5/ Title II of the James Zadroga 9/11 Health and Compensation Act of 2010 (P.L. 111-347) reopened the September 11th Victim Compensation Fund (9/11 VCF), extending eligibility for compensation associated with physical harm stemming from debris removal and extending the deadline for claims associated with harms not discovered before the Fund's original deadline. The 9/11 VCF was established by Public Law 107-42 as an alternative to litigation, and had terminated operations in 2004. Public Law 111-347 reopened the 9/11 VCF and made \$2.775 billion available for the settlement of claim determinations issued on or before December 17, 2015. After all claims in this group were resolved, roughly all remaining funds (\$813 million) became available in the new Victims Compensation Fund, cited on the next line/footnote.

6/ Public Law 114-113 provided \$4.6 billion starting in 2017 for the settlement of claims related to the September 11th attacks. In addition, the administrative fees for the following accounts must take a 6.2 percent reduction for sequestration in FY 2019: US Victims of State Sponsored Terrorism Fund (\$186,000) and the Commissary Fund (\$4.4 million).
