ARTMENT OF HUSTICE

DATE: June 19.

Mr. Percy Williams of the President's Committee, on Equal Employment Opportunity informed me yesterday that the Committee has made only a preliminary survey of Air Pax, and therefore its information is rather scanty. The Committee's real investigation begins this afternoon, and is expected to be completed by Friday of this week. He will call me Friday and give me a verbal report after which he can furnish a written report if such is desired.

Mr. Williams said the preliminary survey reveals the following.

- 1. Air Pax has contracts with the Air Force but the dollar value of the contracts is not known at present.
- 2. The company employs only two Negroes -- & janitor and a woman whose exact duties are unknown.
- 3. The company apparently obtains most of its employees through the State Employment Service. During the last twelve months about 130 employees were referred by this Service to the company, including either seven or seventeen Negroes. All of the Negroes were referred for janitorial or custodial work. Whether the company has any training program of its own is not khown.

Concerning the State Employment Office, Mrs. Richardson told me Monday that Cambridge Negroes

believe that Mr. Frederick Prichett, Manager of the Cambridge office, follows a practice of restricting referrals of Negroes to lower paid jobs, such as, domestic, custodial and cannery employment. According to Mrs. Richardson, Mr. Prichett has been known to advise employers against hiring Negroes for skilled or semi-skilled work.

Dr. King to Give Talk in Suffolk

SUFFOLK, Va., (AP). - Negro organizations have completed plans for tonight's appearance by the Rev. Martin Luther King, leader in the campaign against racial discrimination.

But they were carefully avoiding any show that might provoke violence.

Lock J. Parker, president of Local 26 of the Retail, Whole-sale and Department Store Wokers Union, one of three sponsors, said signs have been prepared to welcome Dr. King, but were being held back until his arrival from Norfolk.

A few scattered placards in hew scattered placards in the Negro sections of Suffolk bore pictures of Dr. King and urged attendance at a "city-wide freedom rally."

Dr. King's visit originally had been planned as a local affair but was later given State-wide billing.
