UPDATED GUIDANCE ON EOIR'S RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 OUTBREAK

PURPOSE: Provide updated guidance on EOIR's response to the COVID-19 outbreak

CANCELLATION: Policy Memorandum 20-13, *EOIR Practices Related to the COVID-19 Outbreak* (June 11, 2020)

The Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) is committed to providing timely guidance to EOIR personnel, practitioners, and parties in proceedings before the agency. Given the evolving nature of the pandemic, updated guidance regarding EOIR's response to COVID-19 continues to be necessary and frequent. This Director's Memorandum (DM) supersedes and rescinds Policy Memorandum (PM) 20-13 as outdated.

In March 2020, EOIR issued a PM to provide guidance to staff and the public regarding EOIR's response to the COVID-19 pandemic.¹ That PM was superseded by a June 2020 PM.² EOIR has also disseminated information to the public in a variety of additional formats, including Frequently Asked Questions,³ a Public Health Notice,⁴ a dedicated "Public Health" section on each individual immigration court web page,⁵ and an "Operational Status" web page.⁶

Recognizing that memoranda are not the optimal vehicle for reporting operational adjustments under these circumstances, EOIR will no longer issue these formal documents and encourages the public instead to monitor the agency's web pages for updates. Accordingly, EOIR's website
