

Legal Access Services for Reunified Families Program



Under the *Ms. L. v. ICE* Settlement Agreement, the Executive Office for Immigration Review (EOIR) facilitates the provision of immigration legal services to individuals who have been confirmed as **Ms. L. Settlement Class members**.

These legal services are available to *Ms. L. Settlement Class* members and are available in multiple languages:

- ❖ **Group Orientations**, where you can learn about the U.S. immigration system, your rights as a *Ms. L. Settlement Class* member, and the immigration options that are available to you.
- ❖ **Group Workshops**, where you can learn how to complete legal documents and immigration applications, including applications for asylum, parole, and employment authorization, as well as responses to requests for evidence (RFE) and notices of intent to deny (NOID).
- ❖ **Pro Bono Referral**, where you may be able to receive help from an attorney or representative to assist you in immigration court or before United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

Free immigration services are also available to certain Qualifying Additional Family Members of *Ms. L. Settlement Class* members, including help with parole and employment authorization applications.
