INDICTMENT

COUNT ONE

THE GRAND JURY CHARGES THAT:

At all times relevant to this indictment:

- 1. Sun Deli, a convenience store located at 1341 Union Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by sourcing products sold in its store from New York and New Jersey to Pennsylvania.
- 2. On or about May 7, 2015, in Allentown, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

JACOB PABON

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendant JACOB PABON, and two other persons known to the grand jury, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is U.S. currency valued at approximately \$1,500

and other items, from Sun Deli located at 1341 Union Street, in Allentown, and from customers of Sun Deli, in the presence of employees and customers of Sun Deli and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employees and customers of Sun Deli, by brandishing and using firearms to threaten and control the victims to steal cash and other things of value from them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT TWO

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

1. On or about May 7, 2015, in Allentown, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendant

JACOB PABON

and persons known to the grand jury, knowingly used and carried, and aided and abetted the use and carrying of, firearms during and in relation to a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interferes with interstate commerce, as charged in Count One of this indictment, and brandished, and aided and abetted the brandishing of, these firearms.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c)(1) and 2.

COUNT THREE

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

At all times relevant to this indictment:

- 1. Speedway, a gas station and convenience store located at 1043-45 Lehigh Street, Allentown, Pennsylvania, was a business engaged in and affecting interstate commerce by sourcing products sold in its store from New Jersey to Pennsylvania.
- 2. On or about May 29, 2015, in Allentown, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

JACOB PABON and LYTIC FAUNTLEROY, a/k/a "Tiki,"

obstructed, delayed, and affected commerce and the movement of articles and commodities in commerce, and attempted to do so, by robbery, in that, defendants JACOB PABON and LYTIC FAUNTLEROY, and another person known to the grand jury, unlawfully took and obtained, and aided and abetted the unlawful taking and obtaining of, property, that is U.S. currency valued at approximately \$100, from Speedway located at 1043-45 Lehigh Street, in Allentown, and from a customer of Speedway, in the presence of an employee and customers of Speedway and against their will, by means of actual and threatened force, violence, and fear of injury, immediate and future to the employee and customers of Speedway, by brandishing and using firearms to threaten and control the victims to steal cash from them.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 1951(a) and 2.

COUNT FOUR

THE GRAND JURY FURTHER CHARGES THAT:

 On or about May 29, 2015, in Allentown, in the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, defendants

JACOB PABON and LYTIC FAUNTLEROY, a/k/a "Tiki,"

and a person known to the grand jury knowingly used and carried, and aided and abetted the use and carrying of, firearms during and in relation to a crime of violence for which they may be prosecuted in a court of the United States, that is, robbery which interferes with interstate commerce, as charged in Count Three of this indictment, and brandished, and aided and abetted the brandishing of, these firearms.

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 924(c)(1) and 2.
