## **United States v. City of Jackson (S.D. Miss.)**

## NOTICE TO POTENTIAL VICTIMS OF DISABILITY DISCRIMINATION BY THE CITY OF JACKSON

On June 26, 2017, the United States District Court for the Southern District of Mississippi entered a Consent Decree resolving a disability discrimination lawsuit brought by the United States against the City of Jackson, Mississippi ("the City"). The lawsuit alleged that the City engaged in a pattern or practice of housing discrimination by excluding persons in recovery from alcohol or substance abuse living in group homes from most residential areas in the City, in violation of the Fair Housing Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act.

Under the Consent Order, a Settlement Fund has been established to compensate persons whose rights may have been violated by the City. You may qualify to recover from this Settlement Fund if you are a person with a disability who resided or was eligible to reside at a group home operated by Urban Rehab, Inc.
