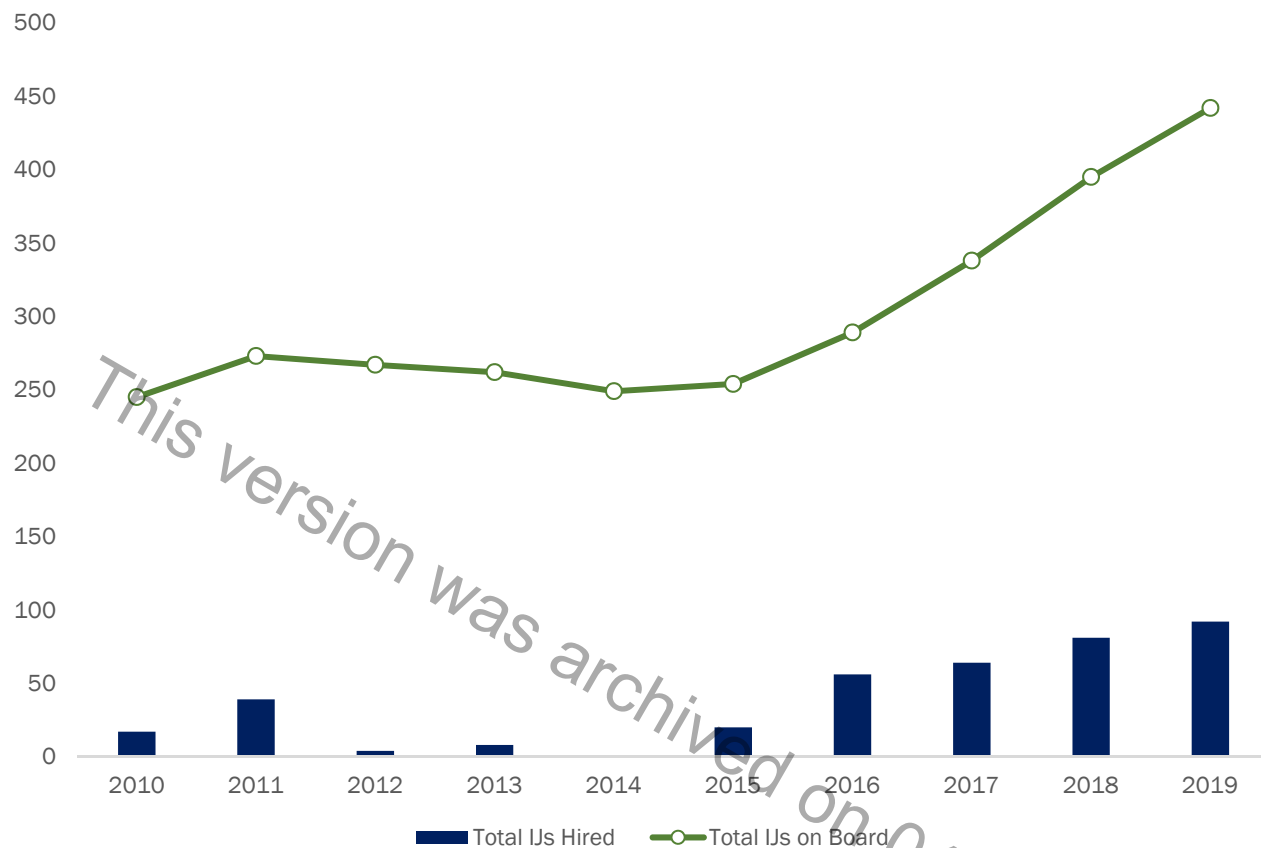

New Cases and Total Completions



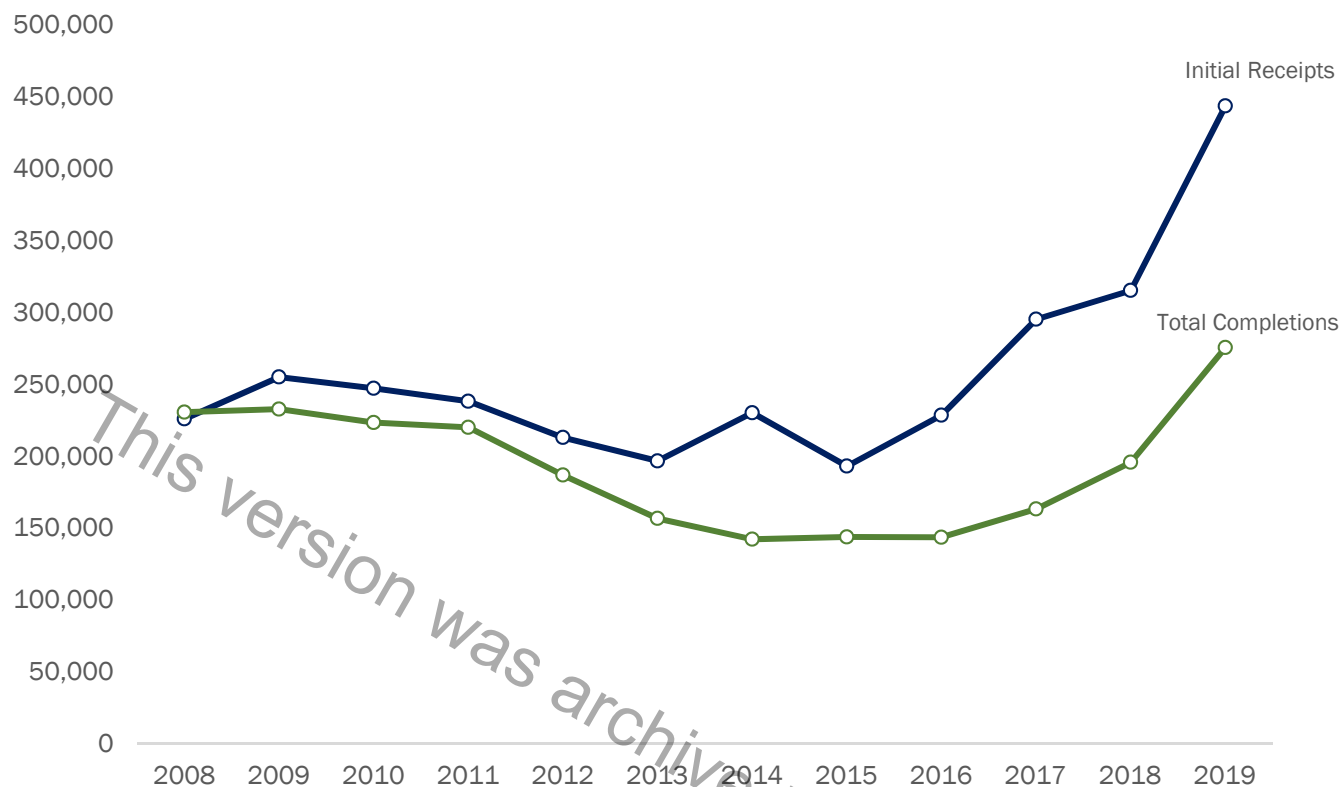

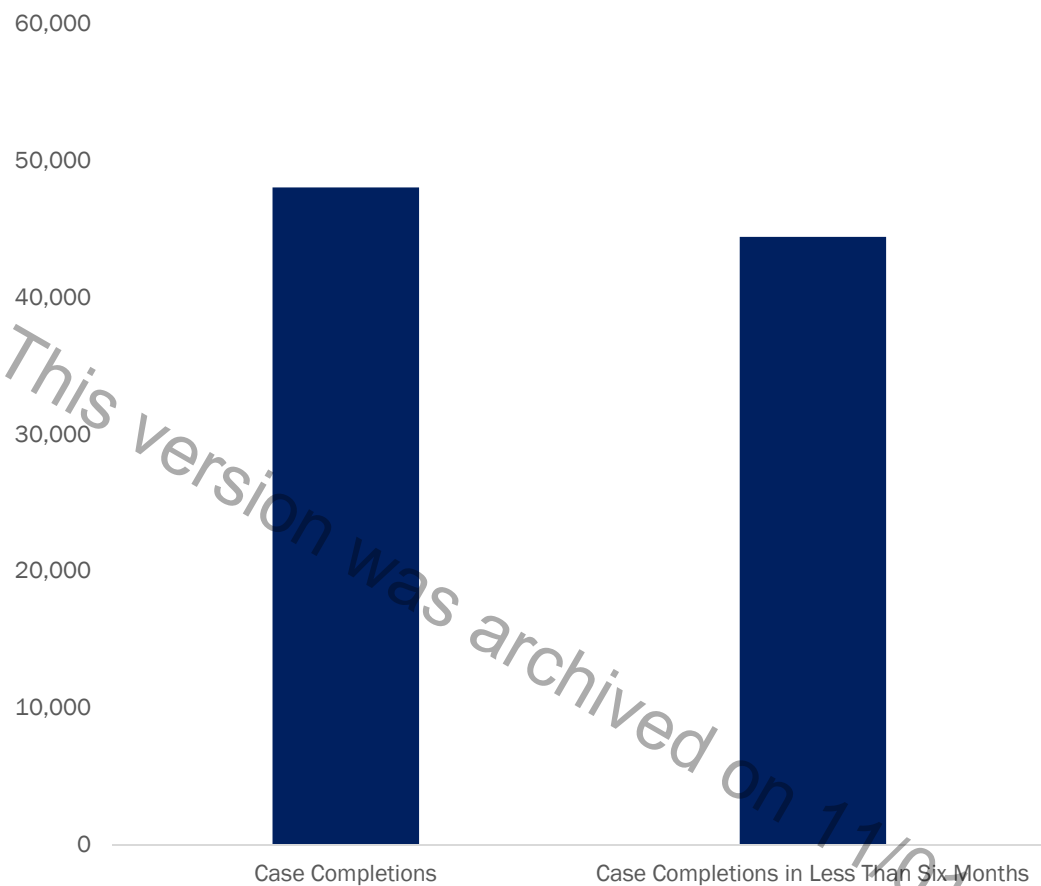

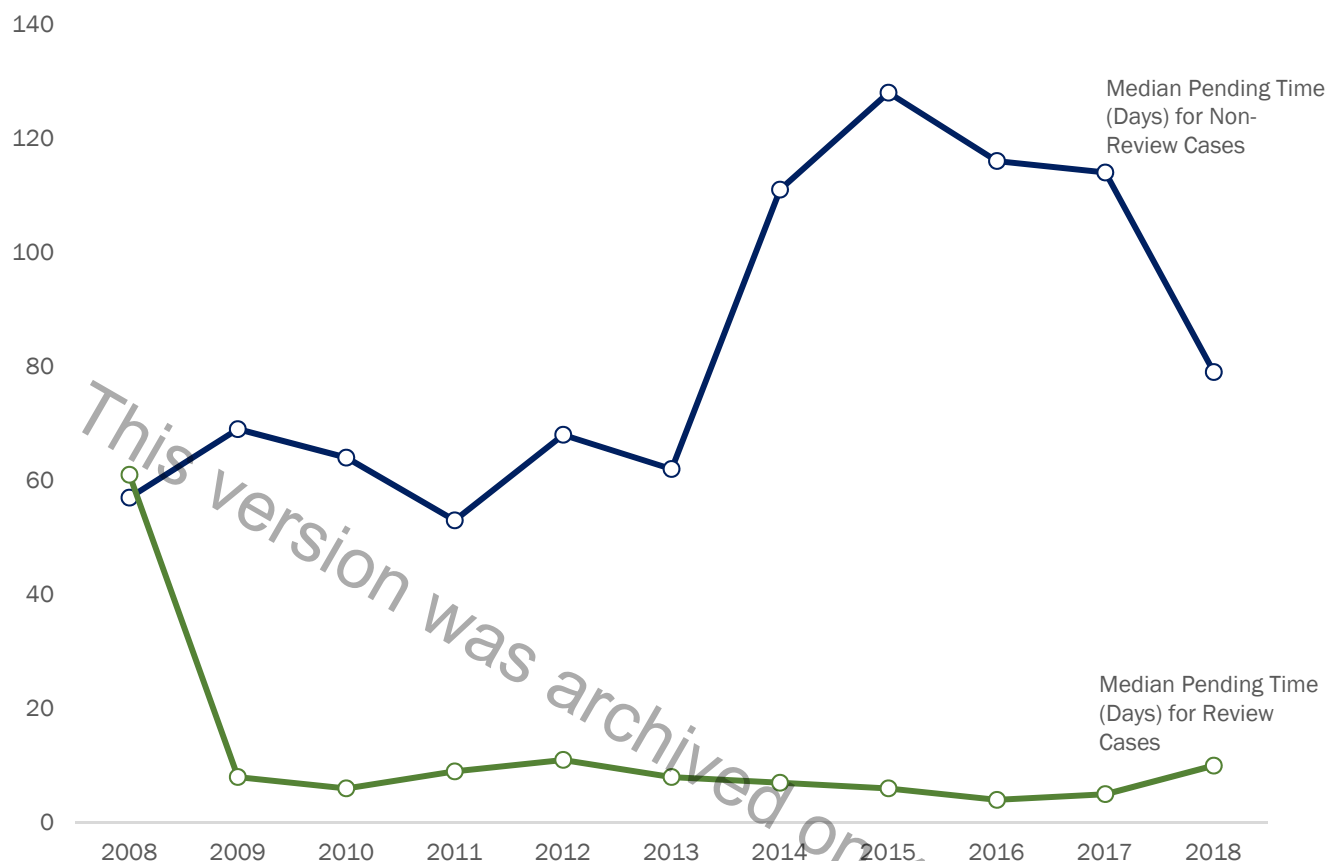

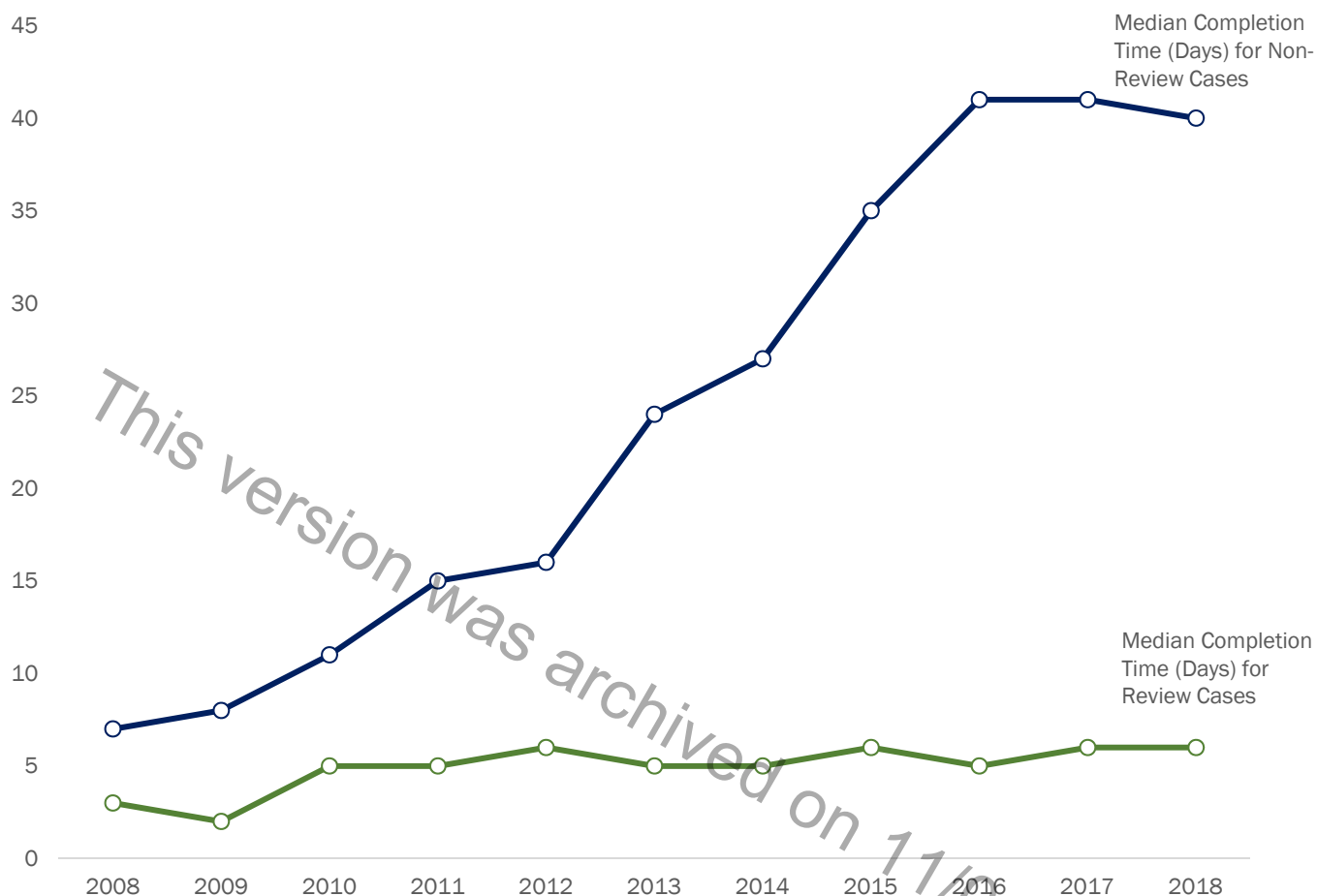

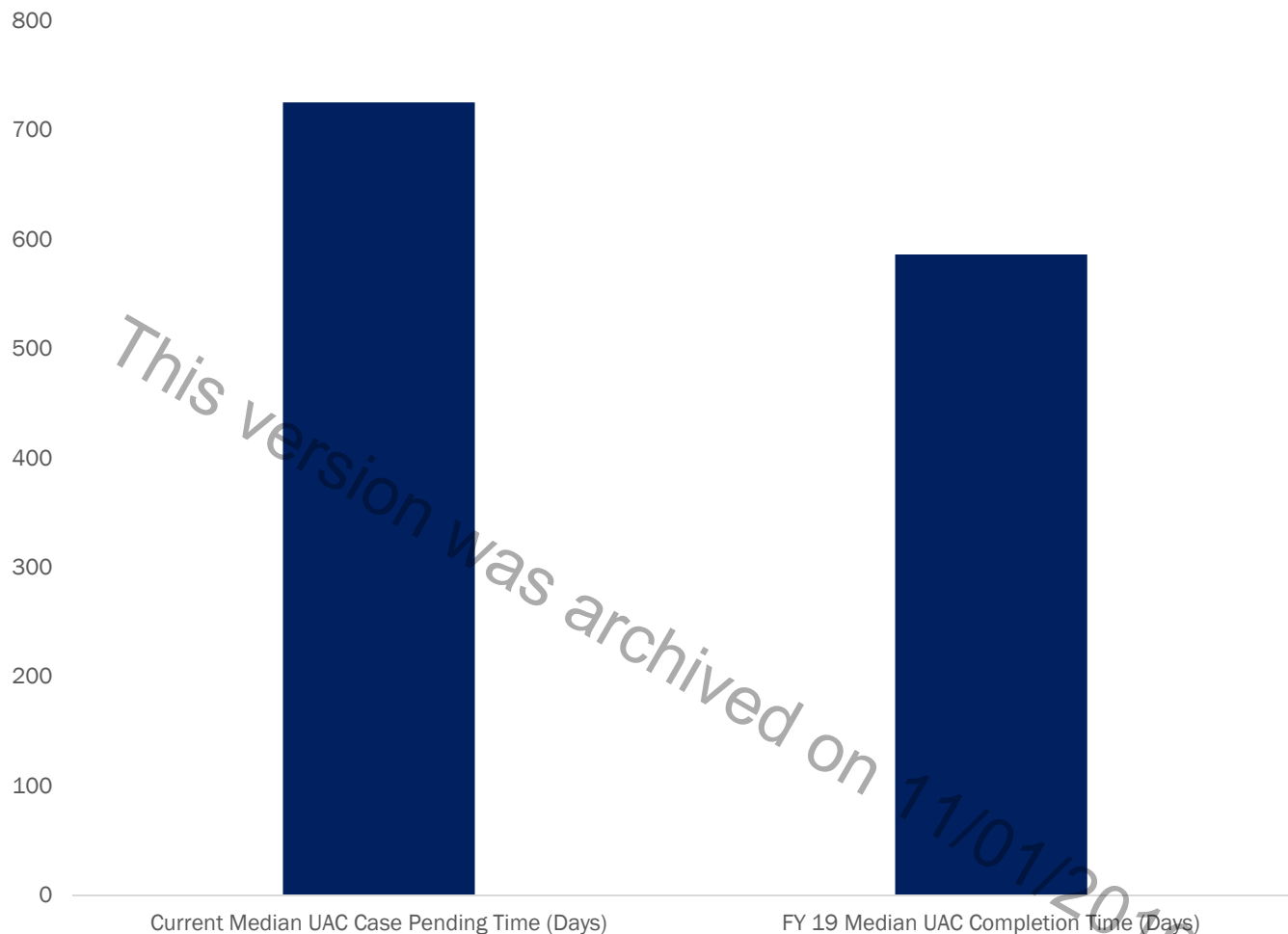

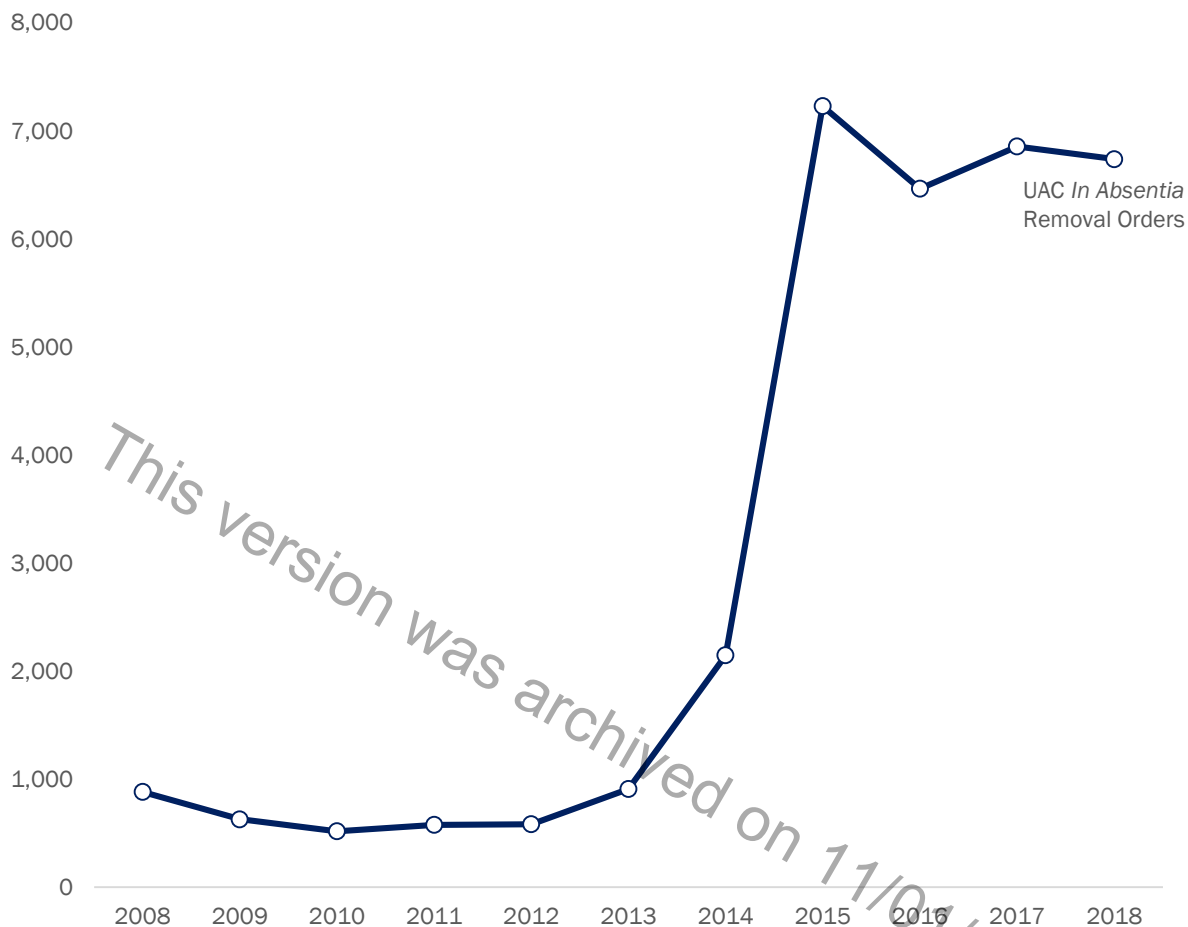
Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time

Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) *In Absentia* Removal Orders¹

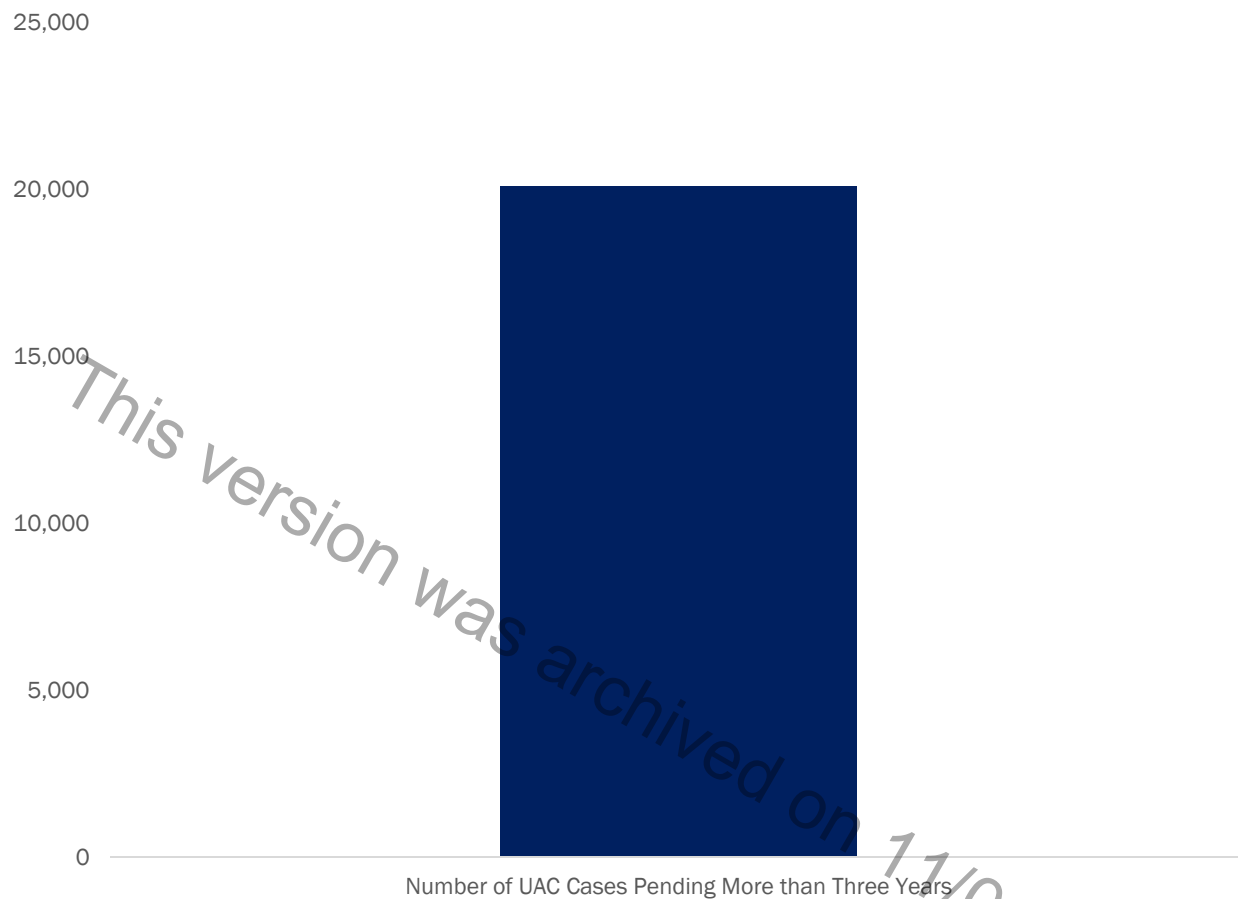

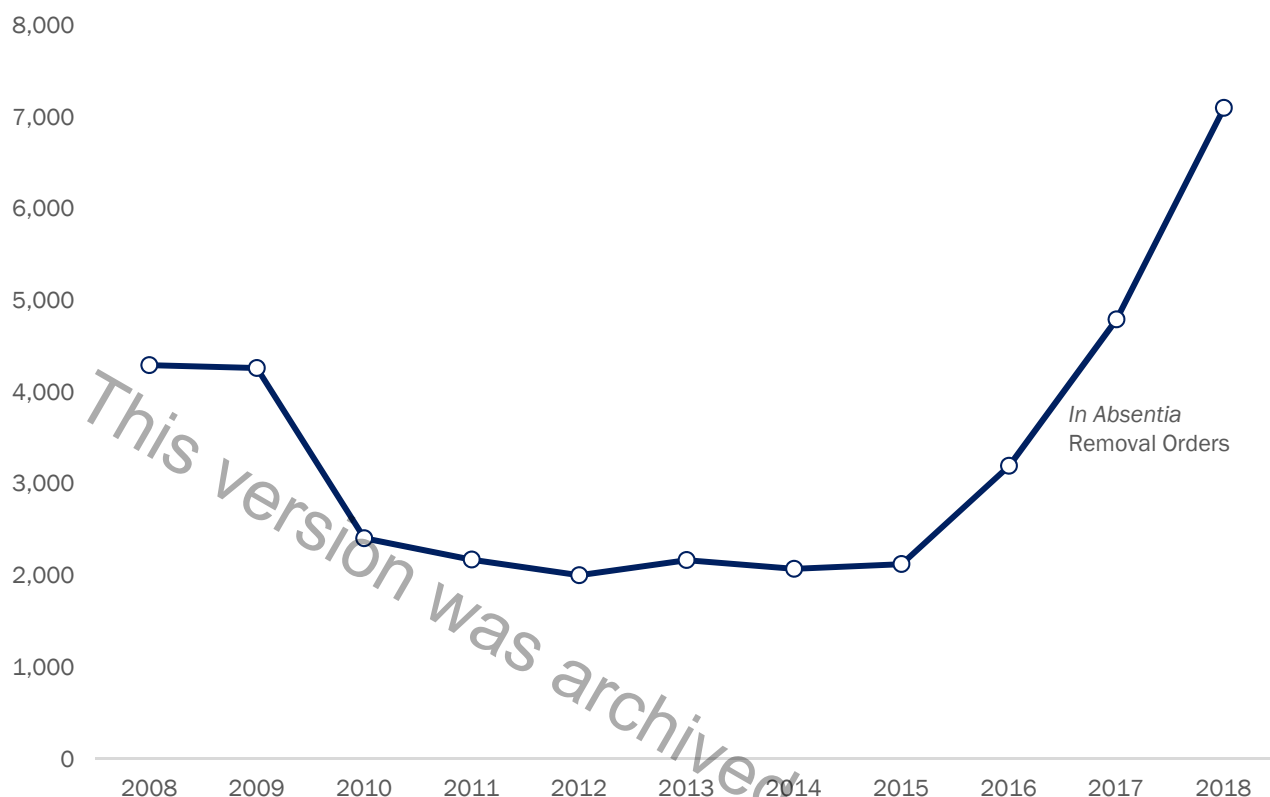

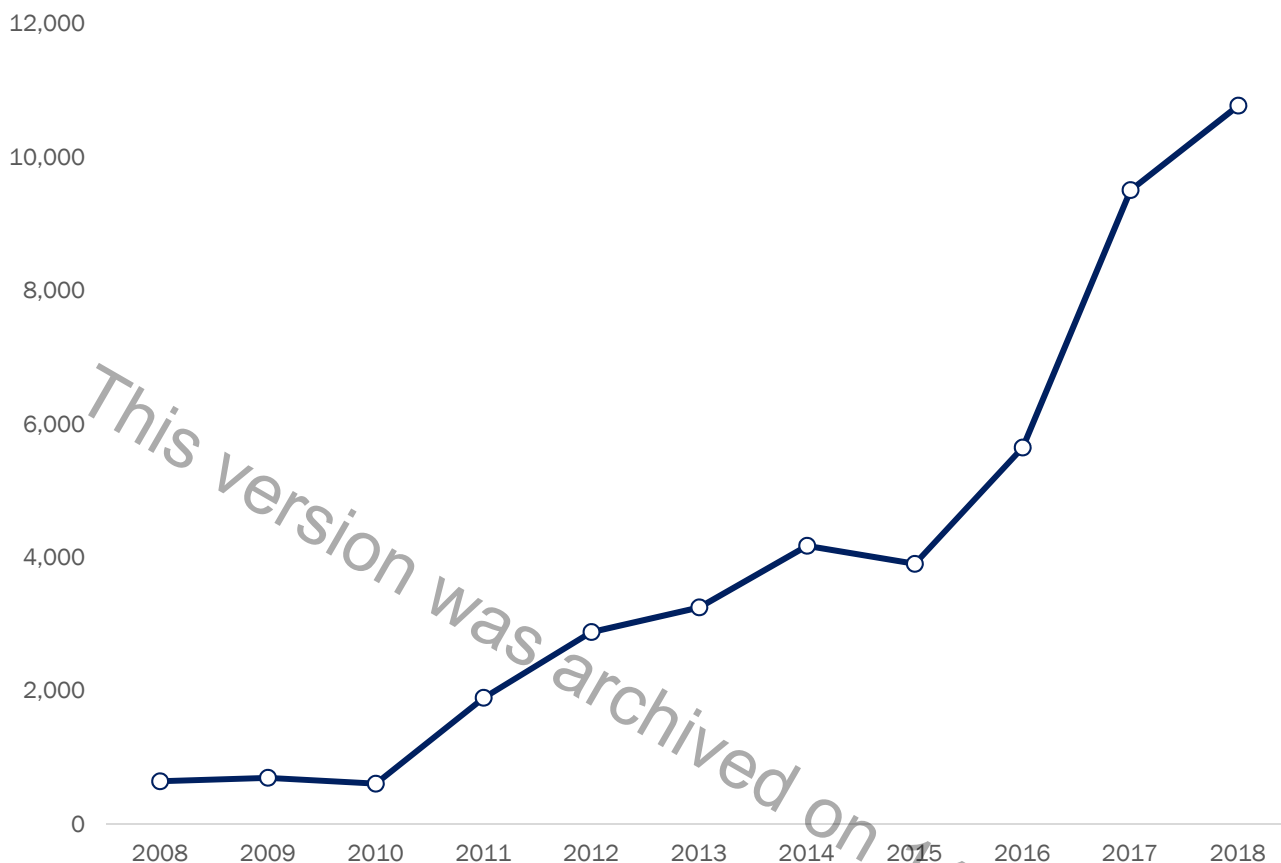

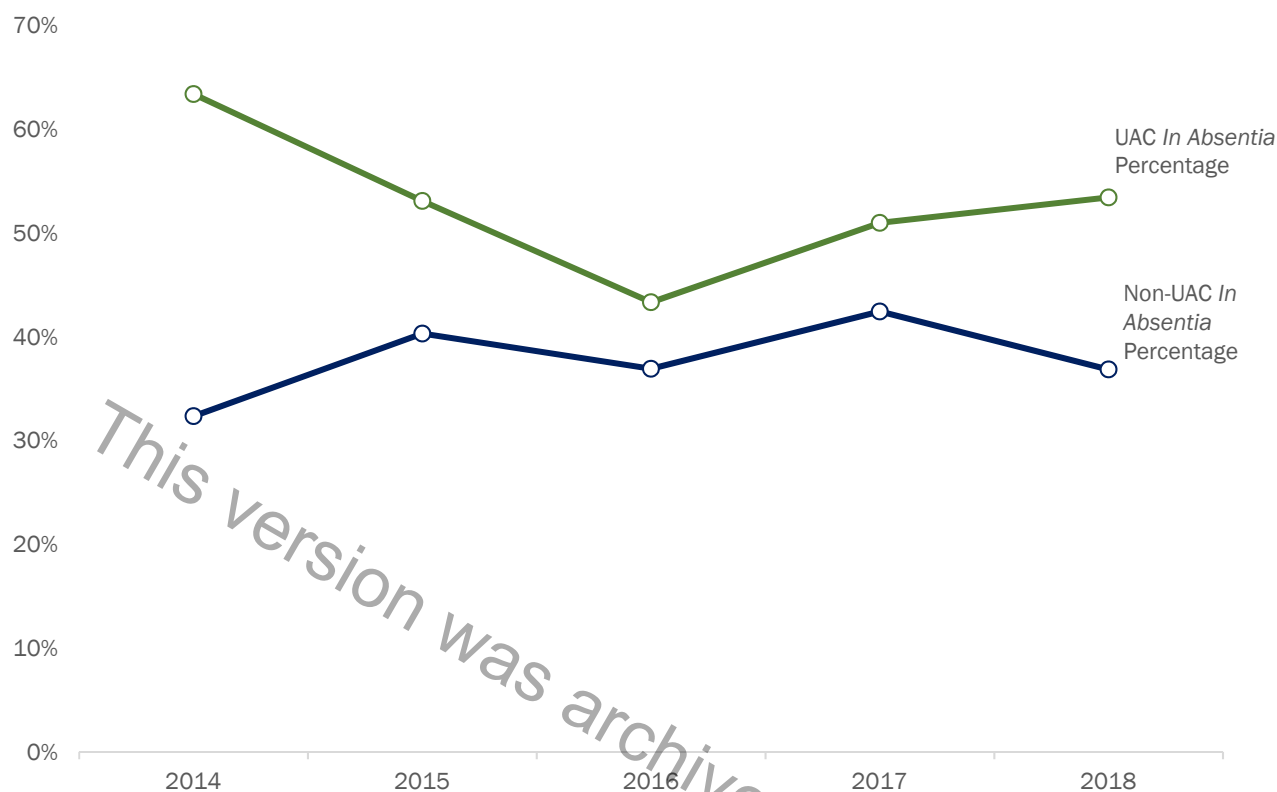

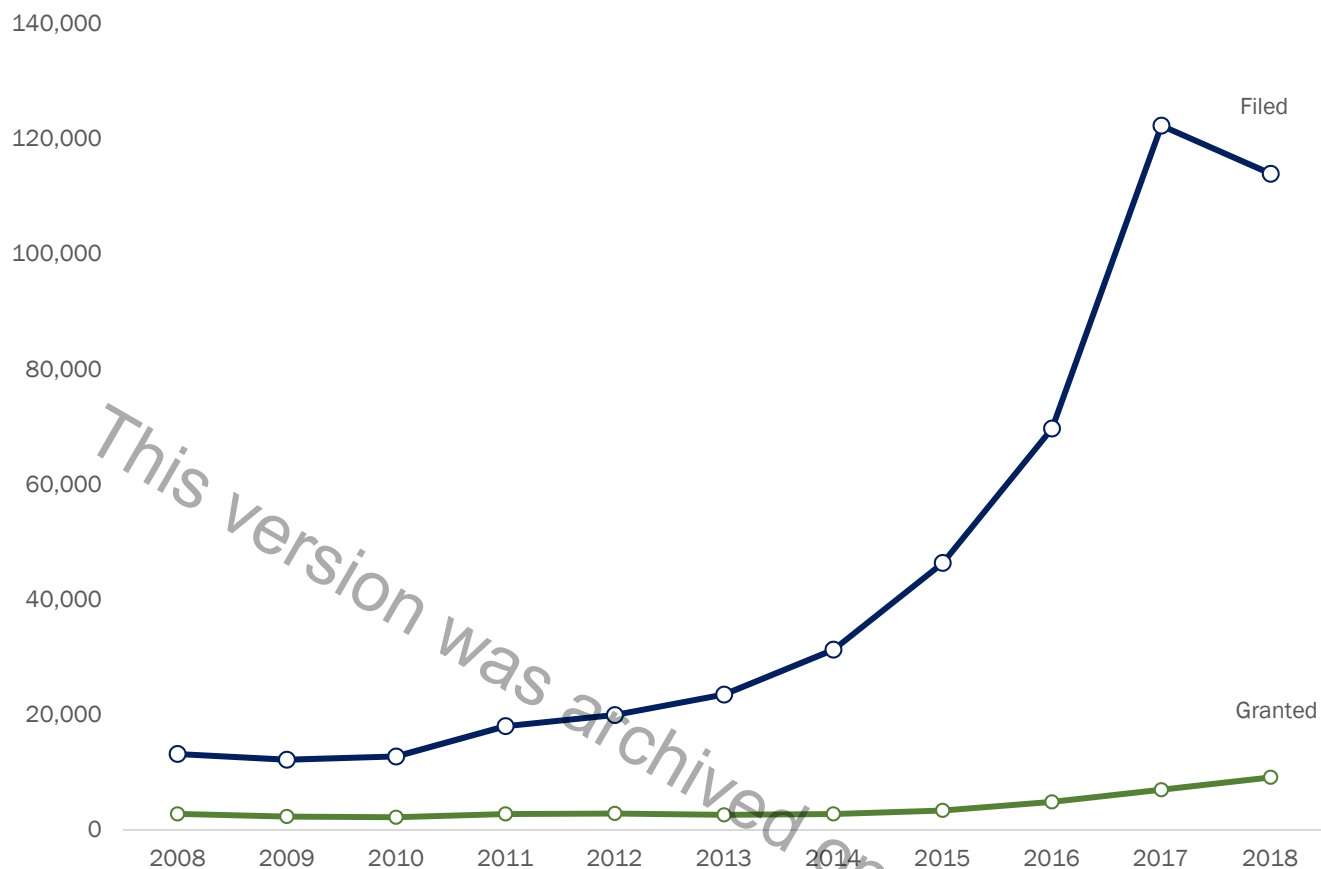
Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹

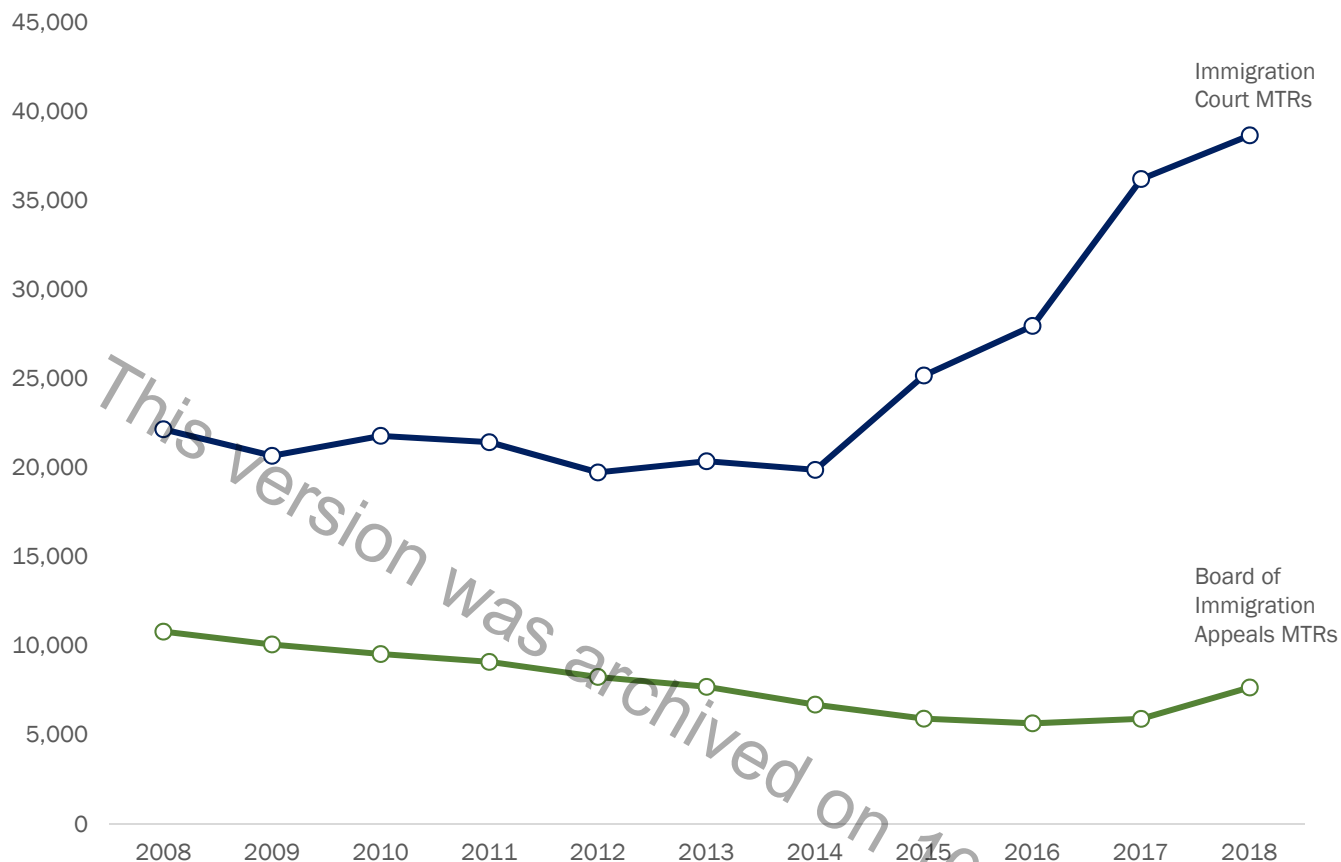

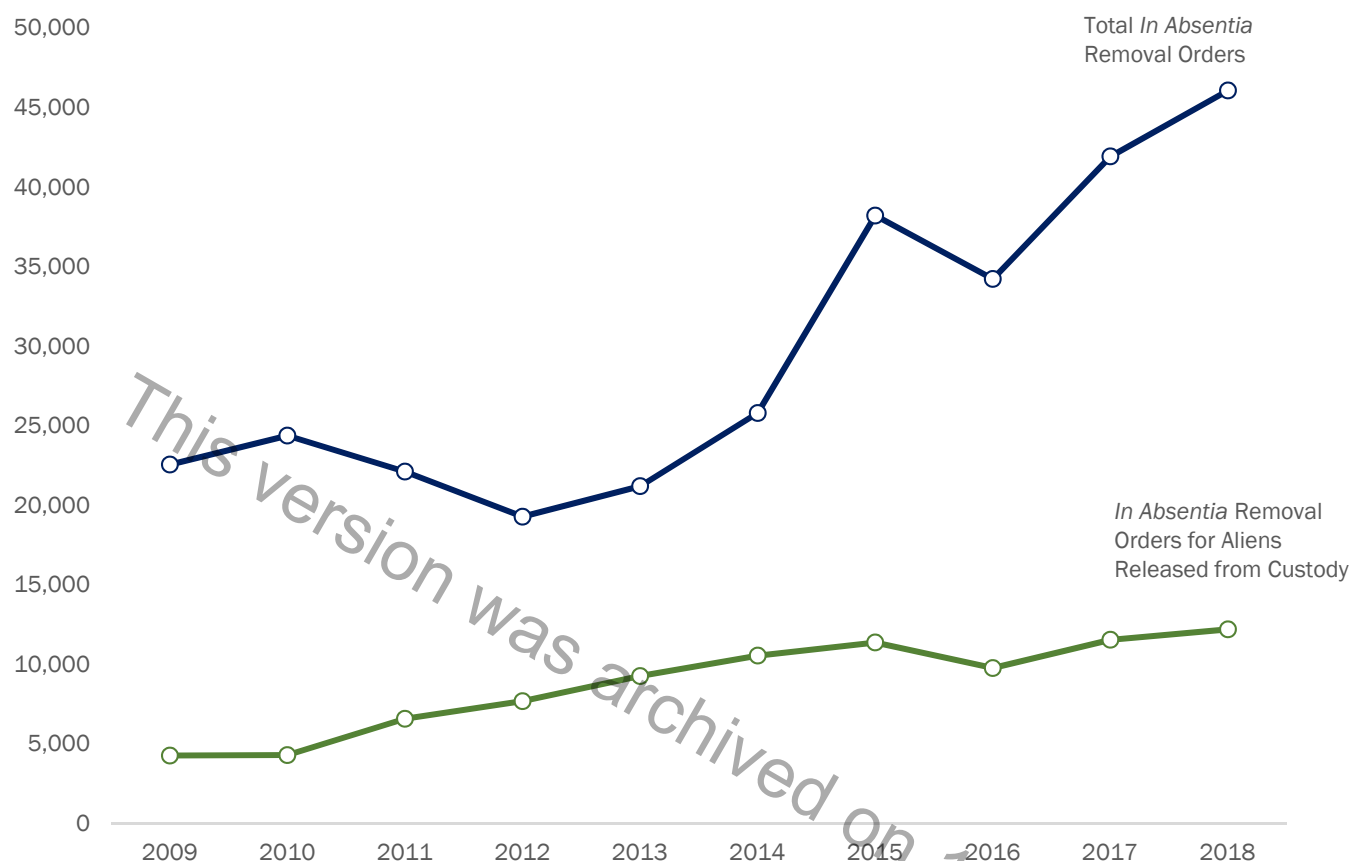

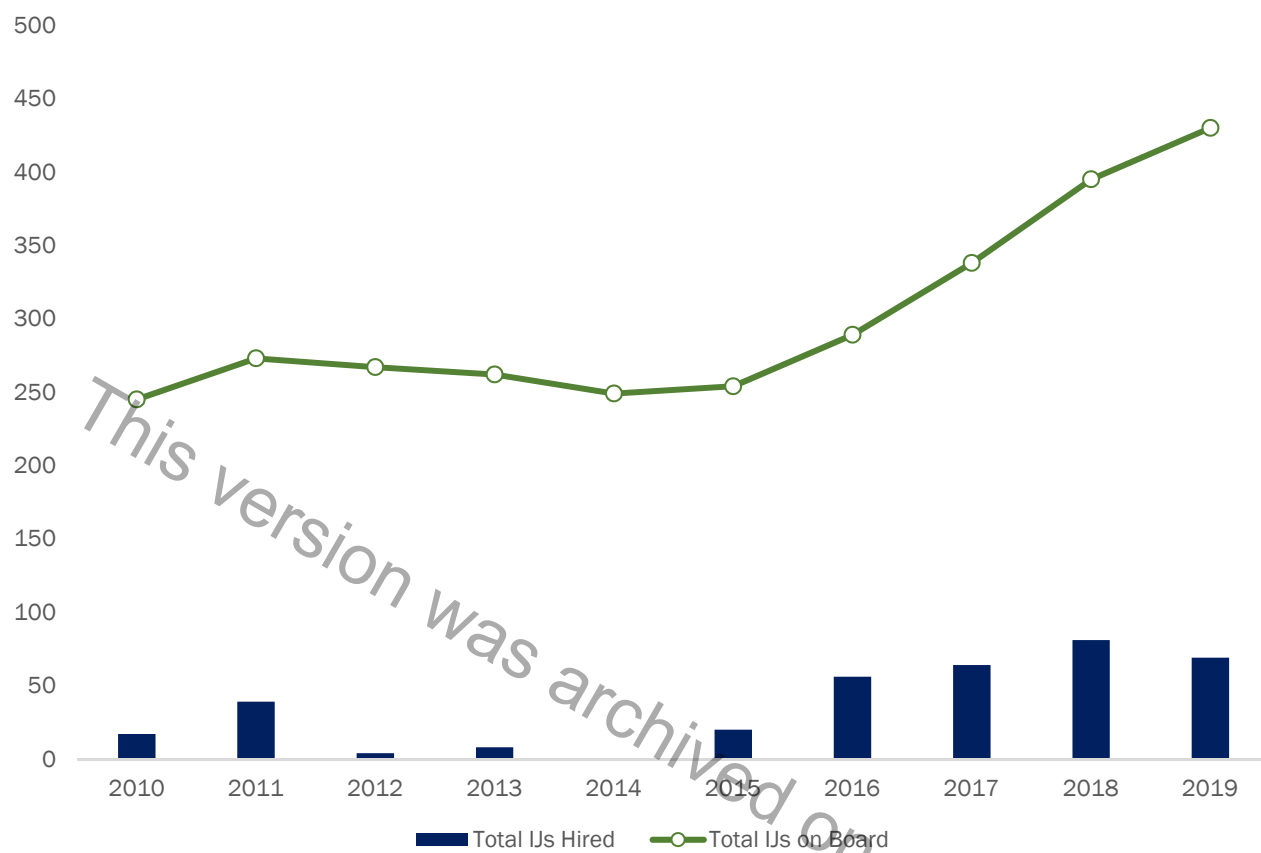

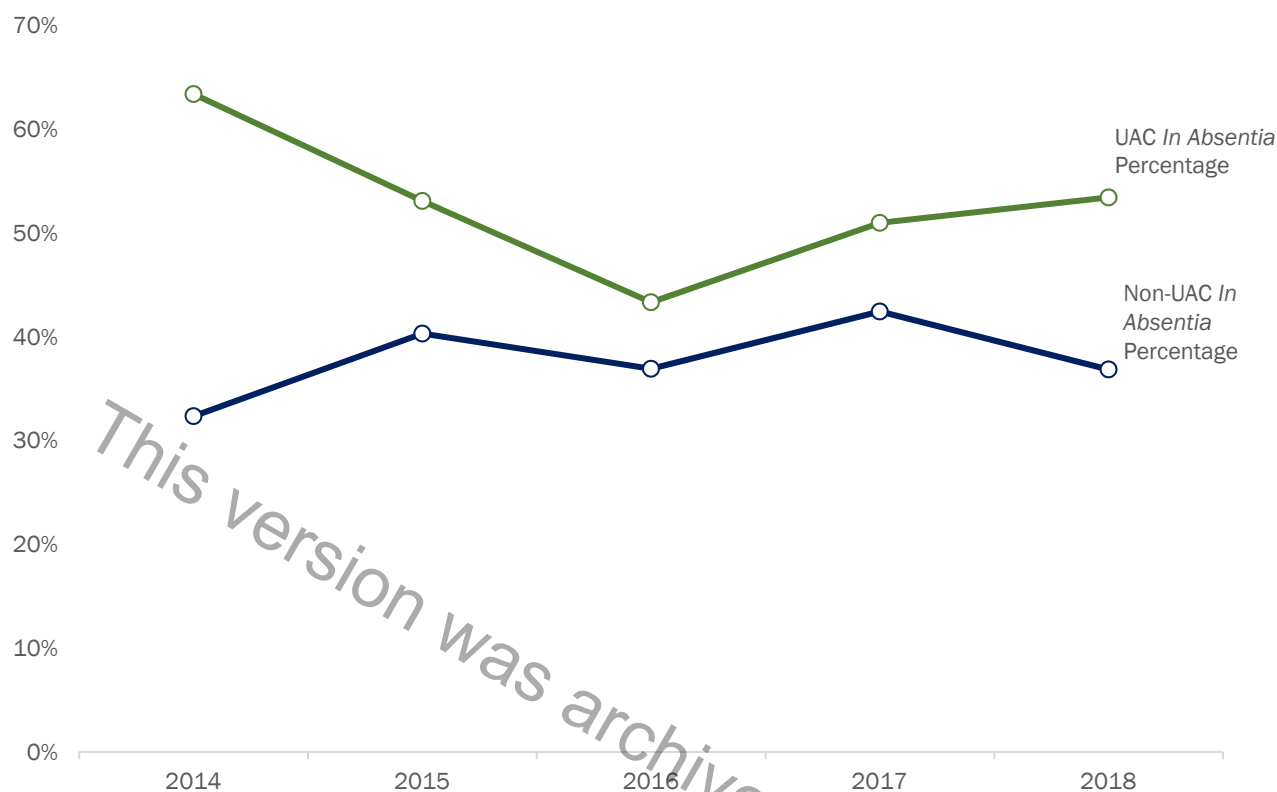

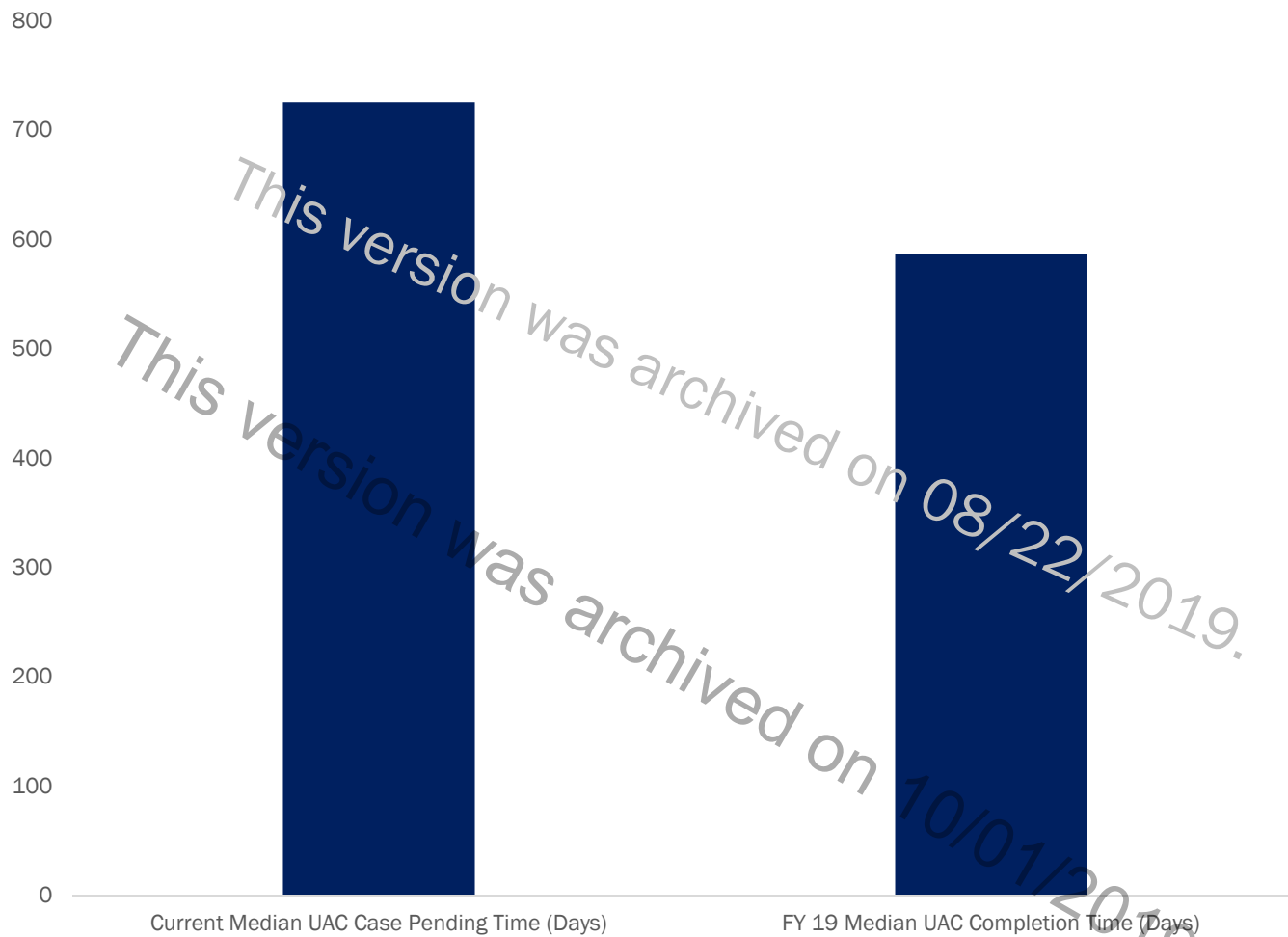

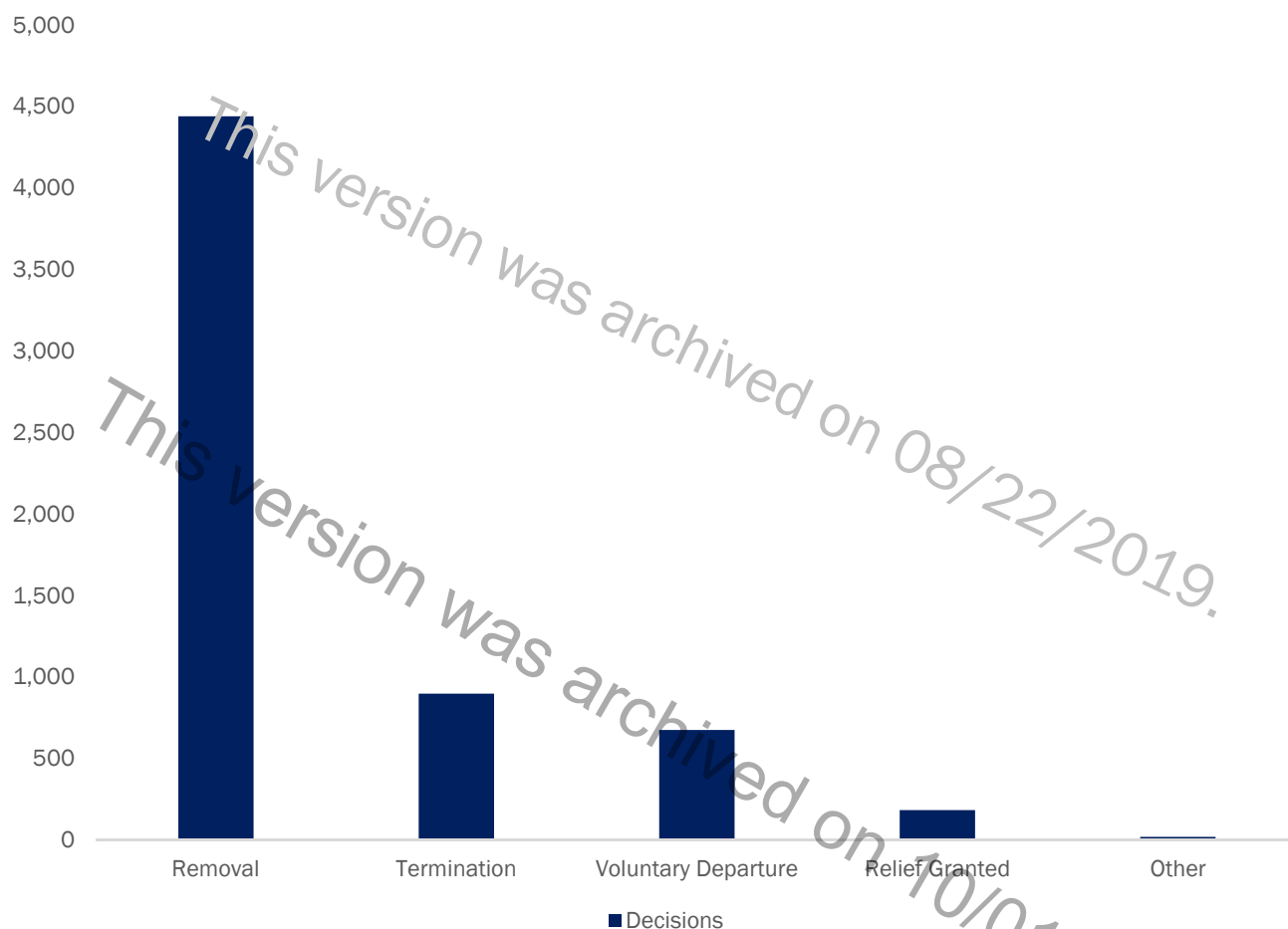
Current Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases Pending More than Three Years

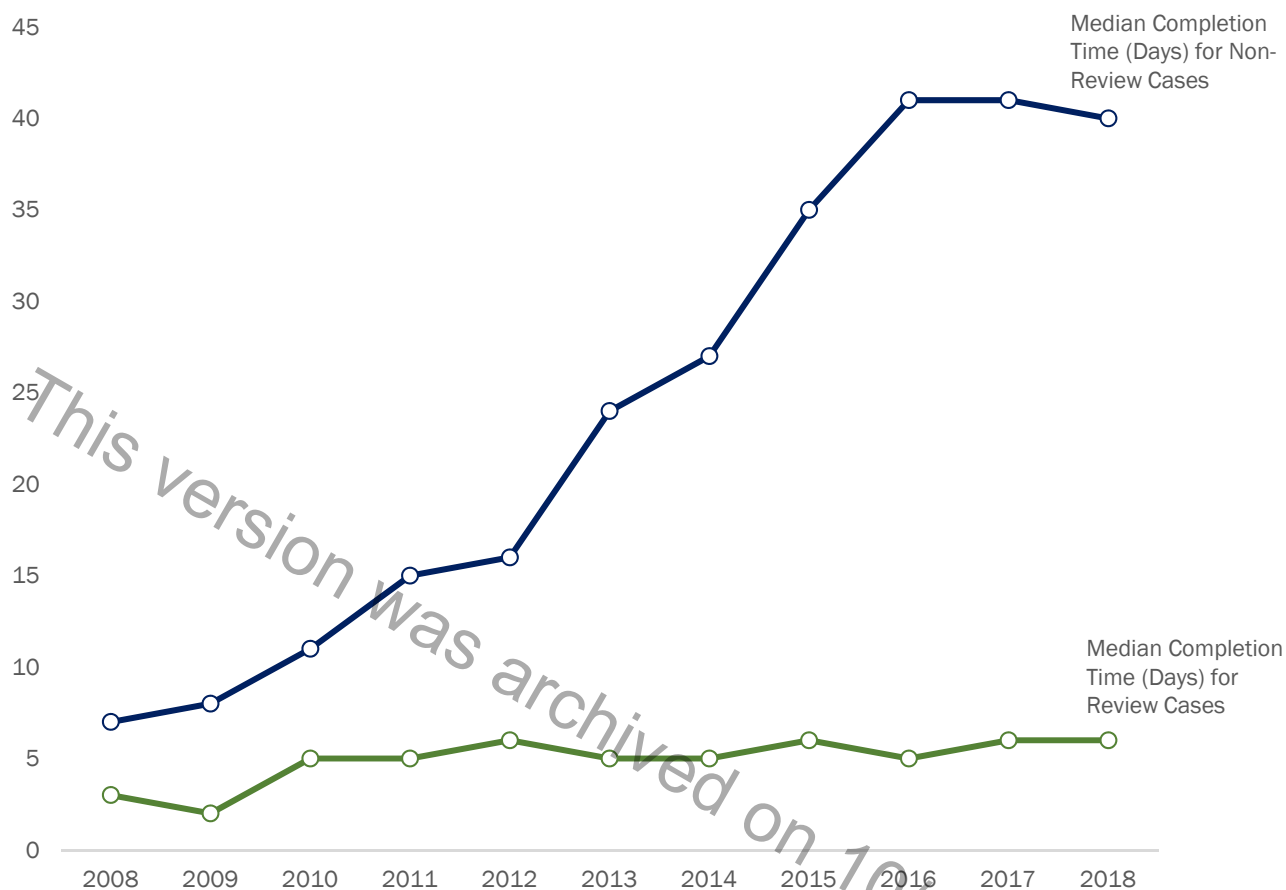

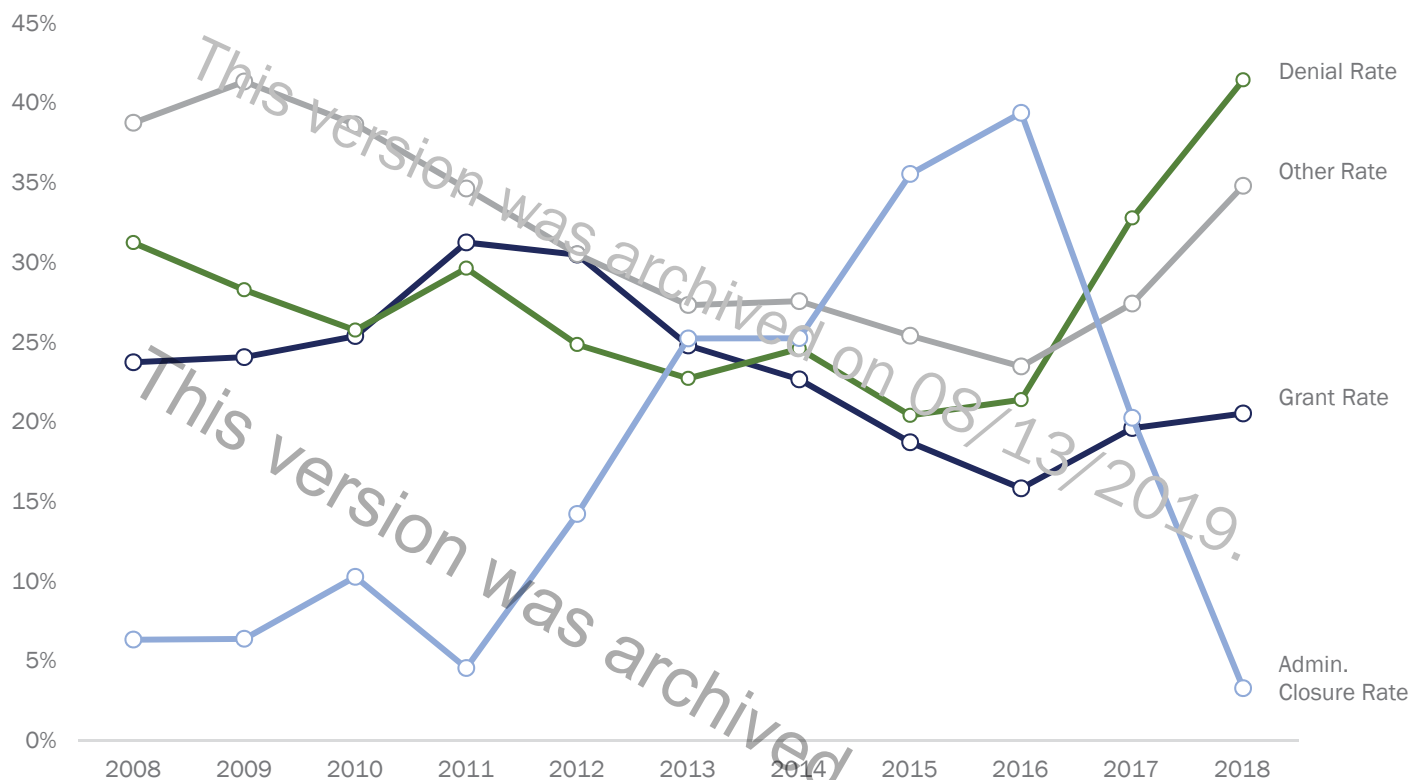

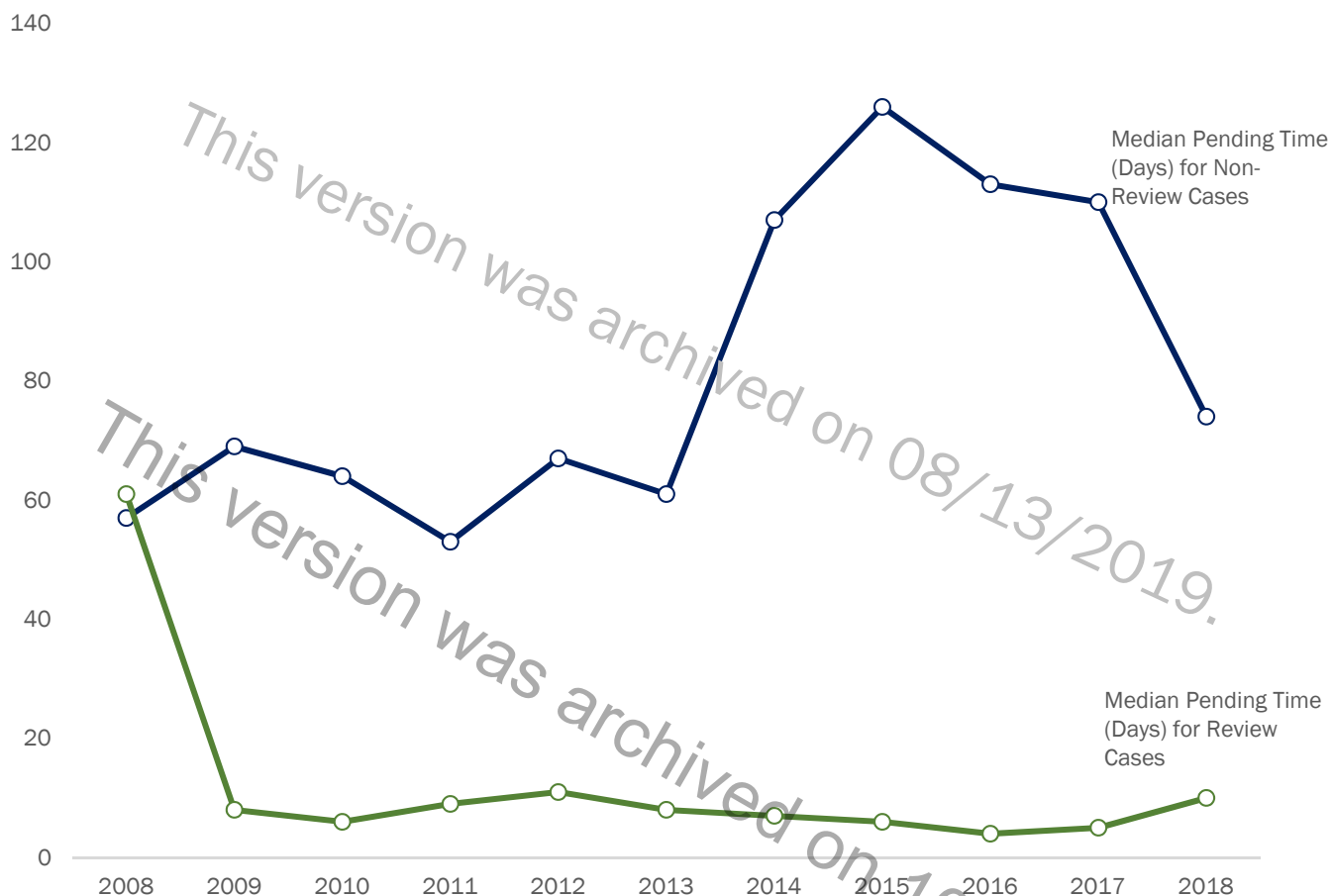

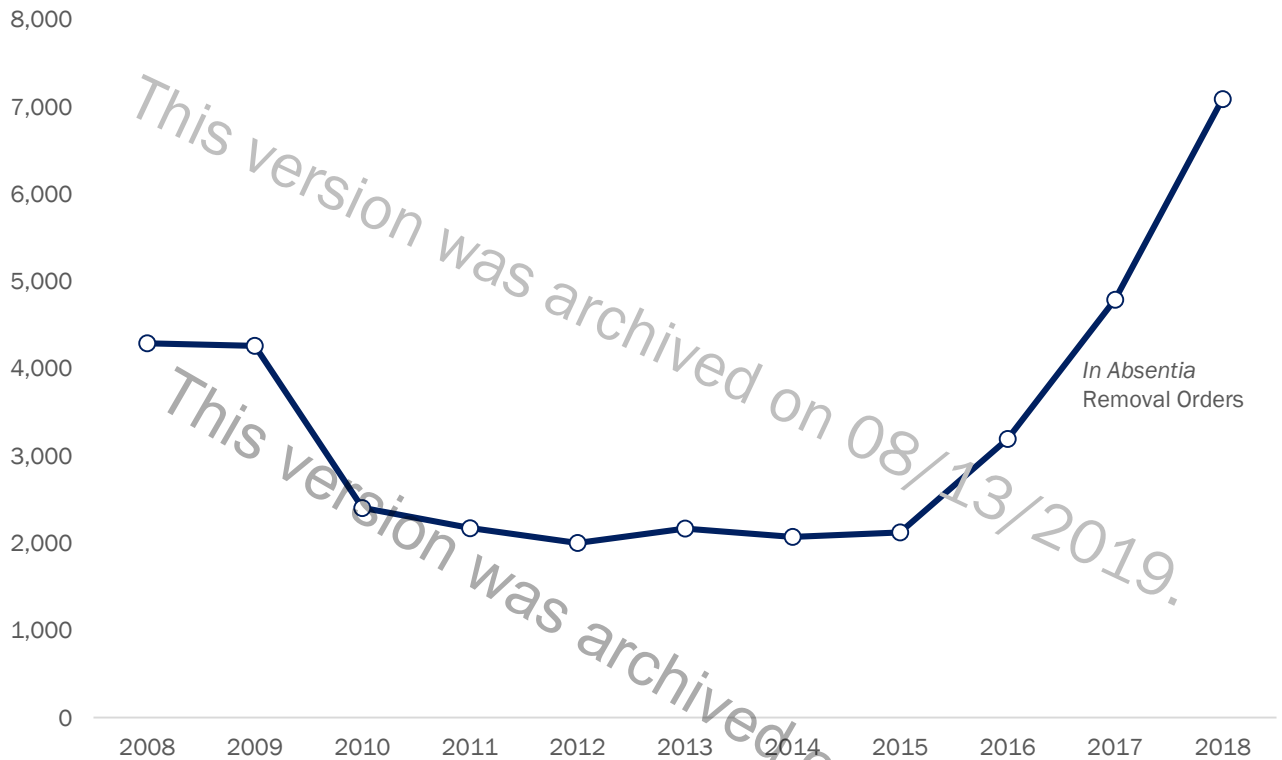

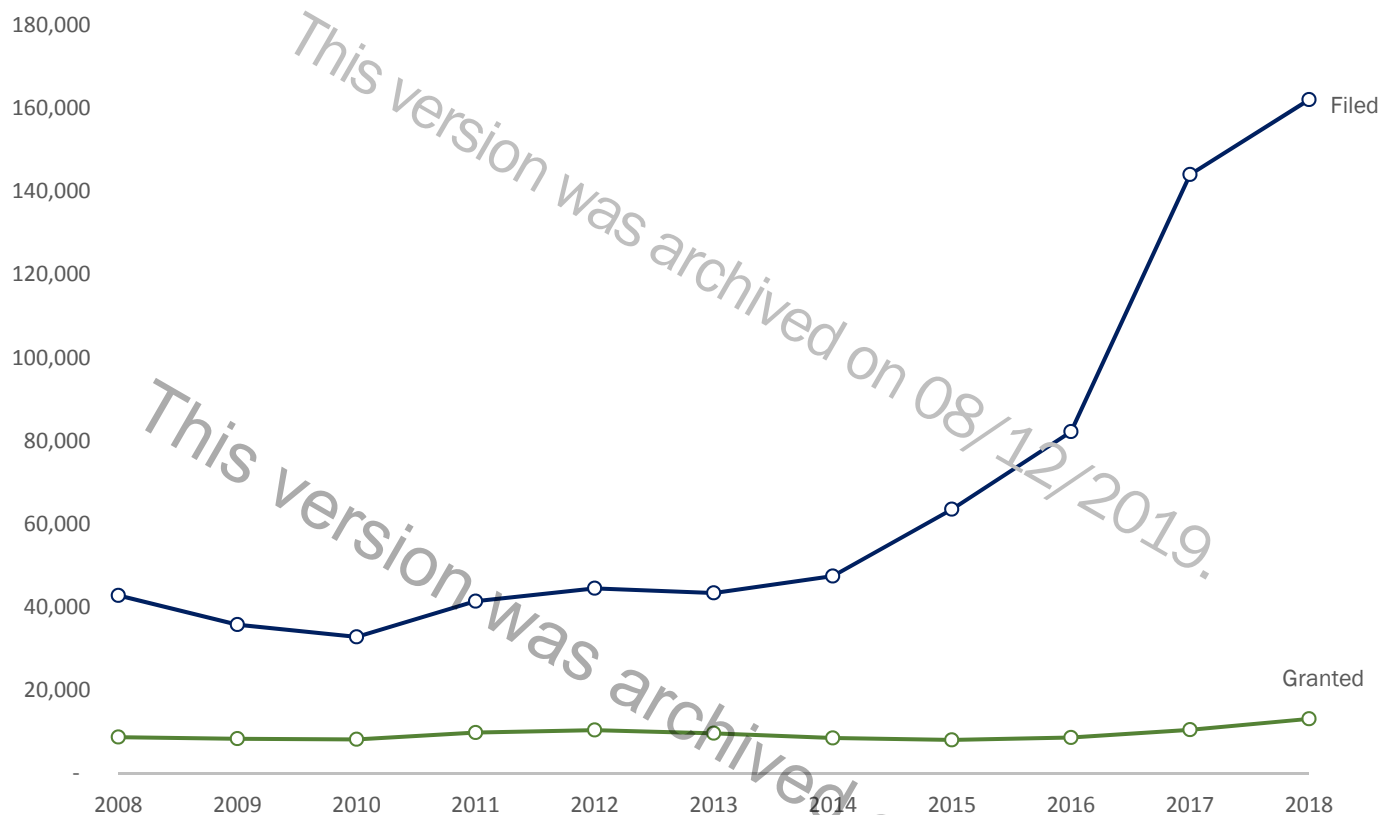

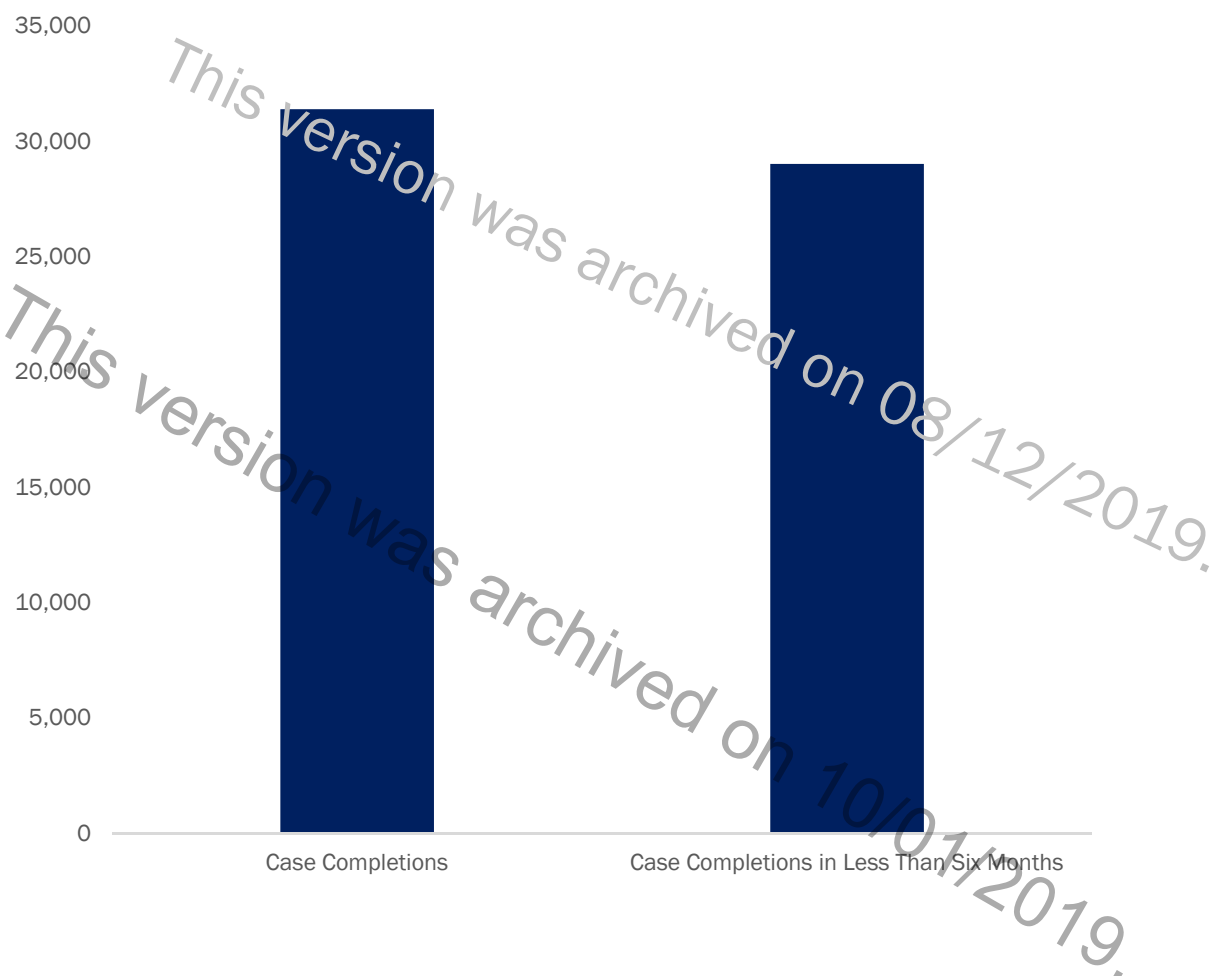

Pending I-862 Proceedings Originating With a Credible Fear Claim and All Pending I-862s¹

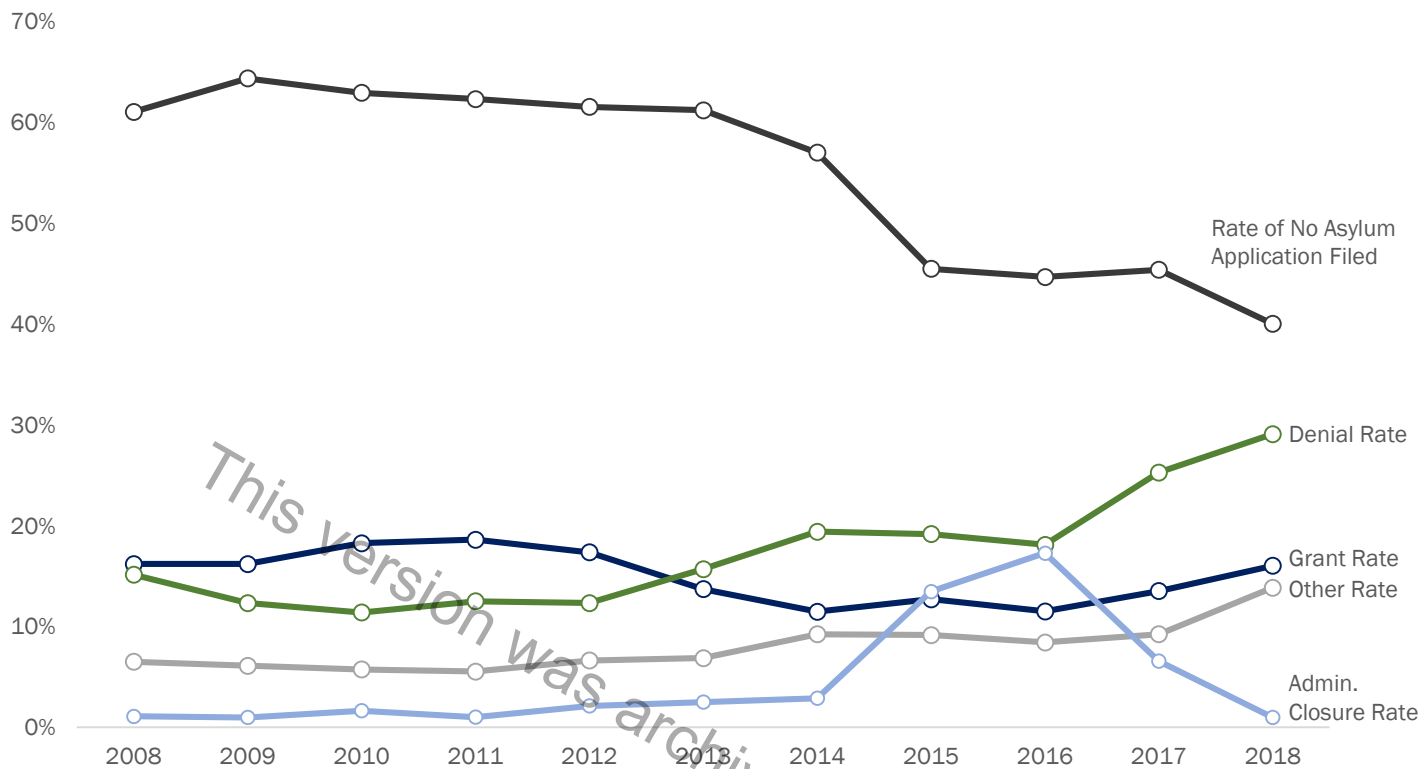

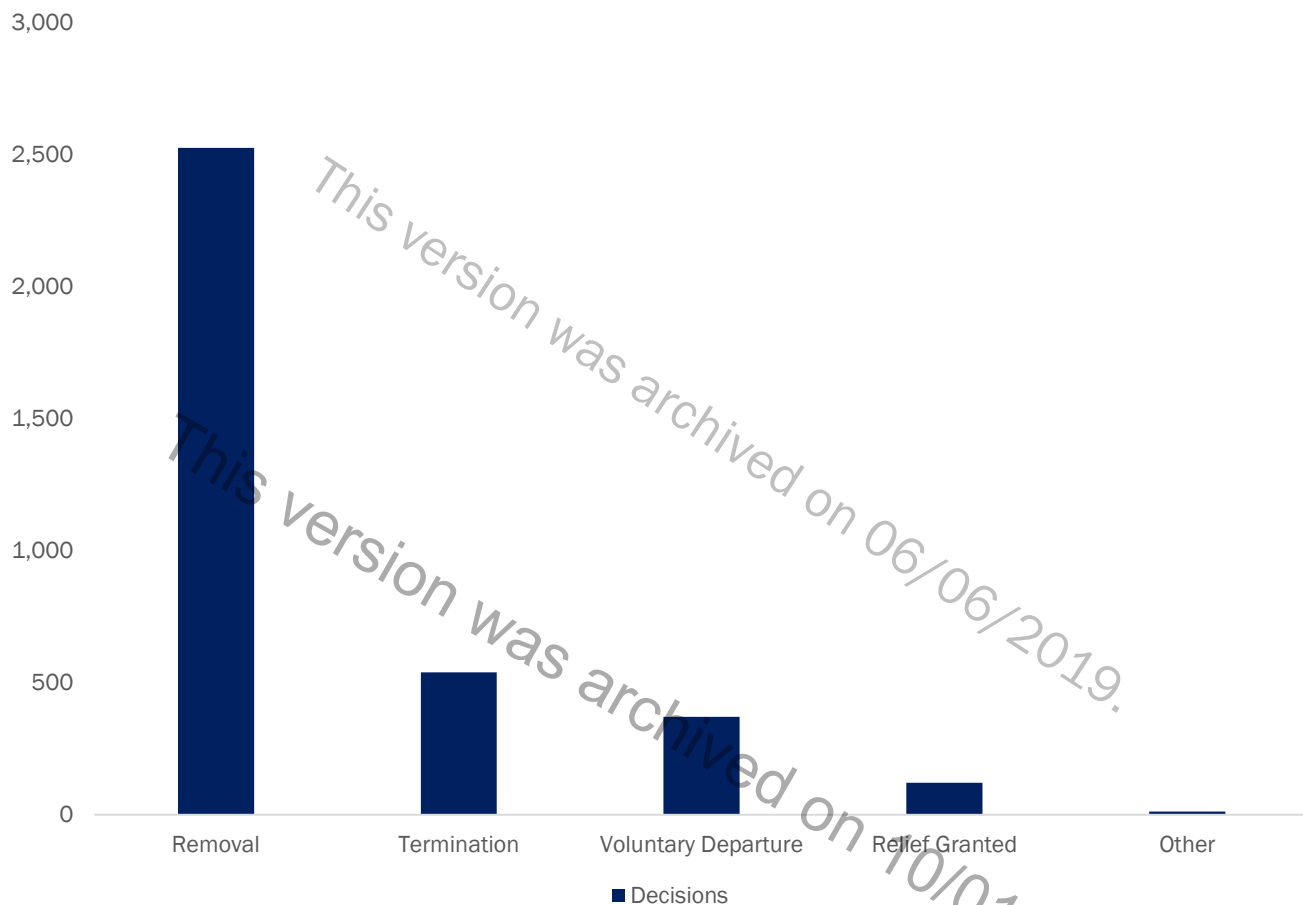

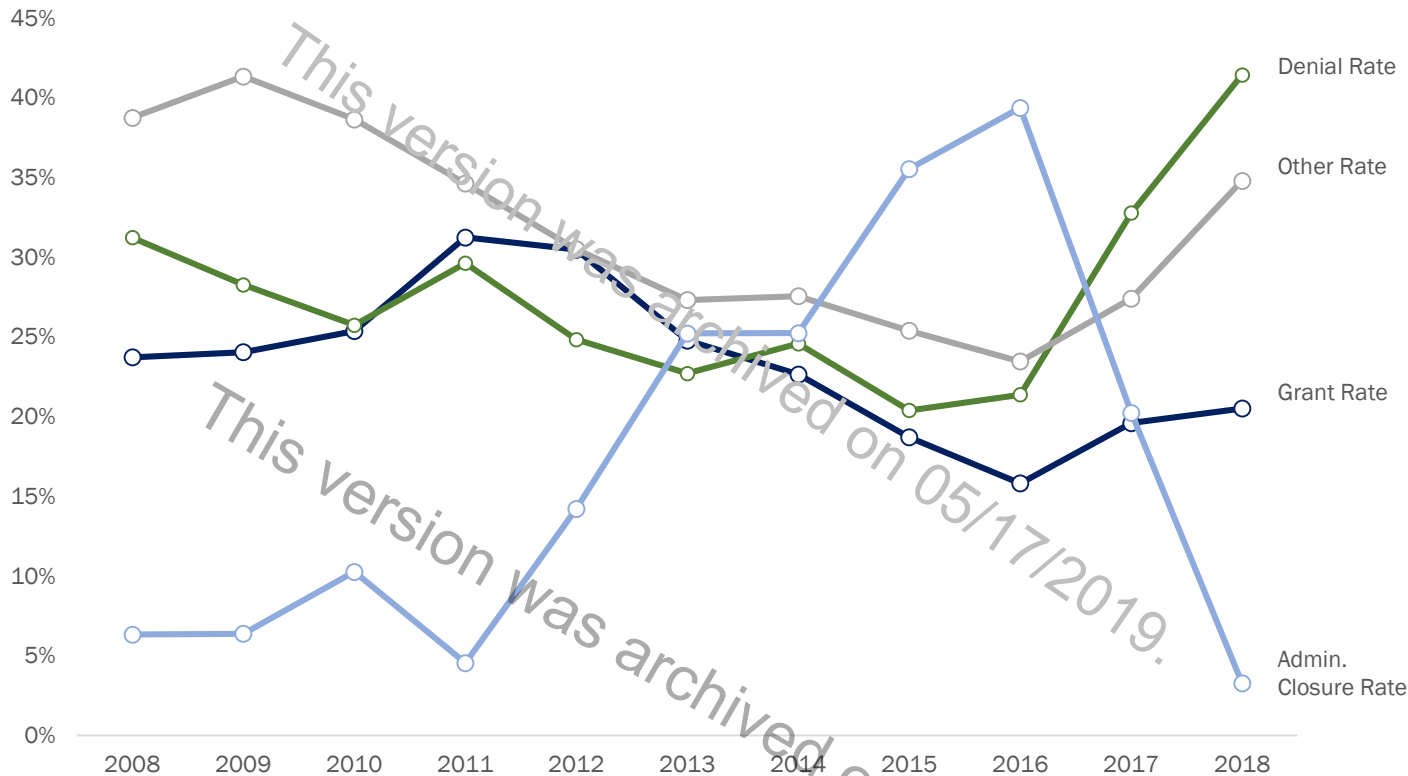

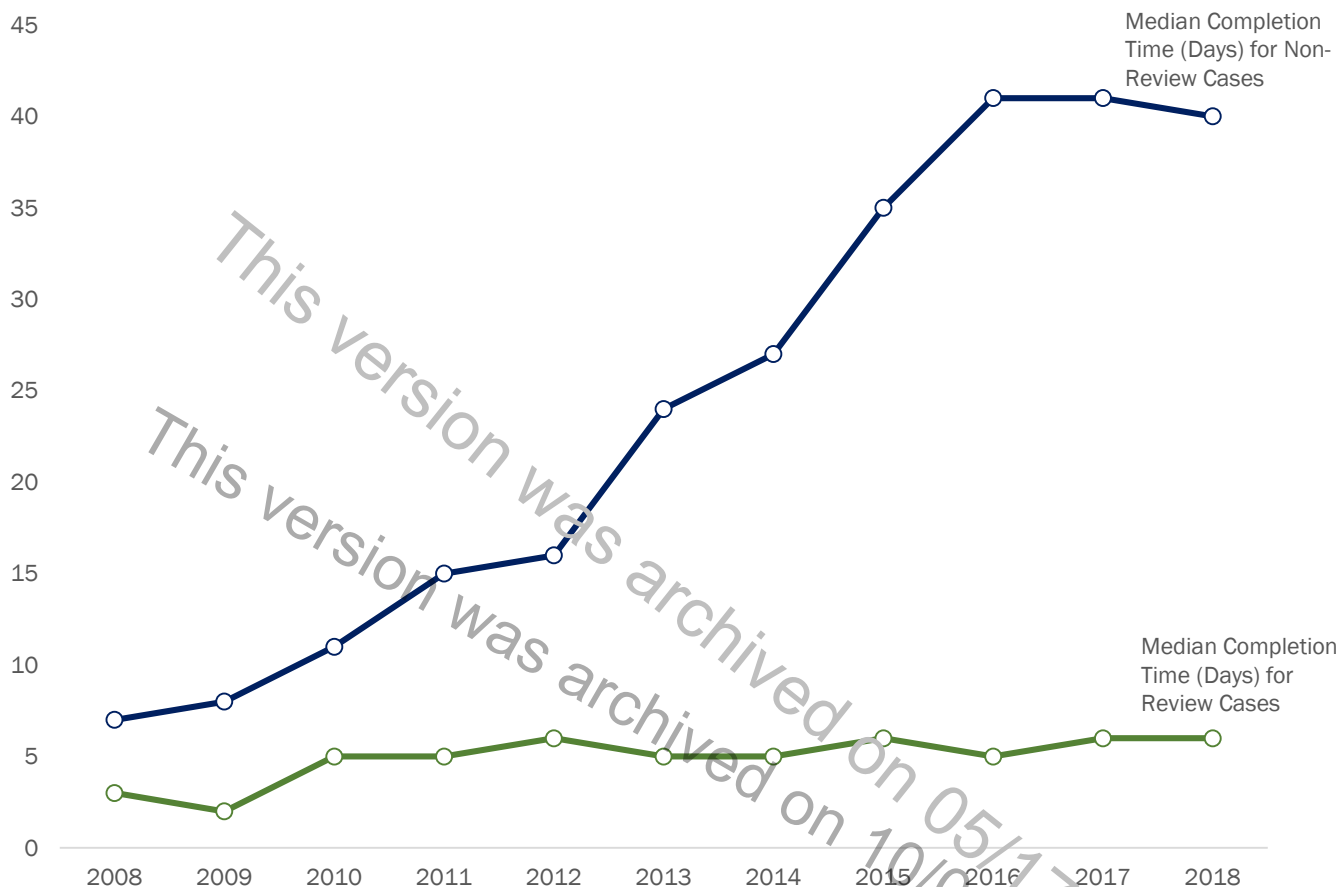

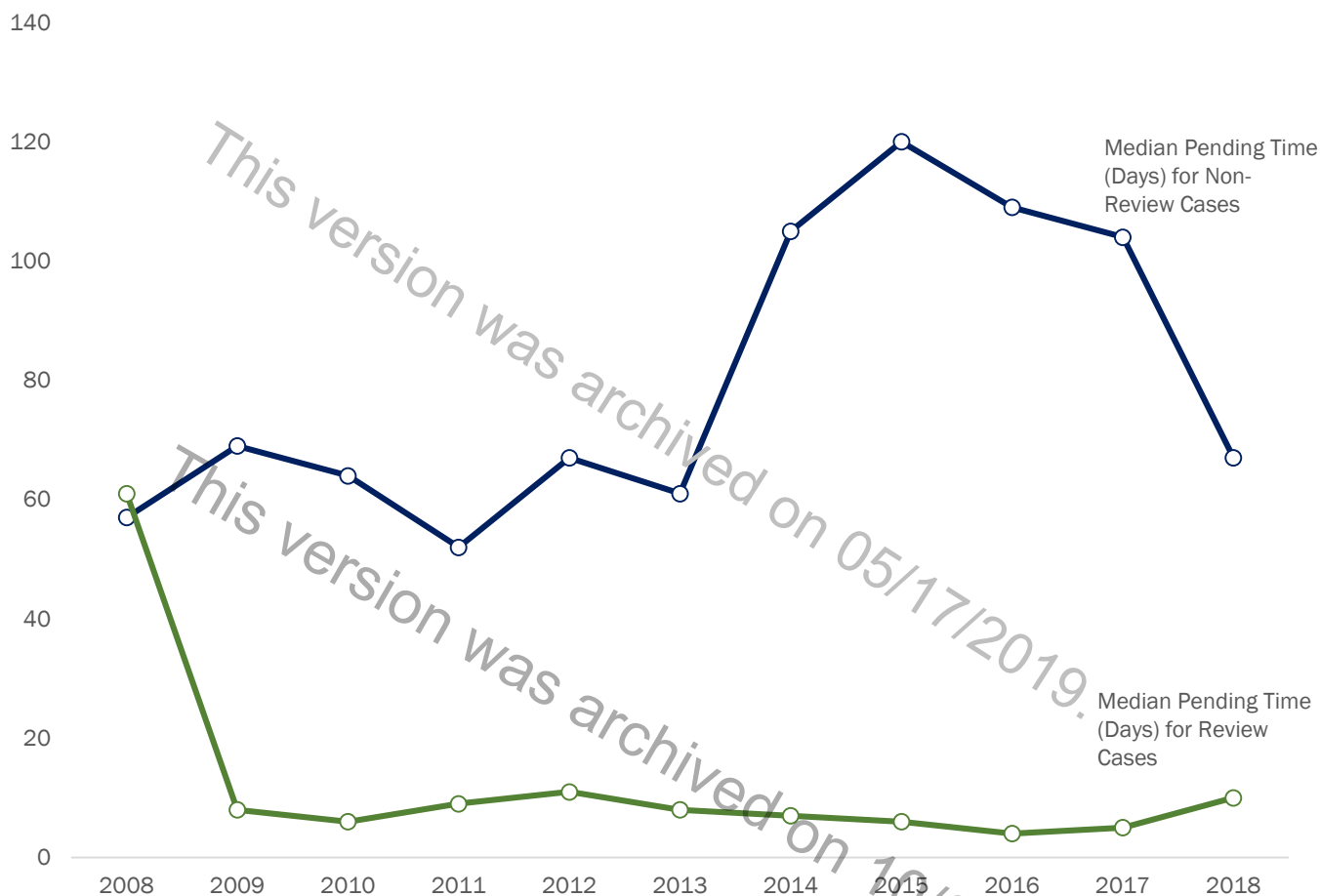

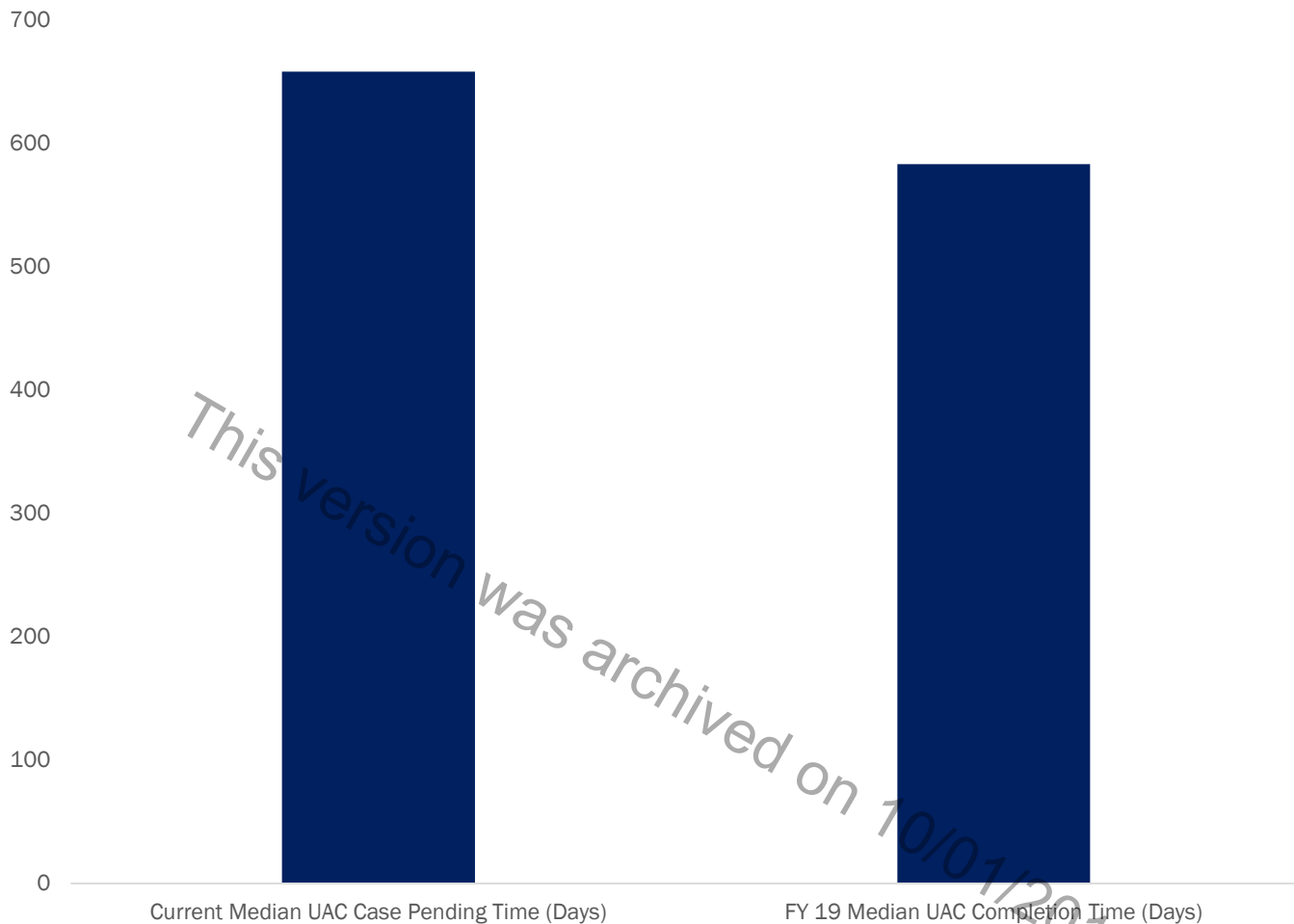

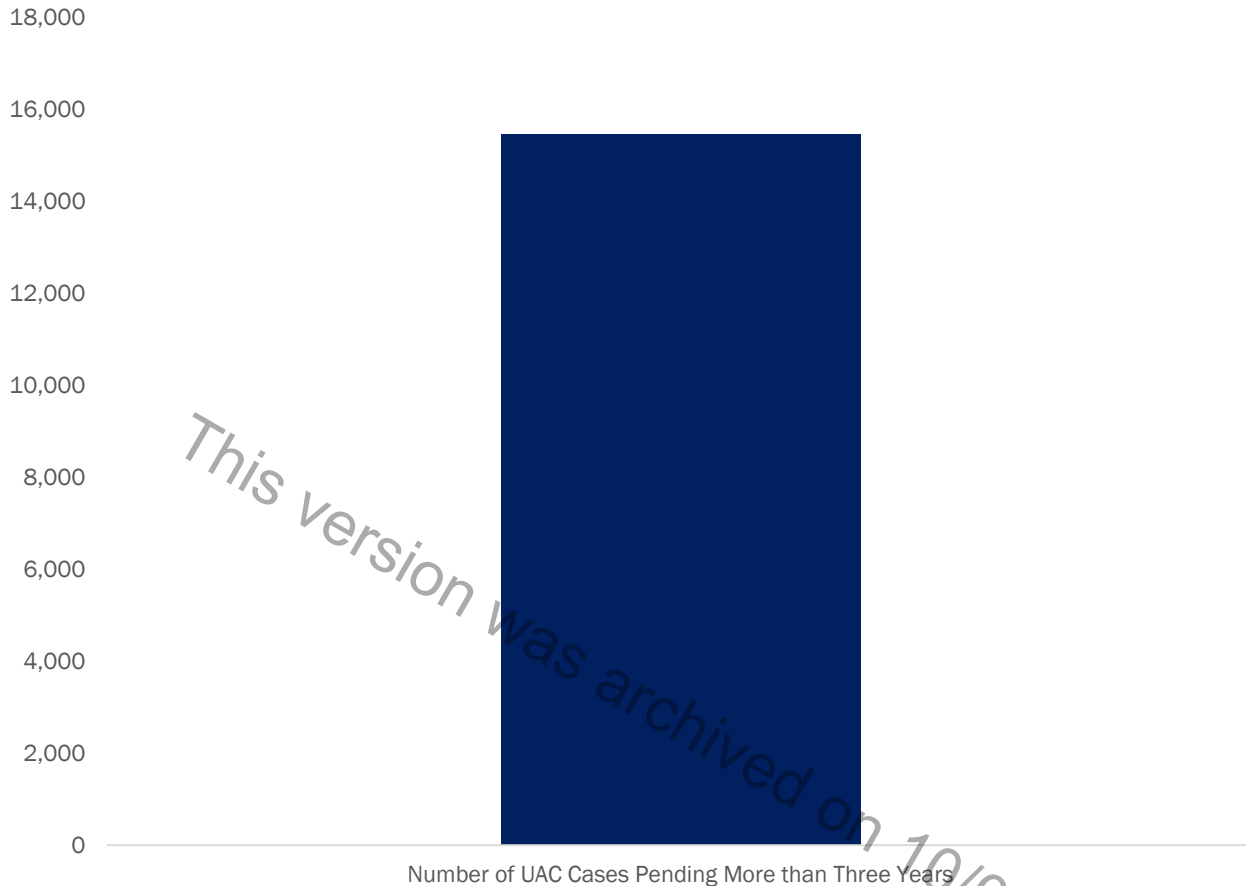
Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time

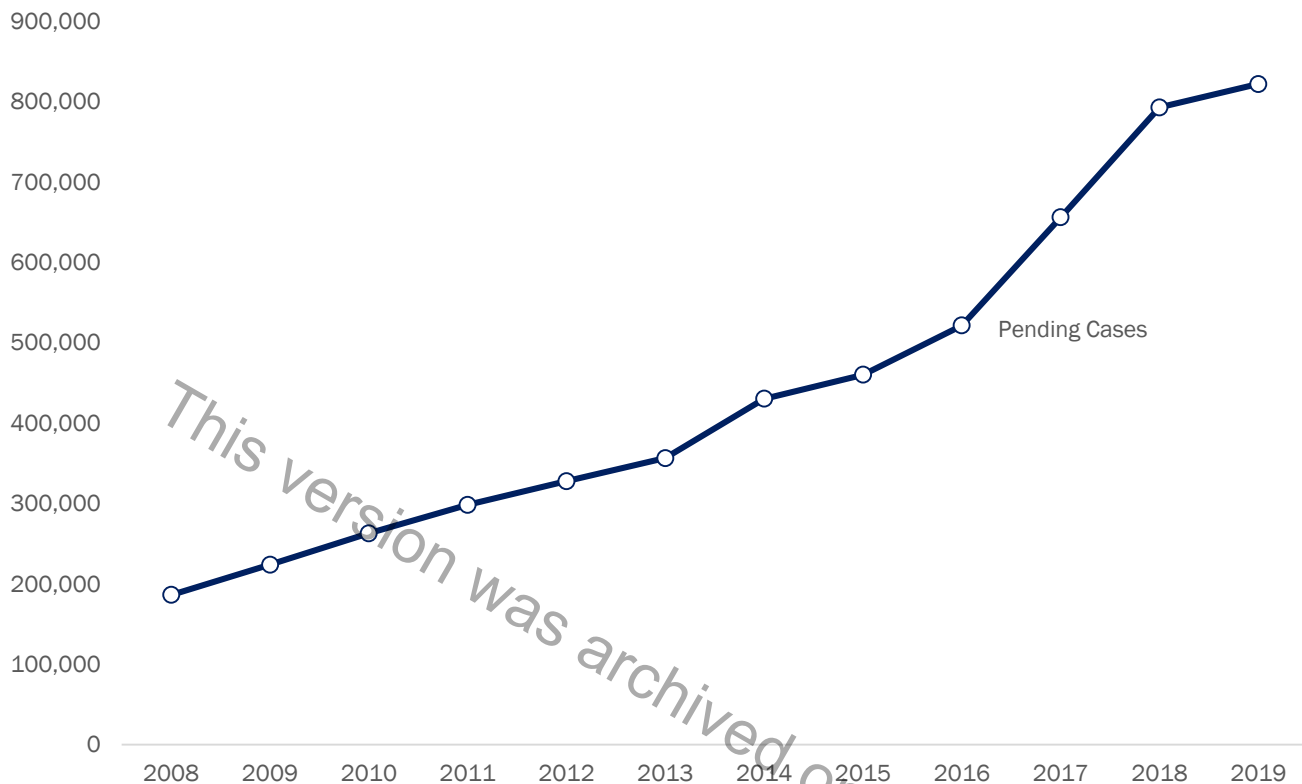
Current Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases Pending More than Three Years

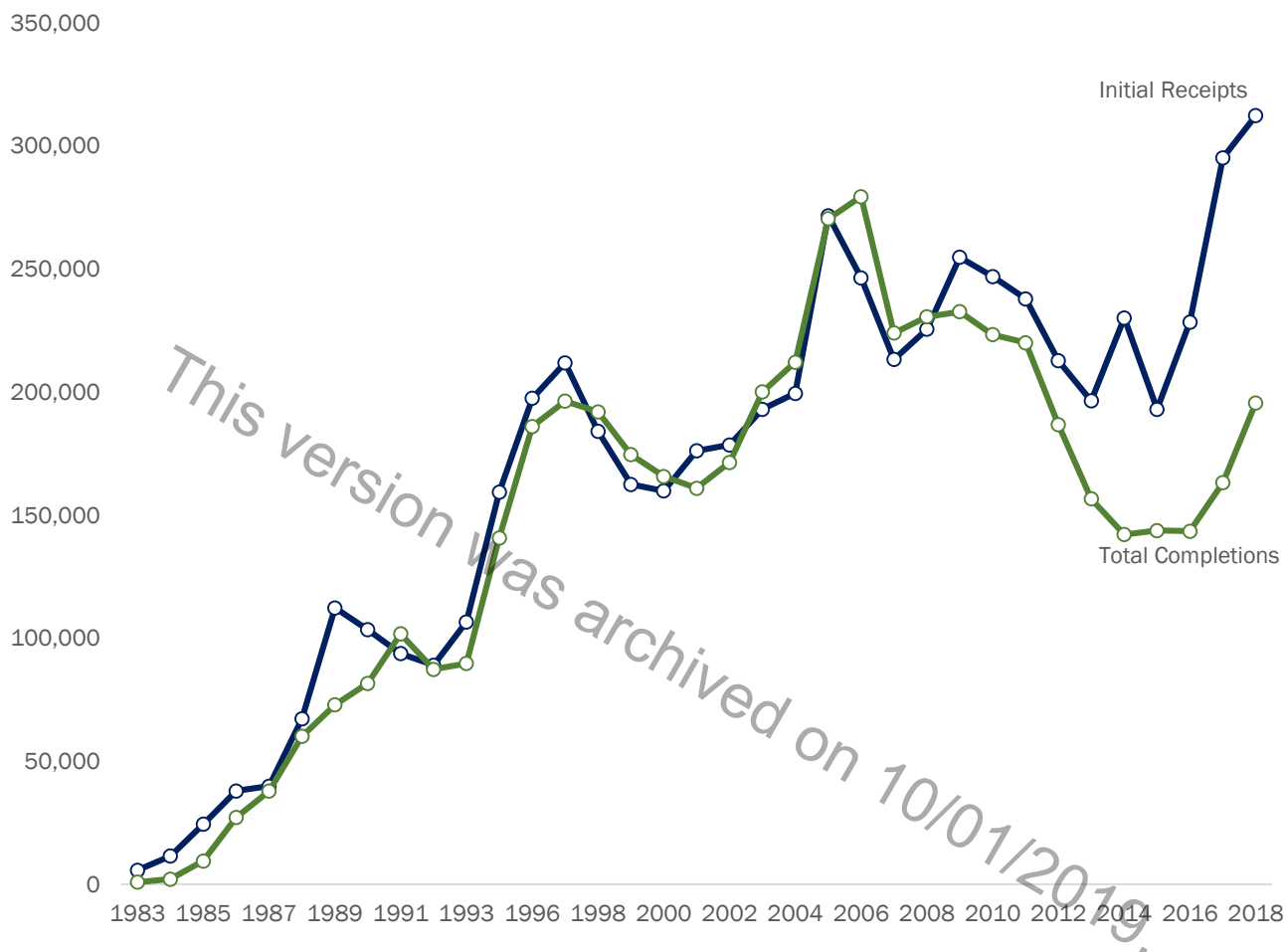

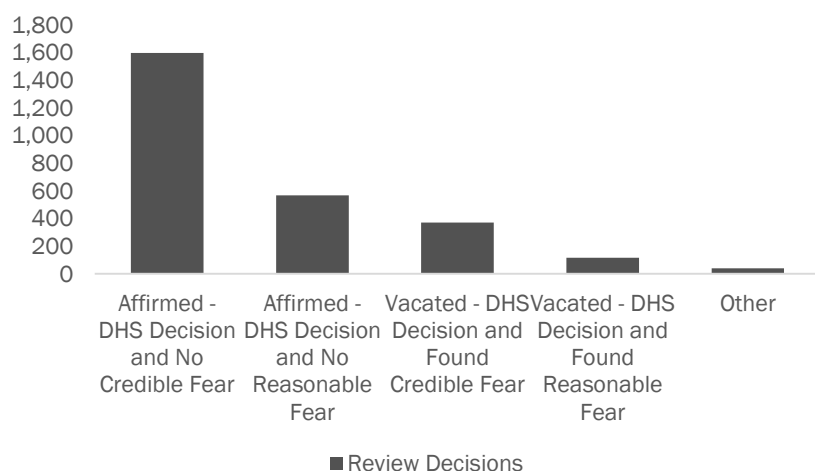

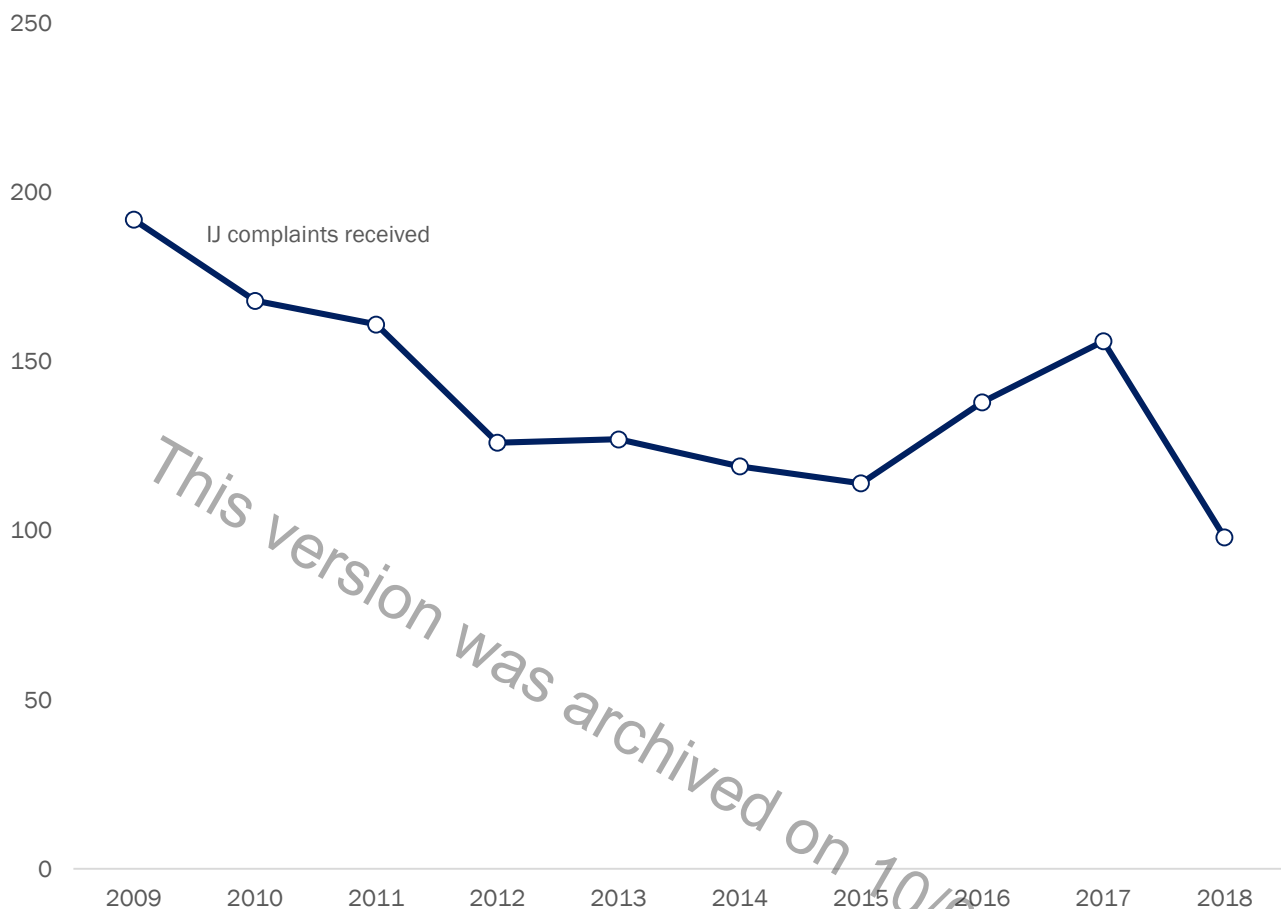

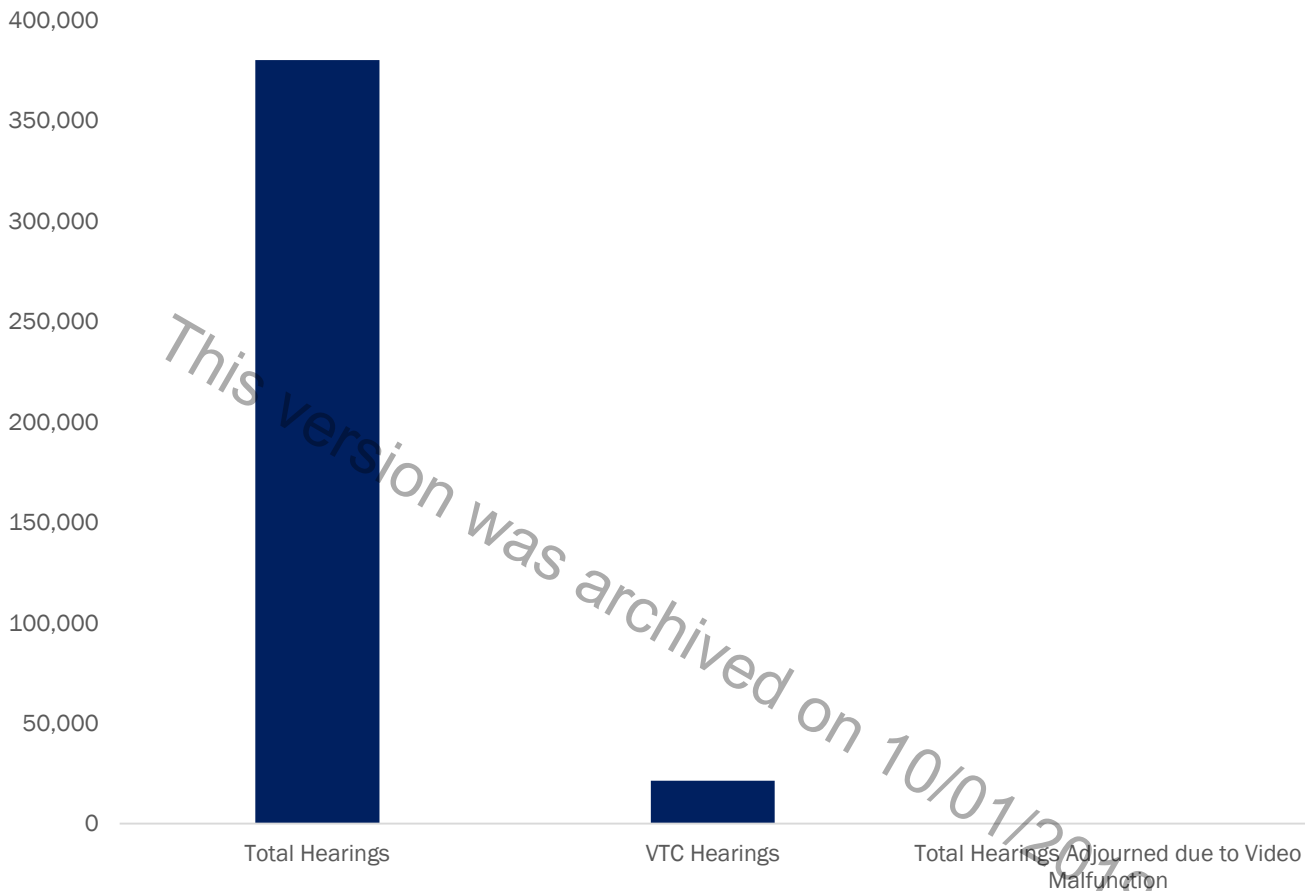

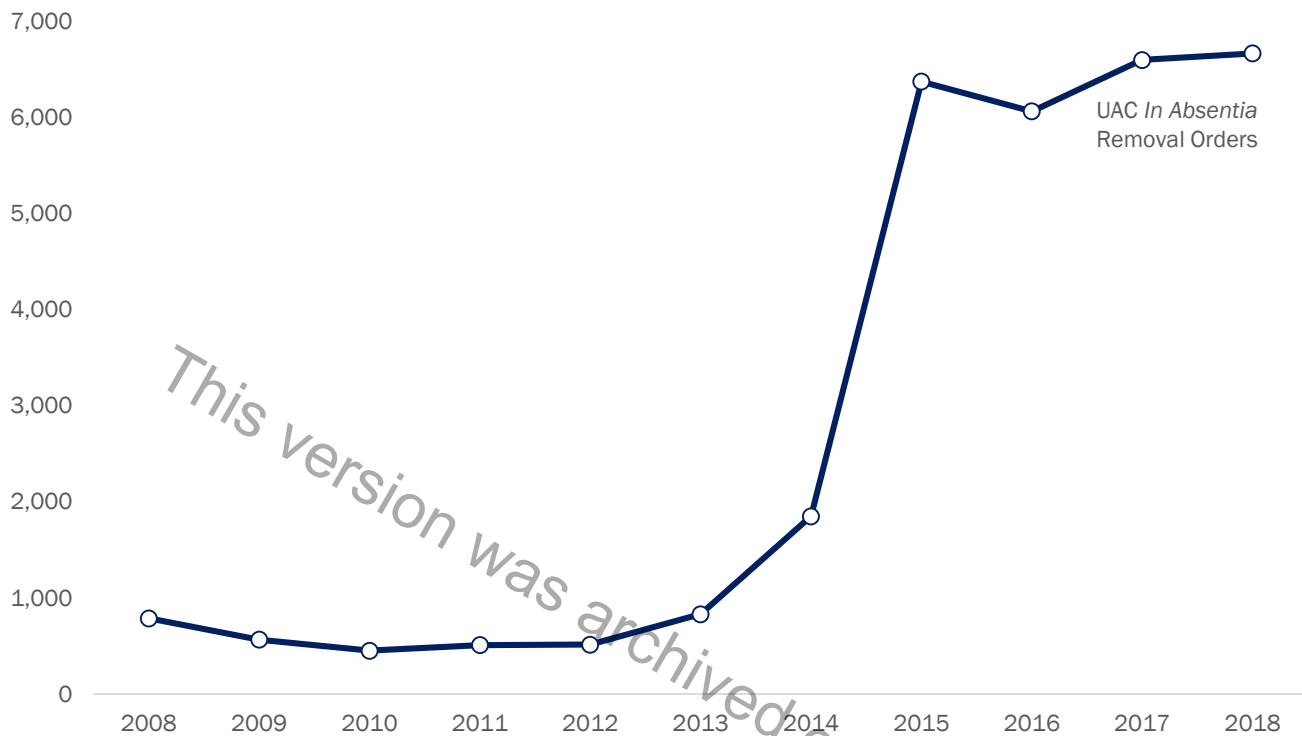

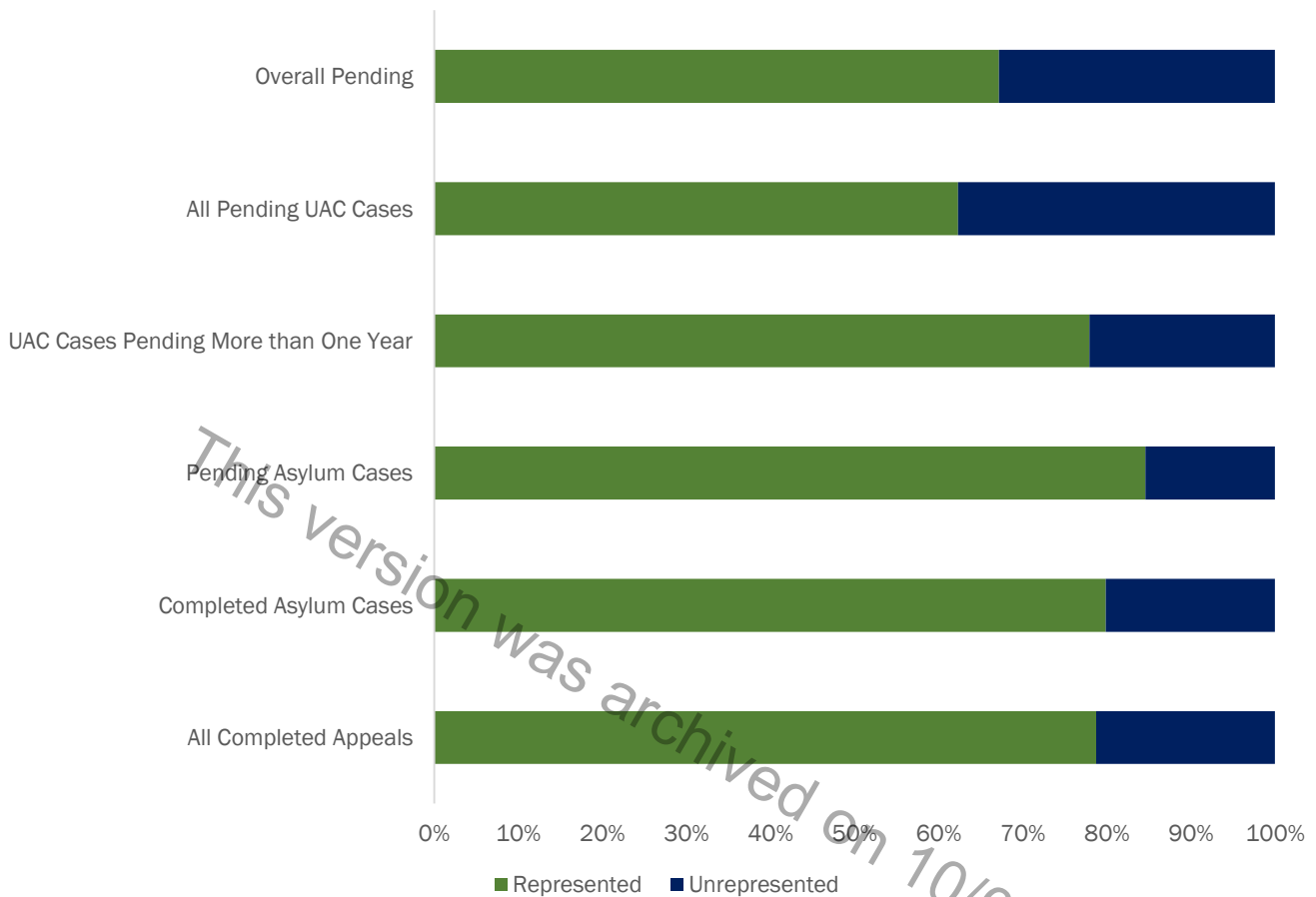

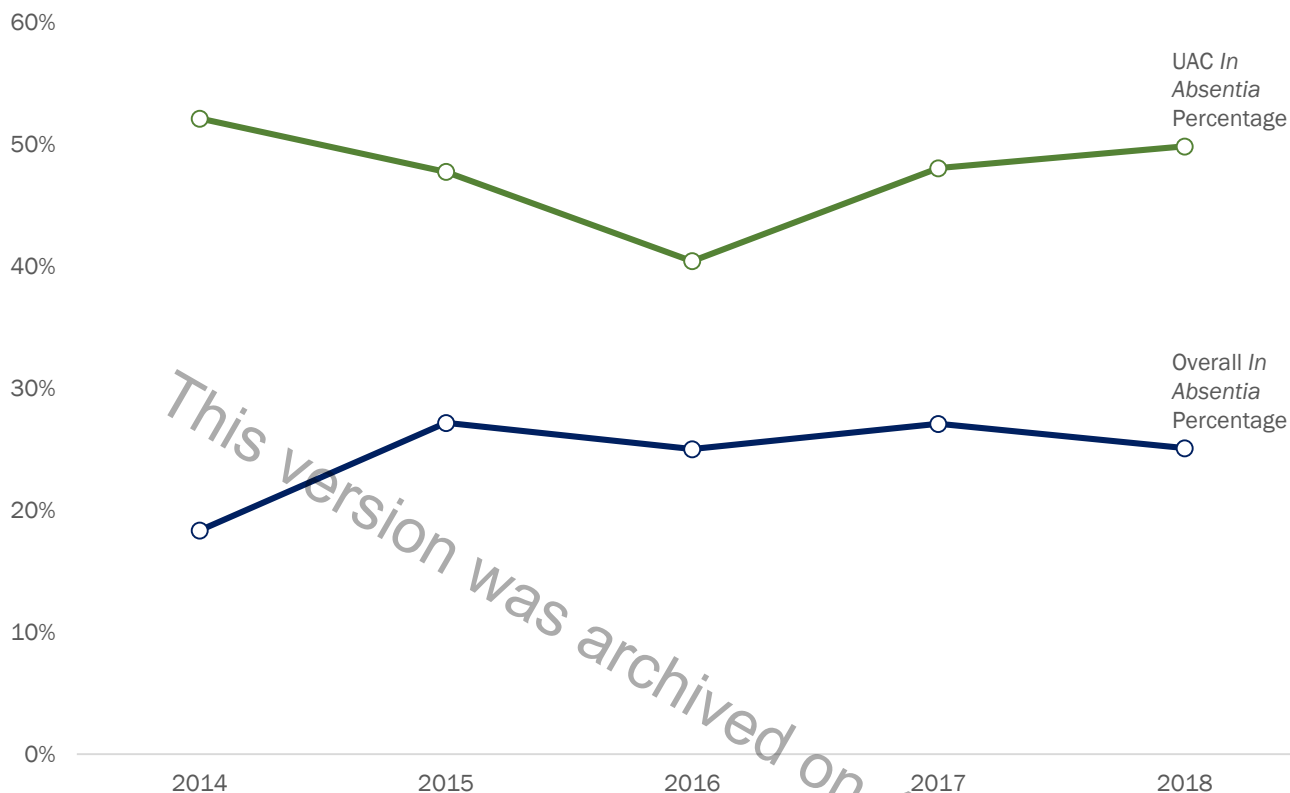

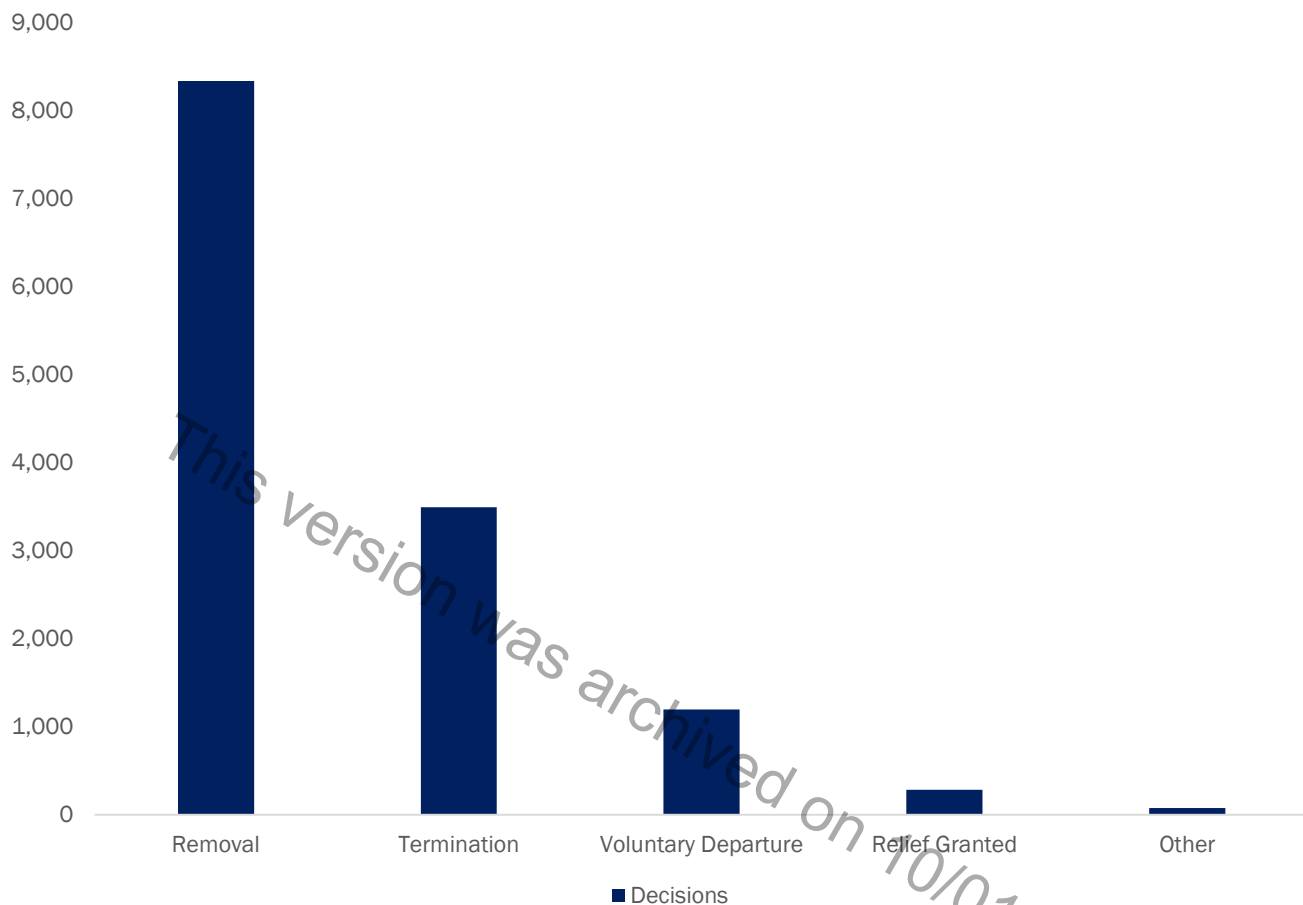

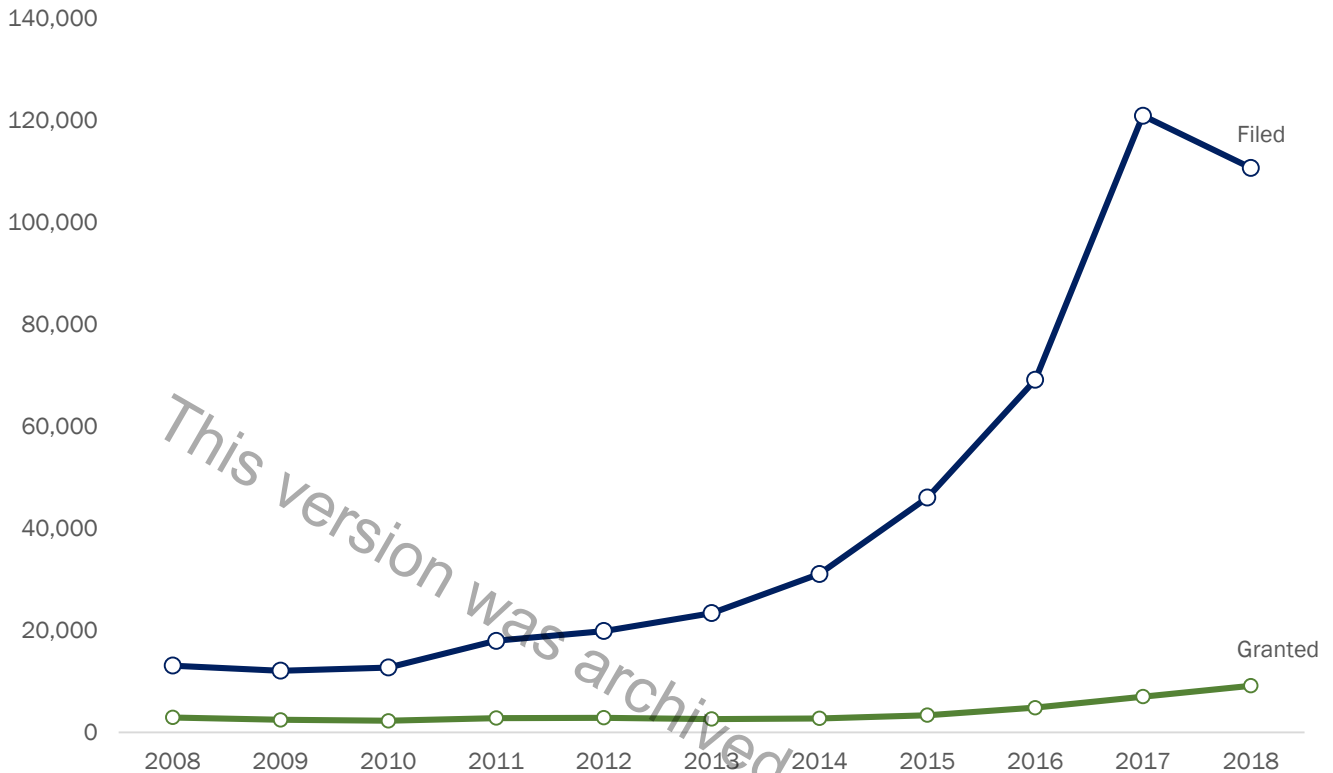

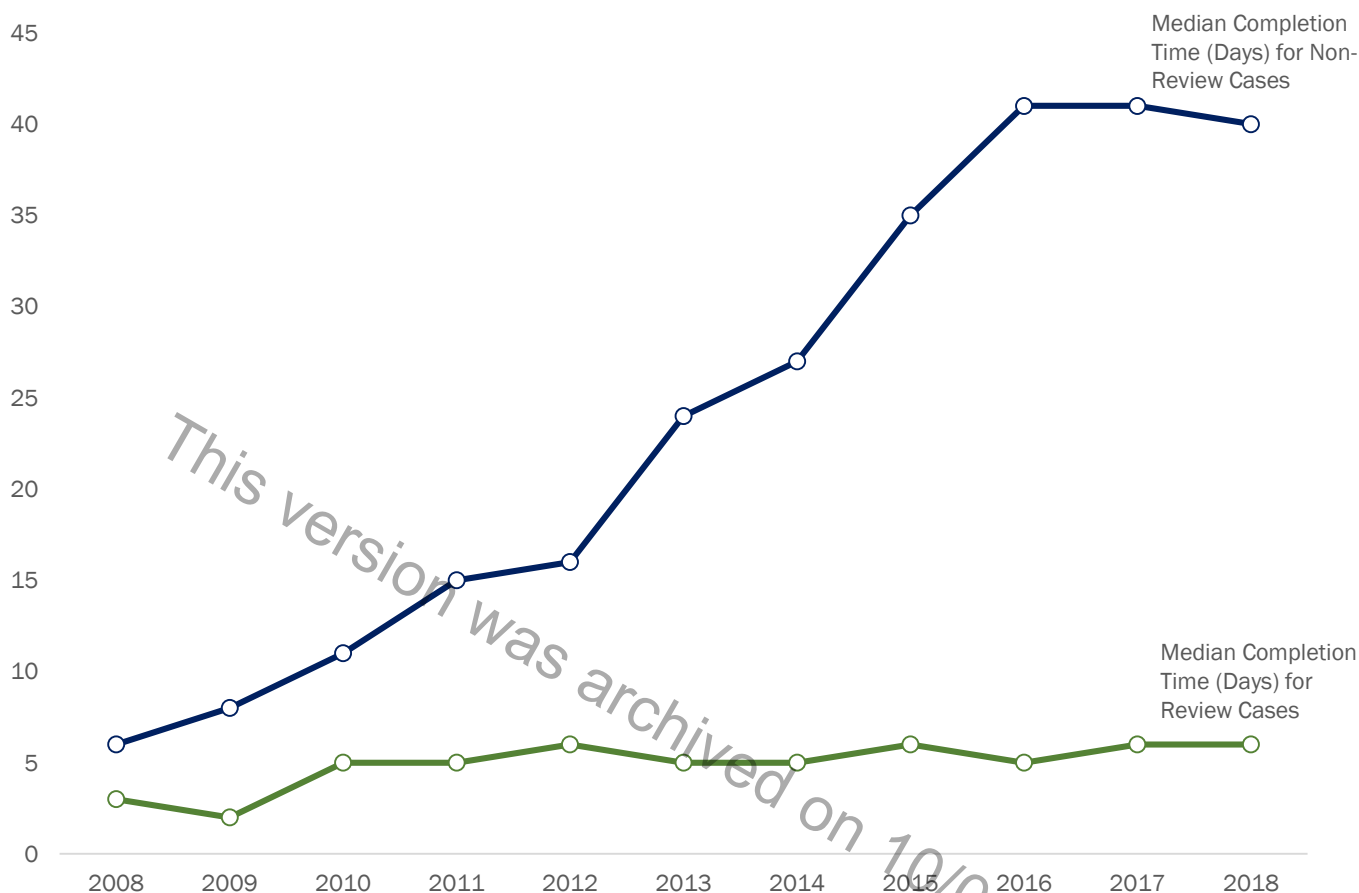

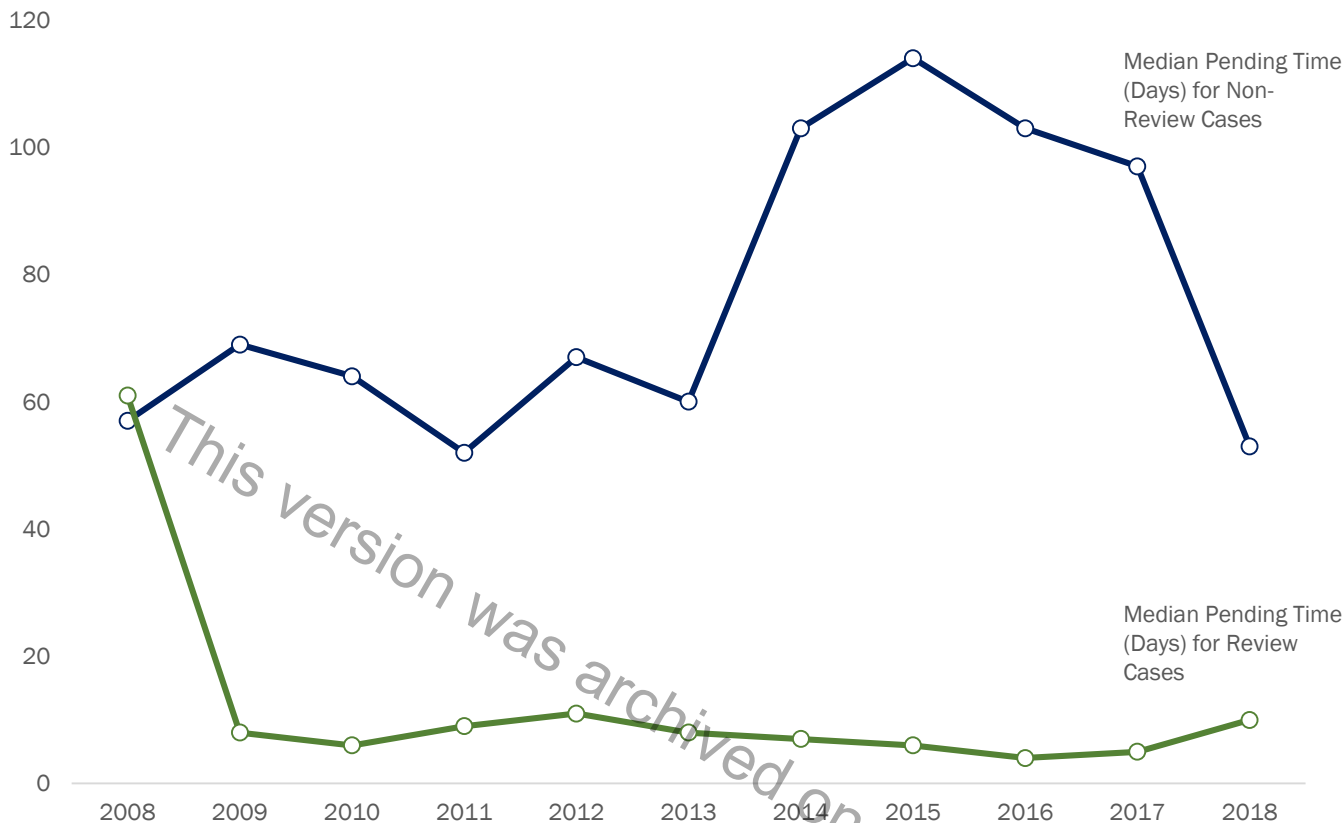

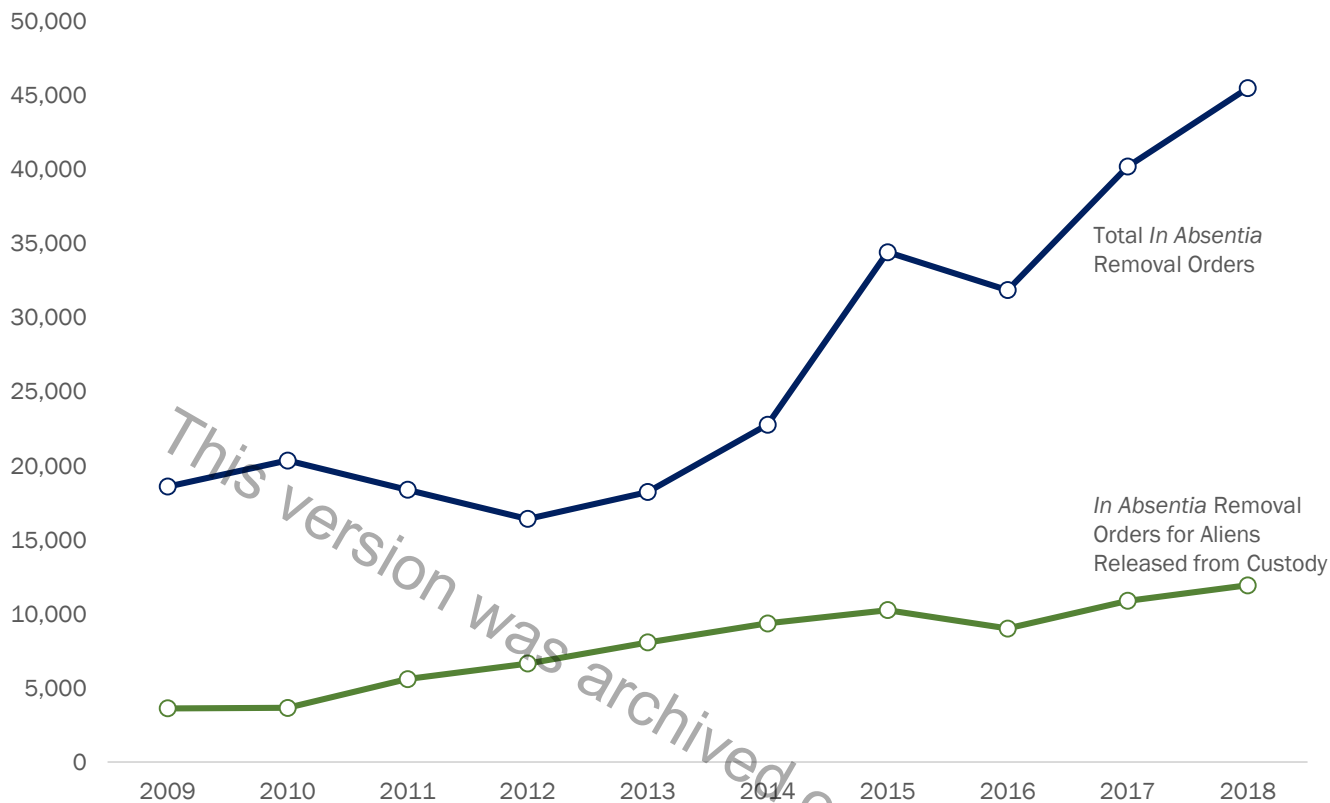

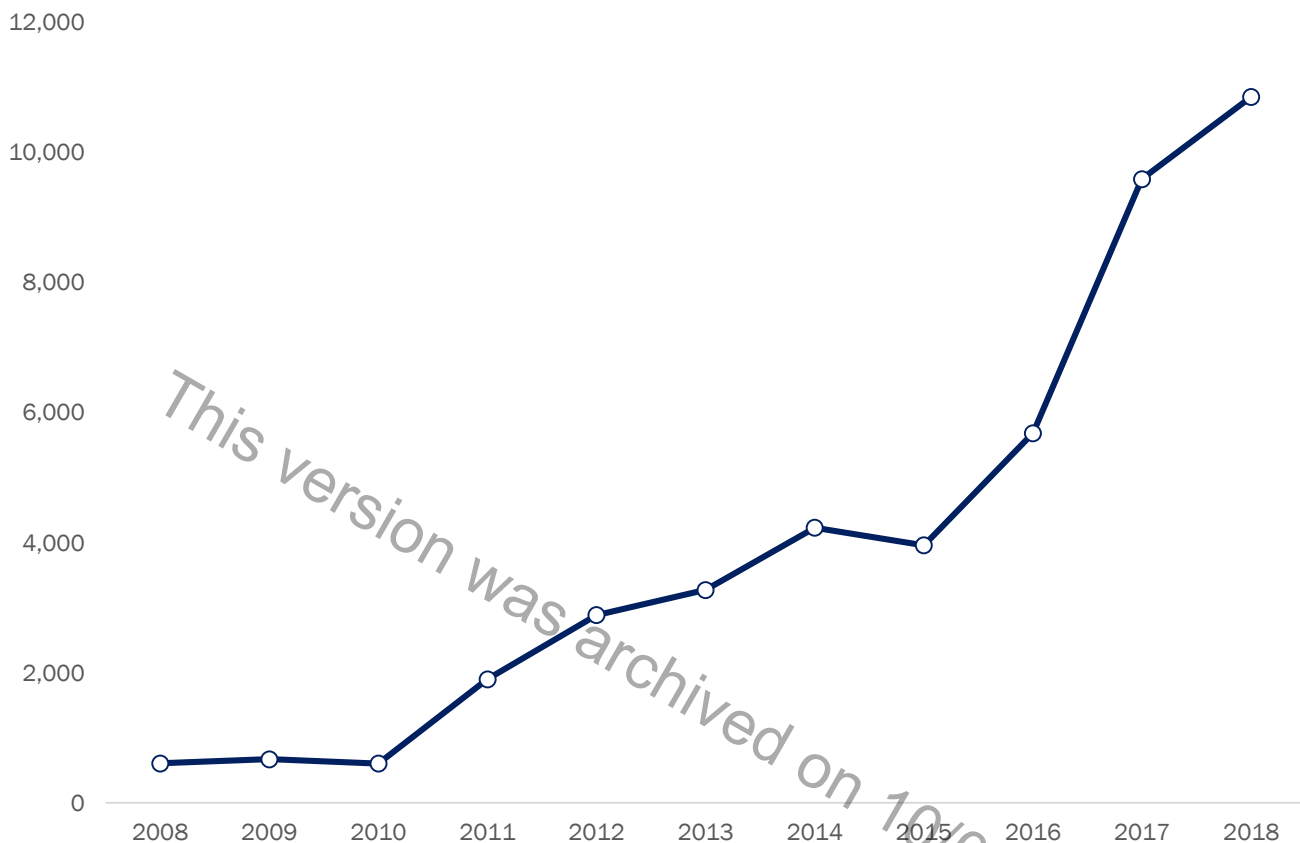

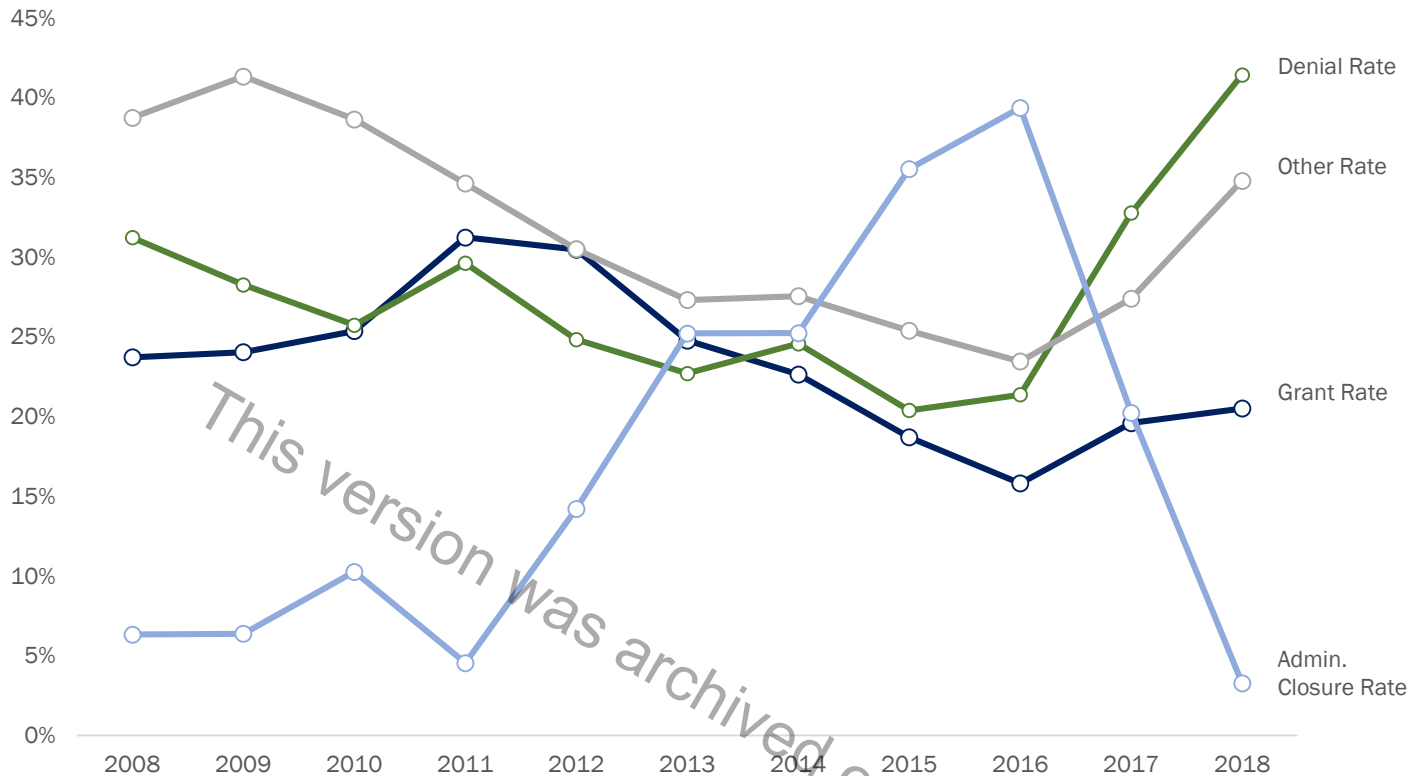

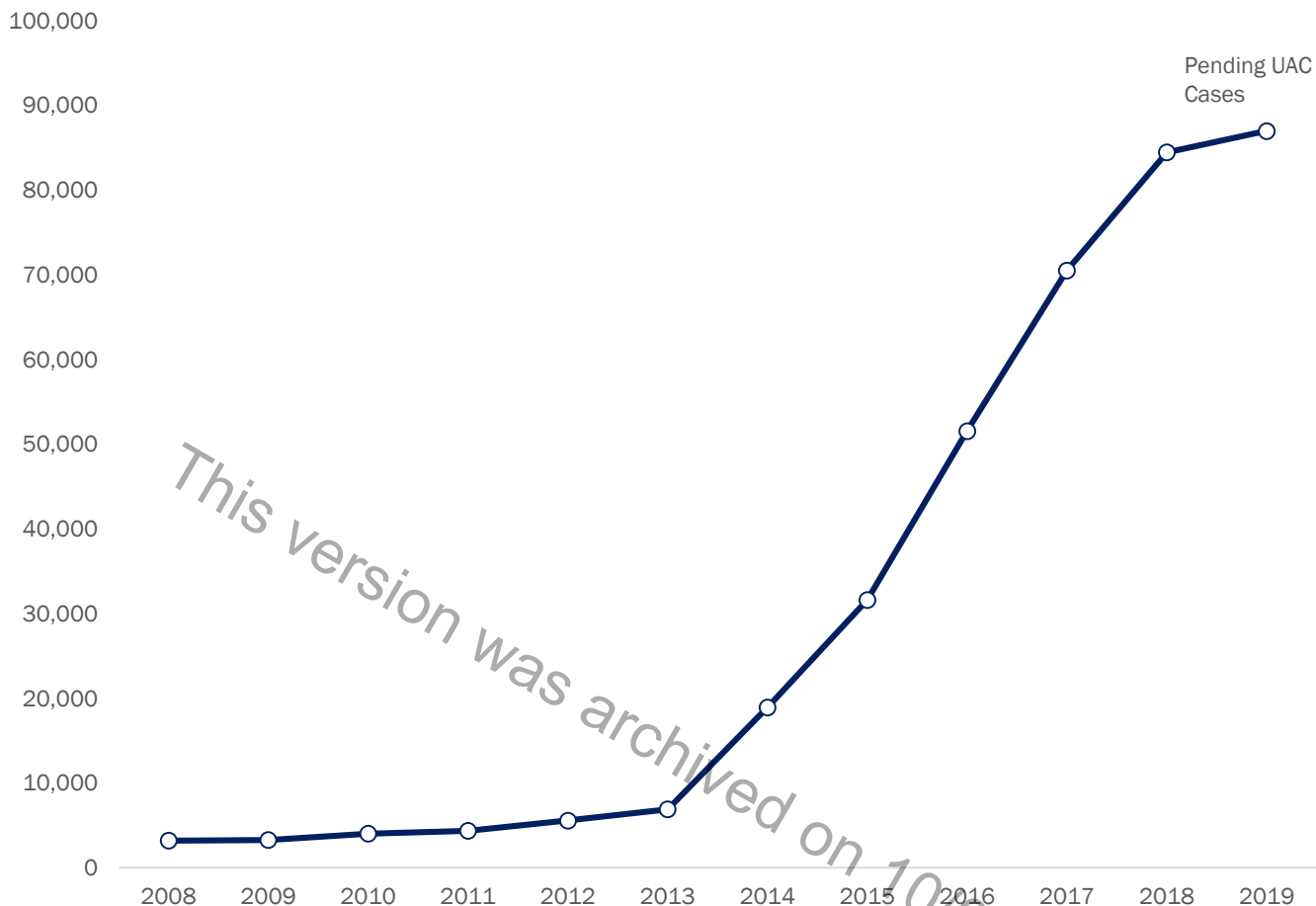

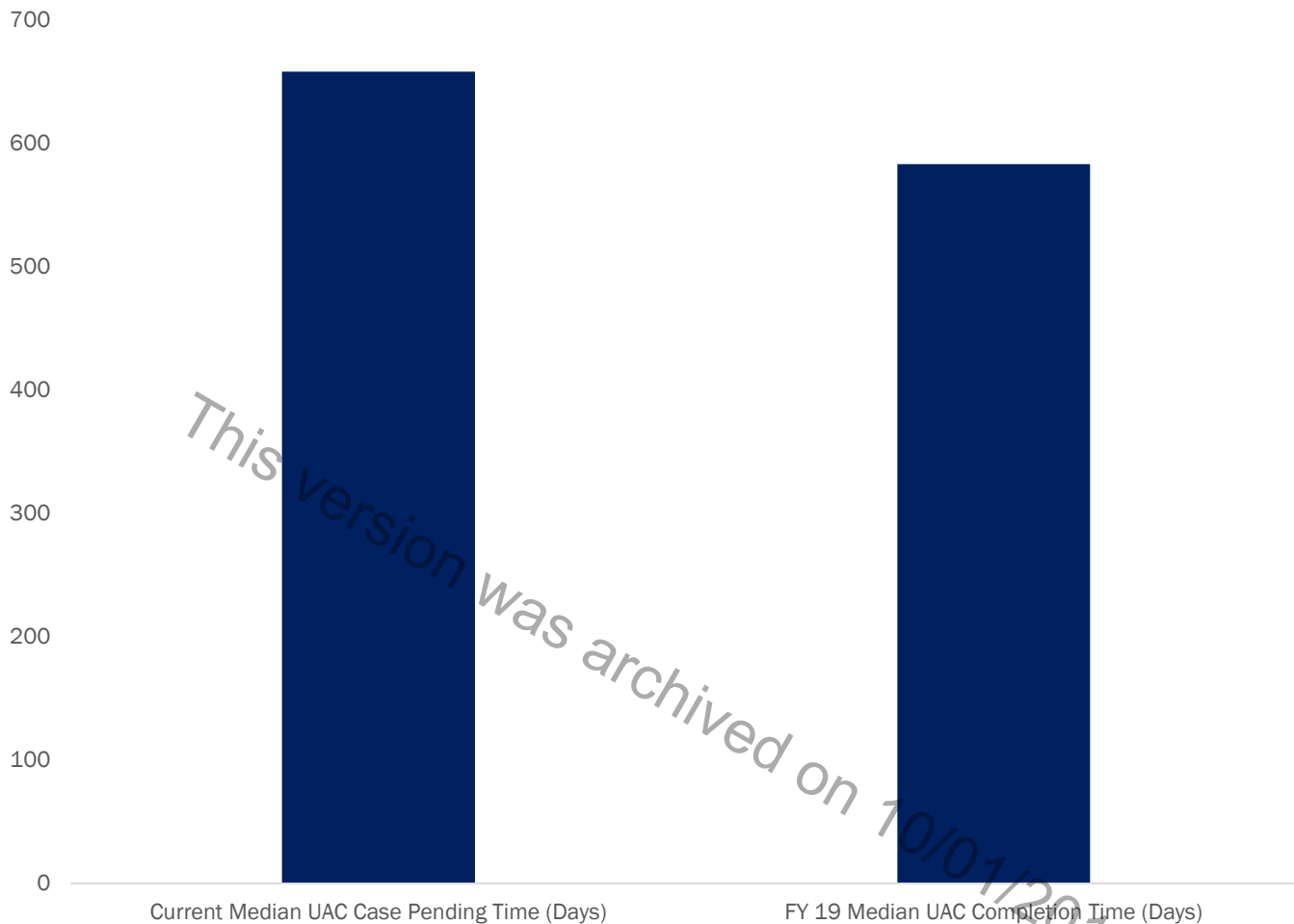

Median Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Case Completion and Case Pending Time

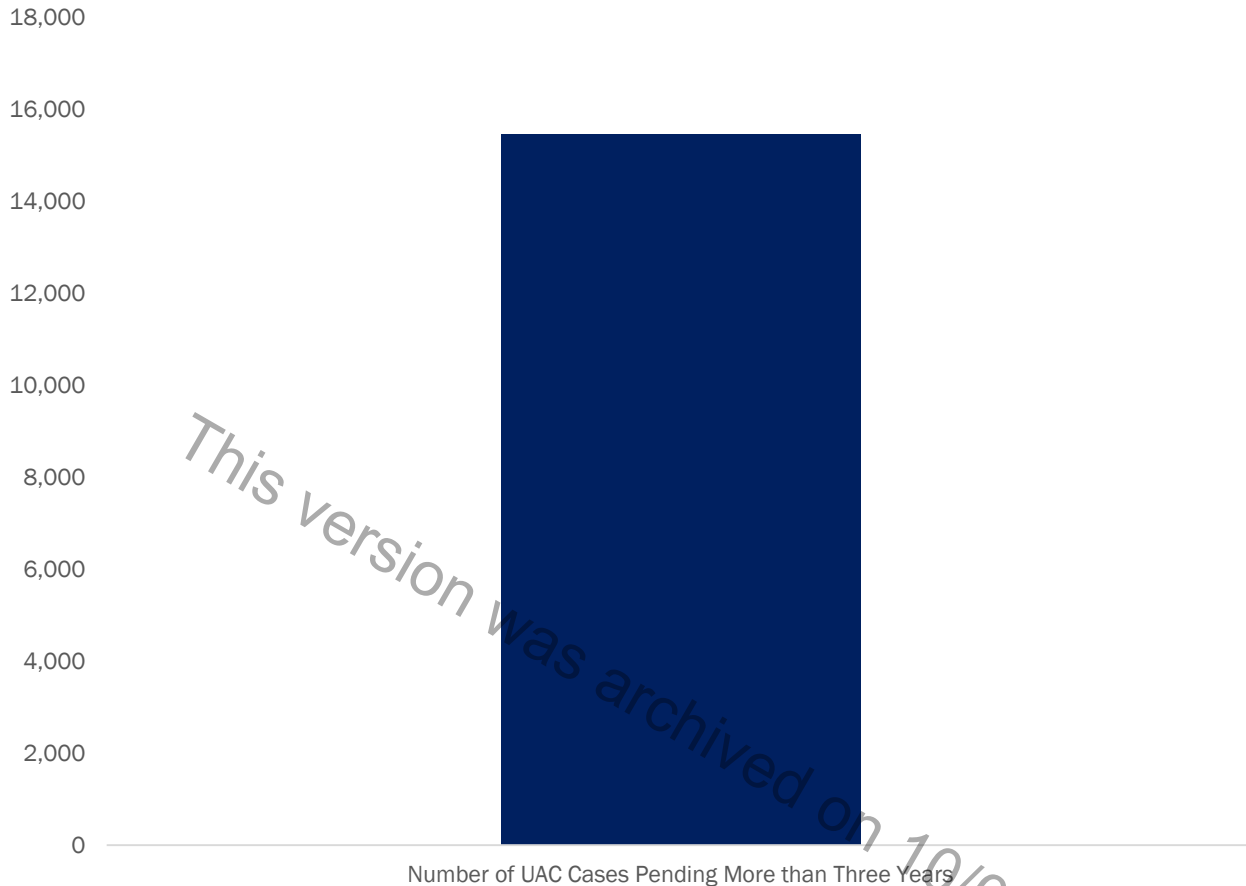

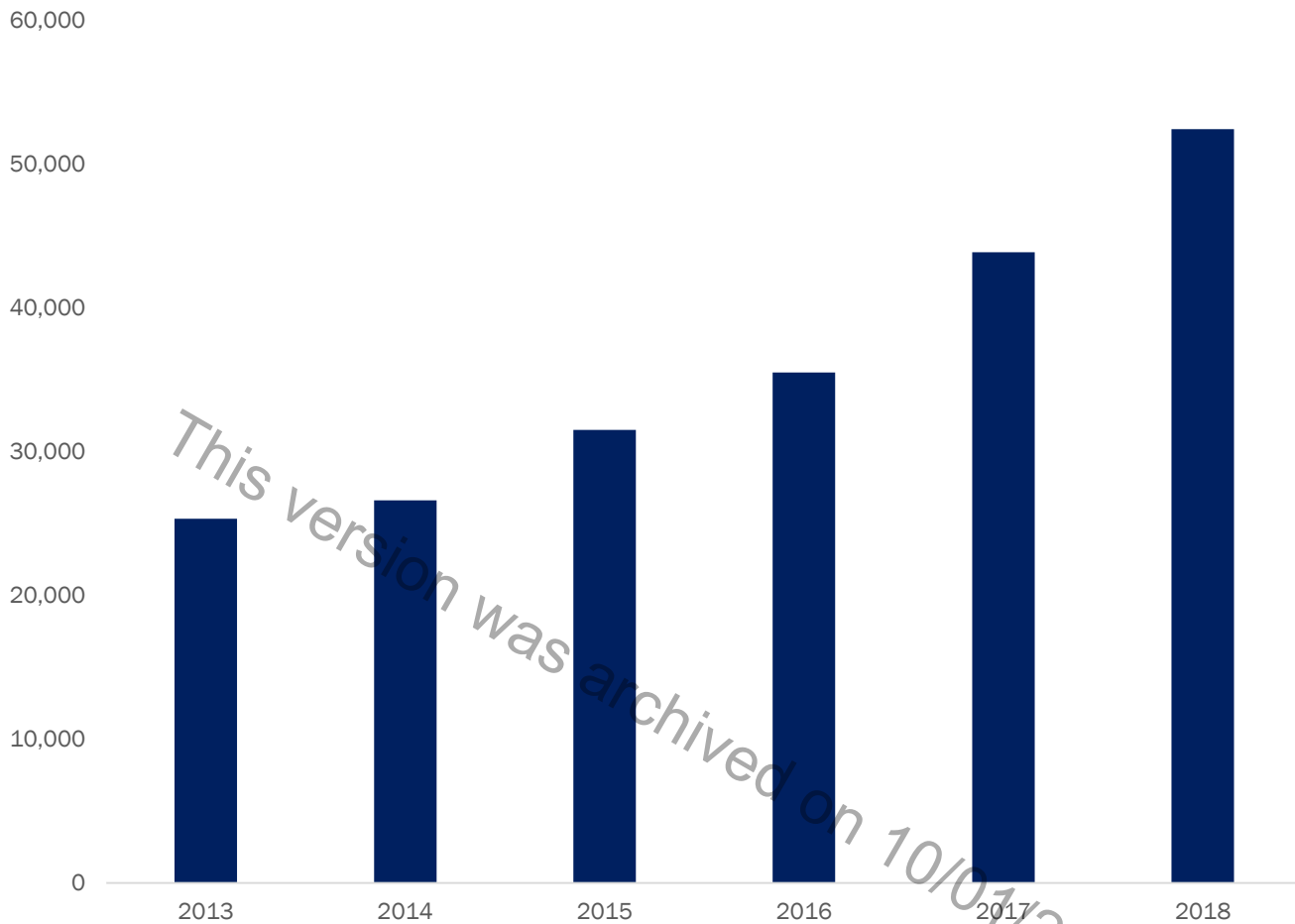
Current Unaccompanied Alien Child (UAC) Cases Pending More than Three Years

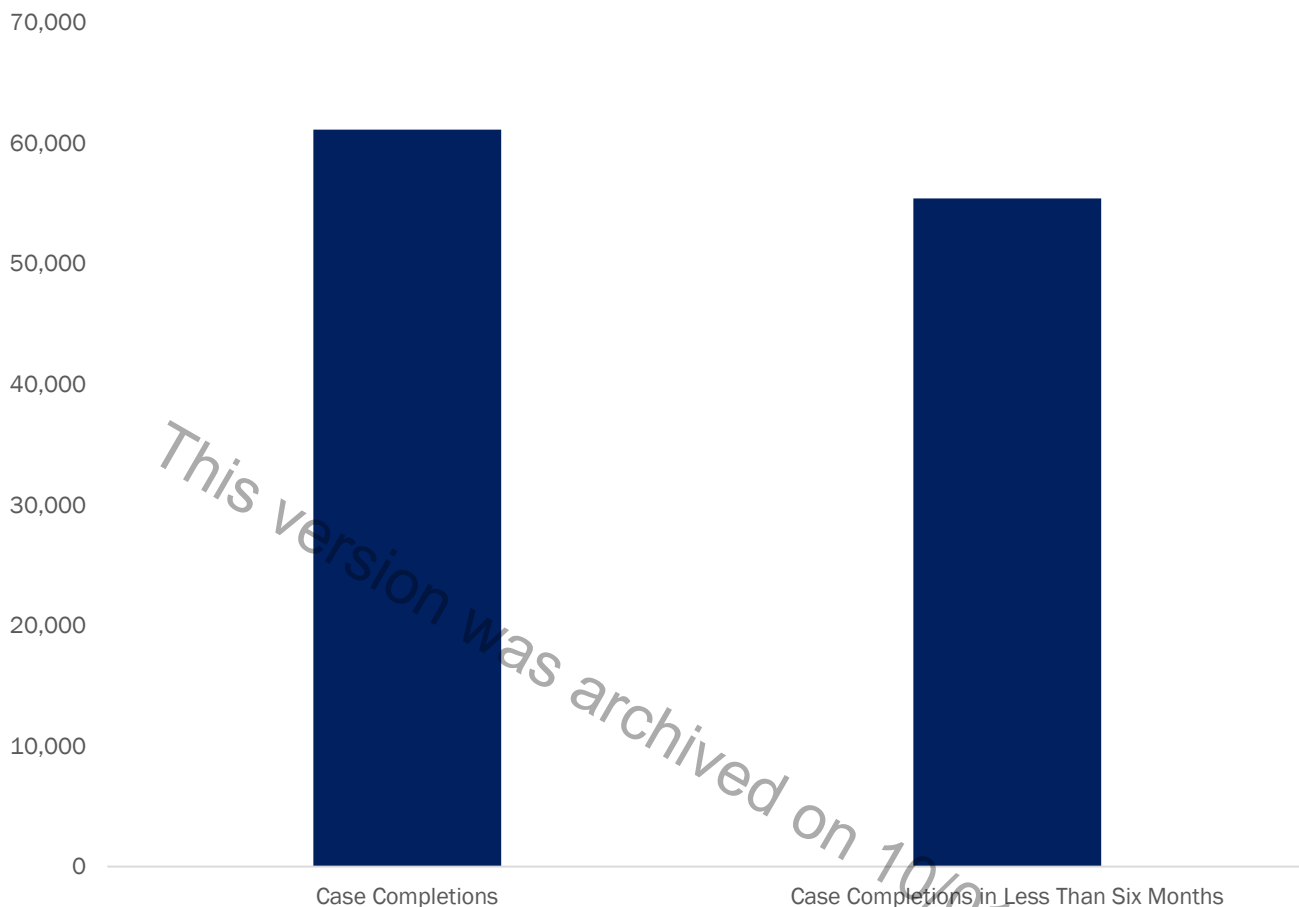

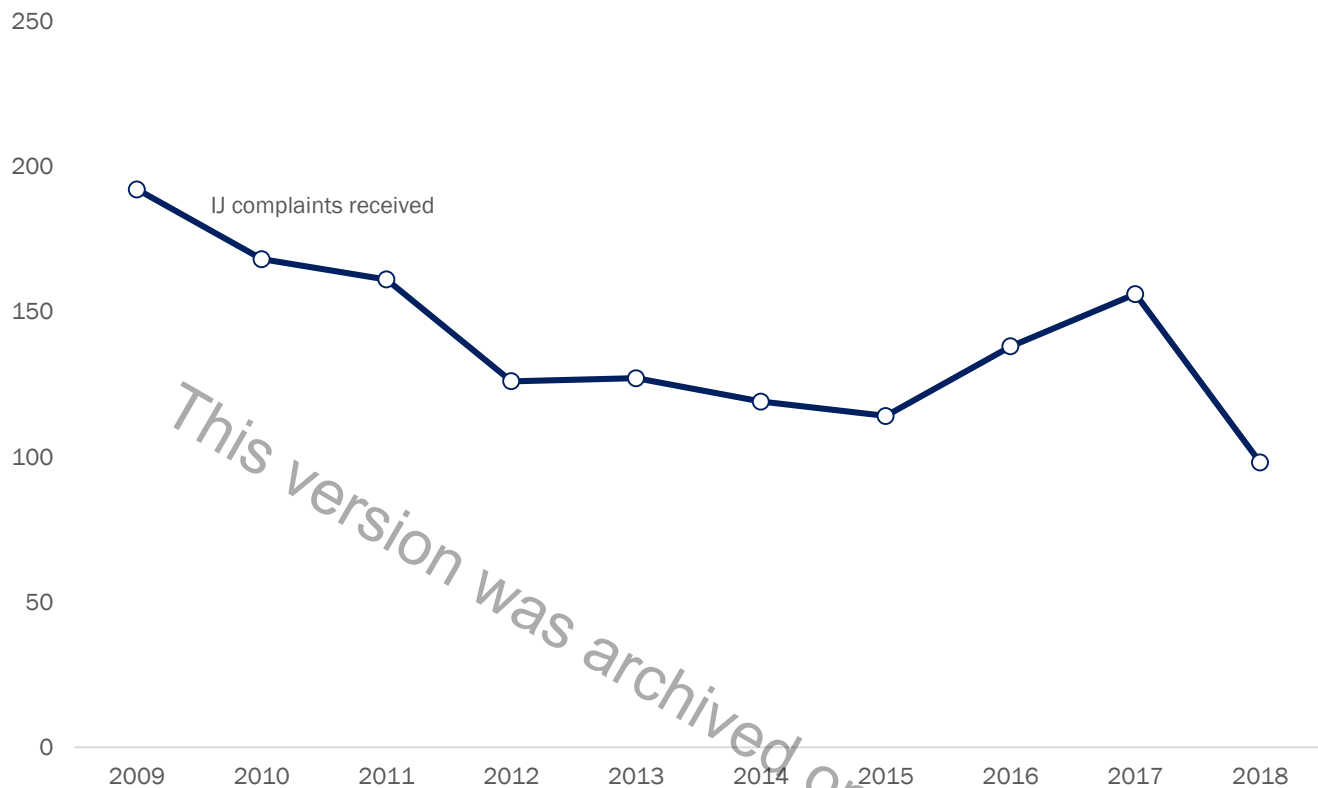
Percentage of DHS-Detained Cases Completed within Six Months¹

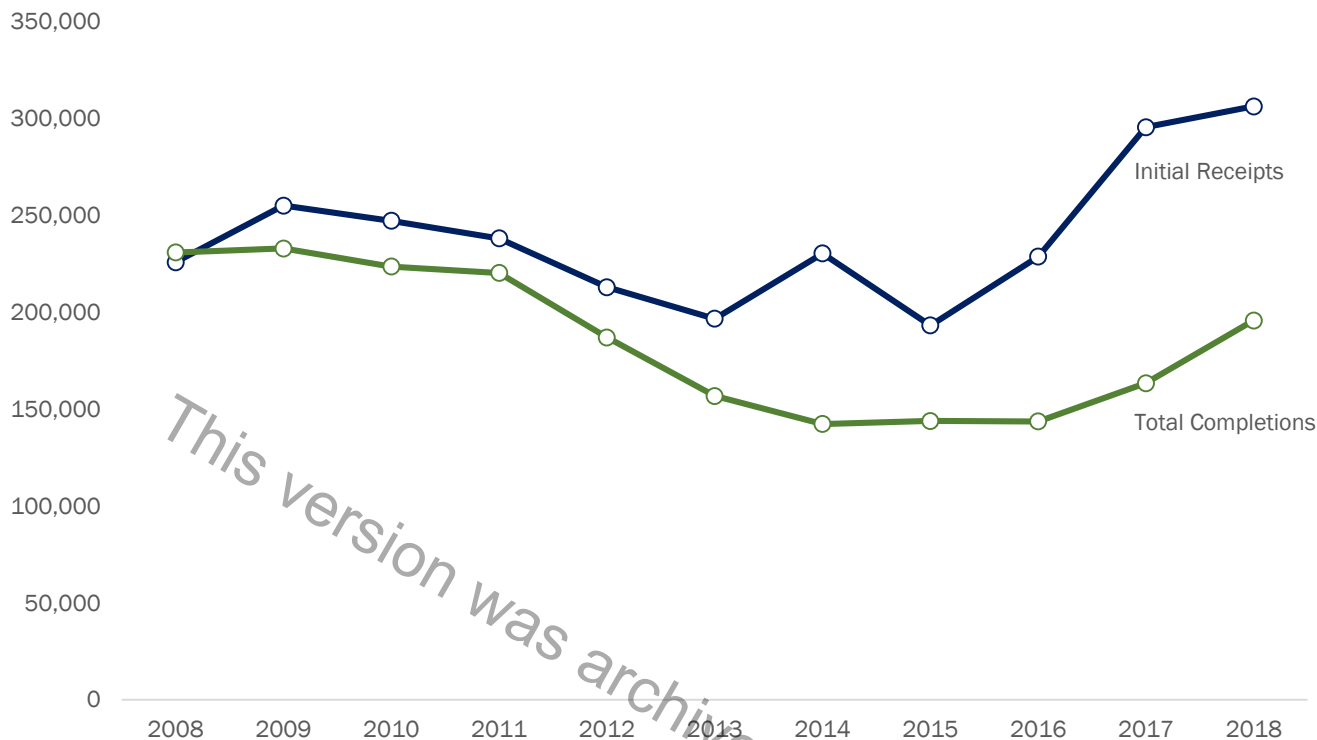

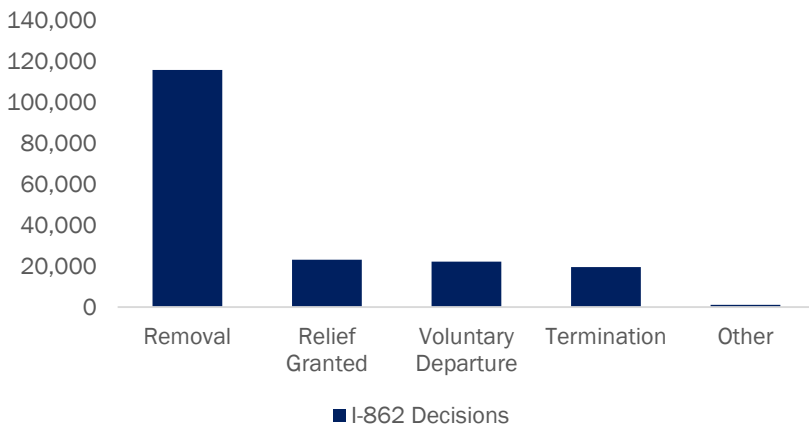

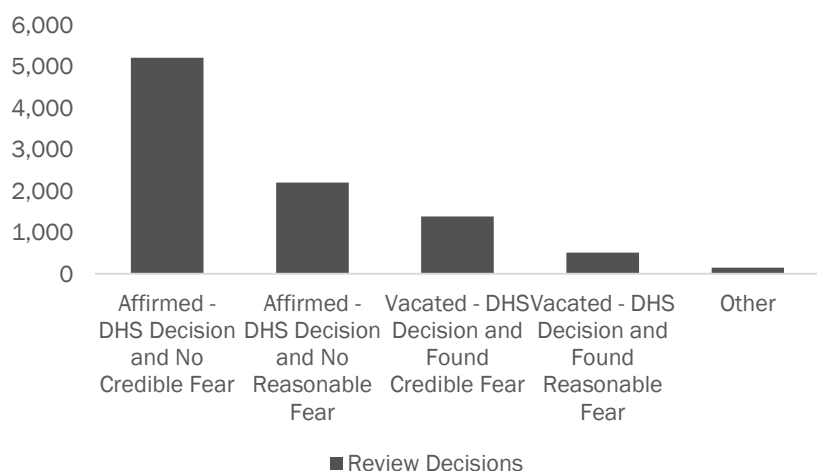

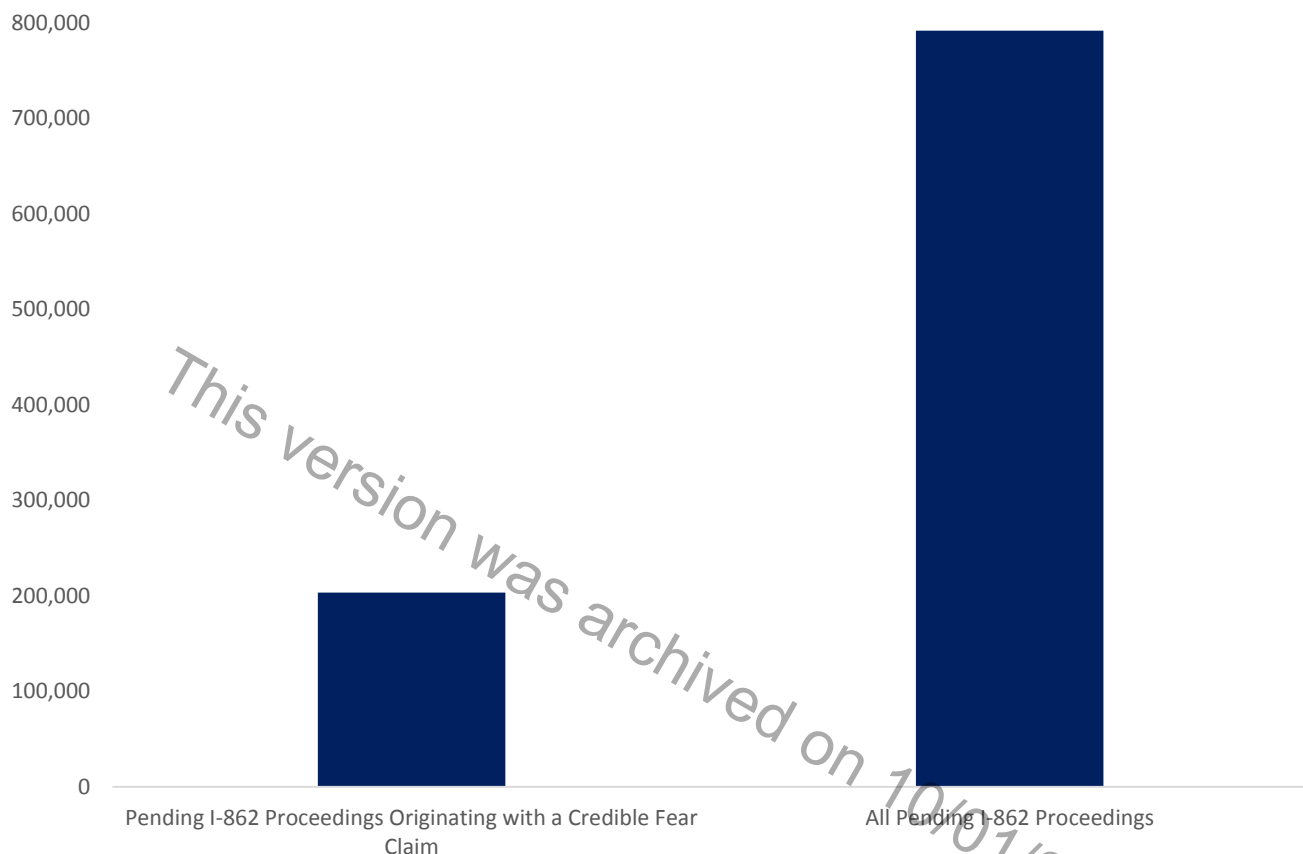
