## BILL OF INFORMATION FOR CONSPIRACY TO POSSESS WITH THE INTENT TO DISTRIBUTE OXYCODONE AND NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

## THE UNITED STATES ATTORNEY CHARGES:

Beginning in or around 2012, the exact date being unknown to the United States Attorney, and continuing through on or about April 6, 2017, in the Middle District of Louisiana, and elsewhere, MARK STEPHAN IMMASCHE, the defendant herein, did conspire with others known and unknown to the United States Attorney, to knowingly and intentionally possess with the intent to distribute a mixture and substance containing a detectable amount of oxycodone, a Schedule II controlled substance, in violation of Title 21, United States Code, Sections 841(a)(1).

The above is a violation of Title 21, United States Code, Section 846.

## NOTICE OF FORFEITURE

Upon conviction of the offense contained in this Bill of Information, MARK STEPHAN IMMASCHE, defendant herein, shall forfeit to the United States, pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853, any and all property constituting, or derived from, any proceeds obtained, directly or indirectly, as a result of said violation, and any property used, or intended to be used, in any manner or part, to commit, or to facilitate the commission of, the violation.

If any of the above-described forfeitable property, as a result of any act or omission of the defendant:

- a. cannot be located upon the exercise of due diligence;
- b. has been transferred, sold to, or deposited with a third party;
- c. has been placed beyond the jurisdiction of the court;
- d. has been substantially diminished in value; or
- e. has been commingled with other property which cannot be divided without difficulty,

the United States of America shall be entitled to a forfeiture money judgment and shall be

allowed to forfeit substitute property pursuant to Title 21, United States Code, Section 853(p) in satisfaction of the forfeiture money judgment.
