SUPPLEMENT TO UNITED STATES' MOTION TO

COMPEL PRODUCTION OF CERTAIN ORIGINAL AUDIO TAPES

On February 24, 1998, the United States filed a motion to compel defendants to produce certain original audio tapes for use at trial. In their opposition, defendants suggested that they did not need to produce the tapes, in part, because they were "agreeable to allowing" the United States "reasonable access to [defendants'] records and documents, including the original tapes." *See* Defs. Response at 6 (filed March 3, 1998). In considering the motion to compel, the Court should be aware, as evidenced by the attached letters, that defendants have now refused the United States access to inspect any tapes of their city council or utility board meetings, even though such tapes are otherwise publicly available under

Stilwell's own City Charter. See Art. XI, § 123(b).
