



The following matters were discussed in the meeting on January 16, 1963, with Leon Jaworski and Rr. Vaughn:

- 1. Ar. Jaworski and his associates will present all matters to the Court, including the position of the government on whatever pre-trial a trees are taken up at the hearing on February S.
- 2. I indertook to arrange a meeting with comment for Governor Barnett in New Orleans Curing the week beginning January 21.
- In hith respect to the possibility of a commission; to take evidence, it was agreed that the disadvantages of having a hearing before eight judges were so great that we should take the anavoidable risk of telling the Court that, in our view, the Court had the power to follow that course. It is recognized that, if counsel for Darmett do not agree to this procedure, there is a substantial risk of severall by the dupreme Court. Another course which should be suggested to the Court, is the event of no agreement with counsel for Darmett, would be for the case to be heard by a panel of three judges, with their decision reviewable by the entire beach of the Fifth Circuit.

If evidence is taken before a single person, it was agreed that the person should preferably be a judge, but that the government should not suggest a mane to the Coust of Appeals if that were avoidable. If a mane had to be suggested, the judges mentioned were Grewster, Prettynam, Bootle, Jolt, Swigart, or a meaber of the Court of Appeals.

The Court has also directed that I request counsel to confer, if possible, and exchange memoranda touching on any of the points to be raised at the hearing, and to file motions or pleas that are to be made in writing on or before February 1st, accompanied by such memorandum as may be deemed appropriate.

"The Court also requests that the parties stipulate as to any formal matters as to which there is no real contest, and that the parties be prepared to state to the Court at the time of the hearing what issues remain for consideration thereafter."

Compliance by counsel for the defendants with such requests or directions, or any attempted compliance therewith,

shall not operate as a waiver of any rights possessed or claimed by the defendants or either of them, and will not hereafter be so construed by the Court.
