As we discussed on our call with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on Friday, my understanding is that the FBI has ceased reviewing all content from Epstein's devices and will limit their review of the devices to (a) documents tagged Responsive on Relativity, (b) images and videos identified as Responsive during the review conducted by the FBI and SDNY this fall, and (c) portions of iPads and the iPhone that SDNY identified responsive during our review this fall.

We should plan to do the same going forward. If you guys encounter anything that appears to come from any of Epstein's devices that you believe was not identified responsive, please let me know, and we can take action to confirm and lock off any nonresponsive material from review.
