploy Lawton as a substitute teacher upon his return from active service, or to a position of like seniority, status and pay, and otherwise place him in the position that he would have been in had his employment not been interrupted by military service.

- 16. The NPS's violation of USERRA was willful.
- 17. Because of the NPS's conduct, Lawton suffered monetary damages, including lost wages and benefits, in an amount to be proven at trial.

### PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Lawton prays that the Court enter judgment against the NPS and, further, that the Court:

- A. Declare that the NPS's refusal to reemploy Lawton promptly was a violation of Sections 4312 and 4313 of USERRA;
- B. Require that the NPS comply with the provisions of USERRA by reemploying Lawton as a substitute teacher, or in a position of like seniority, status, and pay;
- C. Require that the NPS fully comply with the provisions of USERRA by paying

  Lawton all amounts due to him for his loss of wages, lost benefits and lost opportunities caused

  by the NPS's failure or refusal to comply with the provisions of USERRA;
  - D. Declare that the NPS's violations of USERRA were willful;
- E. Order that the NPS pay Lawton as liquidated damages an amount equal to the amount of his lost compensation and other benefits suffered by reason of the NPS's willful violations of USERRA;
- F. Enjoin the NPS from taking any action against Lawton that fails to comply with the provisions of USERRA;

- Award Lawton prejudgement interest on the amount of lost wages and benefits G. found due; and
  - H. Grant such other and further relief as may be just and proper.
