**INDICTMENT**

The Grand Jury charges:

**COUNT ONE**

On or about November 17, 2020, in the Middle District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant,

GREGORY EDWARD MCLEAN,  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3210,"  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3213,"

did knowingly distribute a visual depiction using any means and facility of interstate and foreign commerce by any means, that is, via the internet, when the production of the visual depiction involved the use of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct, and the visual depiction was of such conduct, the visual depiction being specifically identified in the computer file with a title ending in "1270d.mp4."

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(2) and (b)(1).

**COUNT TWO**

On or about November 17, 2020, in the Middle District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant,

GREGORY EDWARD MCLEAN,  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3210,"  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3213,"

did knowingly distribute a visual depiction using any means and facility of interstate and foreign commerce by any means, that is, via the internet, when the production of the visual depiction involved the use of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct, and the visual depiction was of such conduct, the visual depiction being specifically identified in the computer file with a title ending in "457f0.mp4."

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(2) and (b)(1).

**COUNT THREE**

On or about November 4, 2021, in the Middle District of Florida, and elsewhere, the defendant,

GREGORY EDWARD MCLEAN,  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3210,"  
a/k/a "twisteddesire3213,"

did knowingly possess one or more matters that contained visual depictions that had been mailed, shipped, and transported using any means and facility of

interstate and foreign commerce, and in and affecting interstate and foreign commerce, and that had been produced using materials that had been mailed, shipped, and transported using any means and facility of interstate and foreign commerce, the production of which visual depictions involved the use of a minor engaging in sexually explicit conduct and which visual depictions were of such conduct, and the depictions involved at least one prepubescent minor.

In violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252(a)(4)(B) and (b)(2).

**FORFEITURE**

1. The allegations contained in Counts One through Three are incorporated by reference for the purpose of alleging forfeitures, pursuant to the provisions of 18 U.S.C. § 2253.

2. Upon conviction of a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2252, the defendant shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2253:

a. Any visual depiction described in 18 U.S.C. §§ 2251, 2251A, or 2252, 2252A, 2252B, or 2260 of chapter 110 of Title 18, or any book, magazine, periodical, film, videotape, or other matter which contains any such visual depiction, which was produced, transported, mailed, shipped, or received in violation of chapter 110;

b. Any property, real or personal, constituting or traceable to

gross profits or other proceeds obtained from such offense; and

c. Any property, real or personal, used or intended to be used to commit or to promote the commission of such offense or any property traceable to such property.

3. The property to be forfeited includes, but is not limited to, a Motorola Droid Turbo cellular telephone, a Samsung Galaxy S20 Ultra cellular telephone, a Western Digital hard drive, and a Flash Drive USB20.

4. If any of the property described above, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- a. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- b. has been transferred or sold to, or deposited with, a third person;
- c. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the Court;
- d. has been substantially diminished in value; or
- e. has been commingled with other property which cannot be subdivided without difficulty;


the United States shall be entitled to forfeiture of substitute property pursuant to 21 U.S.C. § 853(p), as incorporated by 18 U.S.C. § 2253(b).
