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21st Century Integrated Digital Experience Act - Progress Report on Implementation and Modernizing Agency Websites and Digital Services

As required by the [21st Century Integrated Digital Experience Act](#) (21st Century IDEA), this report describes the Department’s progress in modernizing key websites and digital services operated by Department of Justice.

Key Websites and Digital Services

In our initial report on this matter in 2019, Department of Justice identified the following websites and digital services as high-traffic and/or important for public engagement. These sites continue to be the most significant and widely used websites in 2020, accounting for more than 91 percent of all viewing sessions for websites maintained by the Department of Justice during the months of January – November 2020. The sites are listed here in order from highest to lowest number of user sessions recorded.
