1. List of All Documents in an eROP

A listing of all documents included in an eROP is available without having to download the entire eROP. This allows DHS users to quickly locate a specific document within an eROP.

Previously, filers could only see the status of documents they had electronically filed. With this release DHS users can view all documents accepted into an eROP regardless of uploader (i.e., DHS, respondent attorney/accredited representative, OCIJ, or BIA).

2. Details of All Documents in an eROP

The details categories listed below will help DHS users identify the contents of each individual document form, which is especially useful when looking to reference a particular document.

- Document Type
- Filed On Date
- Filed By (i.e., DHS, respondent attorney/accredited representative, OCIJ, or BIA)

3. View Individual Documents in an eROP

Previously, DHS users had to download the entire eROP to see individual documents in the eROP. Now DHS users can quickly locate and view a specific document within an eROP without downloading anything.




Figure 1: View Individual Documents in an eROP – List of eROPs Screen






Figure 2: View Individual Documents in an eROP – List of Documents Screen

4. Display DHS Uploaded Documents

View My Uploads now contains a list of documents uploaded by DHS only, which allows DHS users to keep track of their individual uploads.

5. Display Status of DHS Uploaded Documents

View My Uploads has details including the status of individual documents. The portal will display the individual status of each document after the court's acceptance, rejection, or removal. This will allow users to see the status of each document without having to locate the acceptance or rejection notice or email.

6. View All DHS Uploaded Documents Across Cases at Once

View My Uploads also provides the Alien Number. This allows users to review individual uploads across different cases, which is particularly helpful for DHS users when tracking all the cases they have electronically filed against.




Figure 4: View My Uploads Screen

7. Amended Document Category/Subcategories for Document Upload

Based on feedback from pilot users, EOIR has expanded the list of document subcategories available when electronically filing with the court. Specifically, the Applications & Fees and Briefs & Evidence lists were expanded to include more typical types of DHS filings. The following table shows the expanded document subcategories that are now available.

8. Remove Hearing Location from Document Upload

Based on feedback from the ECAS pilot sites, EOIR has removed the hearing location from the DHS Portal document upload screen. Users will only have to file with a specific court base city. Users will no longer need to identify the specific hearing location within the base city when filing an initiation document.




Figure 5: Initiation Document Upload Form Screen – Base City Only Required

9. Removed the Emergency Checkbox from Document Upload

EOIR was able to reduce the number of steps required when filing through the portal by removing the Emergency field from the document upload. To streamline the electronic filing process, EOIR will automatically mark documents as emergency based on the document subcategory (e.g., Motion to Stay).

10. Security Disclaimer Added

A security disclaimer was added to the portal. It highlights the terms and conditions for using the DHS Portal, which includes authorized use specifications.






Figure 6: Security Disclaimer Screen

The What's New button points DHS users to <u>EOIR's 1³ page</u> where they can review the latest release enhancements and changes to the DHS Portal.




Figure 7: What's New Button
