About noon the group had lined up outside the Courthouse in twos as showing by Rev. D. L. Tucker, Pastor of Turner Chapel. Some of the group had spent only a short time in the Courthouse. They are marching out to the edge of the street where they crossed but block in the middle of the intersection and started marching, without anyone saying anything, toward the downtown section.


- 3 copies 14 - Group of Negroes going into Leflore County Courthouse to take voting exam... no one said anything.
- 3 copies 15 - City police placed barricades at street at edge of Courthouse to stop autos from running in front of Courthouse. Negroes came by foot and walked by barricades. Whites said nothing to them just watched.
- 3 copies 16 - About same as No. 15
- 3 copies 17 - Police start to move whites who quietly gather to watch Negroes and cameramen.
- 3 copies 18 - Some of the whites had been moved from corner -- see photo no. 16
- 3 copies 19 - Looking South at street barricaded in front of Leflore Courthouse.
- 3 copies 20 - Looking north from Courthouse. Whites on lower right corner moved and others moved back up street. Chief CURTIS LARY with megaphone.
- 3 copies 21 - Negroes had gone into the courthouse to take vot exam. After they lined up in rows (two) to march as they did the day before they started but before they got to the street police Chief CURTIS LARY told them that he has asked them not to get into a large group, but to keep in small-so when they got to end of walk at street he divided them into small groups and sent them into different directions.
- 3 copies 22 - About the same as No. 21 last of group.













