ABOUT THE INITIATIVE:

The Grants to Reduce Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking on Campus Program (Campus Program) is authorized by 34 U.S.C. § 20125. Beginning in FY 2023, the appropriation for the Campus Program includes an allocation to support Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs), and Tribal Colleges and Universities (TCUs), in recognition of the unique issues and challenges they face in preventing and responding to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. Office on Violence Against Women is using this funding to implement the Strengthening Culturally Specific Campus' Approaches to Address Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault, and Stalking Initiative.



WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO APPLY:

Eligible entities for this initiative are minority serving institutions, including **Tribal Colleges** and **Universities**.

Project activities will focus on building the capacity of HBCUs, HSIs, and TCUs to establish culturally relevant strategies in addressing domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking, including the development of effective response protocols and prevention programming.
