ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This claim against the Government of Cuba, under Title V of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, was presented by Jose M. Alvarez, Vice-President of THE NEW TUINUCU SUGAR COMPANY, INC. in the amount of \$17,000,000.00 on behalf of that company for losses which may have been sustained as a result of actions by the Government of Cuba.


The claim form was filed on May 1, 1967 and Mr. Alvarez stated on the form that he had no knowledge of a claim filed for the company and was filing this claim in order to comply with the statutory deadline of May 1, 1970. THE NEW TUINUCU SUGAR COMPANY, INC. on April 21, 1967 filed a claim, Claim No. CU-1850, through its attorney Herman Goldman, Esq. in the amount of \$21,895,208.00 and submitted documentation in support thereof, which claim will be determined in due course.

Accordingly, since a prior claim for the same enterprise had been filed, this claim serves no useful purpose and is hereby dismissed.
