	COUNT ONE	AUDGE WOOD

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY charges:

- 1. At times material to this Indictment: MAGISTRATE JUDGE MARTIN
- a. Medicare was a Federal health care benefit program, as defined in Title 18, United States Code, Section 24(b), that provided free or below-cost health care benefits, including, among other things, medically necessary in-home health care services to certain individuals ("Medicare beneficiaries").
- b. Home health agencies located in the Northern District of Illinois, including Home Health Agencies A through D, were in the business of providing home health care services to Medicare beneficiaries. These agencies were enrolled providers of Medicare services to Medicare beneficiaries. As enrolled providers, these agencies submitted claims to Medicare and received reimbursement for such services.
- c. For a Medicare beneficiary to be eligible to receive skilled-nursing services paid for by Medicare, a physician was required to first approve the beneficiary's plan of care, and to certify on a Home Health Certification and Plan of Treatment, sometimes referred to as a Form 485, that the beneficiary was confined to his or her home, was under the physician's care, and needed the services authorized on the Form 485.

- d. Defendant RUBEN INOCENCIO was a physician who was licensed in Illinois and an enrolled provider of medical services to Medicare beneficiaries. INOCENCIO certified Medicare beneficiaries to qualify for in-home services for which home health agencies billed Medicare.
- 2. Beginning no later than 2013 and continuing through 2016, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, participated in a scheme to defraud a health care benefit program, namely Medicare, and to obtain, by means of materially false and fraudulent pretenses, representations, and promises, money and property owned by, and under the custody and control of a health care benefit program, in connection with the delivery of and payment for health care benefits and services, which scheme is further described below.

- 3. It was part of the scheme that defendant INOCENCIO signed Form 485s in which he falsely certified certain Medicare beneficiaries, including Beneficiary FR, Beneficiary GW, Beneficiary WT, Beneficiary TJ, and Beneficiary JF, as being confined to the home and needing skilled nursing services, knowing that such beneficiaries were not confined to their homes and did not require skilled nursing services.
- 4. It was further part of the scheme that, as a result of the false Form 485s executed by defendant INOCENCIO, INOCENCIO and others, fraudulently submitted, and caused to be submitted, fraudulent claims to Medicare that falsely represented that Medicare beneficiaries, including Beneficiary FR, Beneficiary GW, Beneficiary WT, Beneficiary TJ, and Beneficiary JF received in-home health care services that they qualified for and needed, including skilled nursing services and physician oversight of such services.

5. It was further part of the scheme that defendant INOCENCIO did misrepresent, conceal and hide, and cause to be misrepresented, concealed and hidden, the acts done and the purposes of acts done in furtherance of the scheme.

6. As a result of the scheme, defendant INOCENCIO, and others, fraudulently obtained, and caused others to fraudulently obtain, and converted to their own use payments made by Medicare on the claims submitted by the companies that INOCENCIO worked for and by multiple home health agencies.

7. On or about July 8, 2014, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute the above-described scheme by submitting and causing to be submitted a claim to a health care benefit program, namely Medicare, specifically a claim for skilled nursing services provided by Home Health Agency A to Beneficiary FR from on or about April 25, 2014 through on or about June 23, 2014, that did not qualify for payment because Beneficiary FR was not confined to the home and the services were not medically necessary;

COUNT TWO

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraphs 1 through 6 of Count One are incorporated here.
- 2. On or about December 2, 2014, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute the scheme by submitting and causing to be submitted a claim to a health care benefit program, namely, Medicare, specifically a claim seeking payment for skilled nursing services provided by Home Health Agency B to Beneficiary GW from on or about September 19, 2014, through on or about November 17, 2014, that did not qualify for payment because Beneficiary GW was not confined to the home and the services were not medically necessary;

COUNT THREE

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraphs 1 through 6 of Count One are incorporated here.
- 2. On or about January 18, 2016, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute the scheme by submitting and causing to be submitted a claim to a health care benefit program, namely, Medicare, specifically a claim seeking payment for skilled nursing services provided by Home Health Agency C to Beneficiary WT from on or about November 10, 2015 through on or about January 8, 2016, that did not qualify for payment because Beneficiary WT was not confined to the home and the services were not medically necessary;

COUNT FOUR

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraphs 1 through 6 of Count One are incorporated here.
- 2. On or about July 12, 2016, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute the scheme by submitting and causing to be submitted a claim to a health care benefit program, namely, Medicare, specifically a claim seeking payment for skilled nursing services provided by Home Health Agency D to Beneficiary TJ from on or about November 25, 2015 through on or about January 1, 2016, that did not qualify for payment because Beneficiary TJ was not confined to the home and the services were not medically necessary;

COUNT FIVE

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraphs 1 through 6 of Count One are incorporated here.
- 2. On or about January 25, 2016, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, and others, knowingly and willfully executed and attempted to execute the scheme by submitting and causing to be submitted a claim to a health care benefit program, namely, Medicare, specifically a claim seeking payment for skilled nursing services provided by Home Health Agency A to Beneficiary JF from on or about December 11, 2015 through on or about February 8, 2016, that did not qualify for payment because Beneficiary JF was not confined to the home and the services were not medically necessary;

COUNT SIX

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count One is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about April 30, 2014, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, knowingly and willfully made and caused to be made a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, and made and caused to be made a materially false writing and document, knowing the same to contain a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, in a matter involving a health care benefit program in connection with the payment for health care benefits and services, namely, statements on a Home Health Certification Order that Beneficiary FR was confined to the home and needed skilled nursing services;

COUNT SEVEN

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count One is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about September 29, 2014, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, knowingly and willfully made and caused to be made a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, and made and caused to be made a materially false writing and document, knowing the same to contain a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, in a matter involving a health care benefit program in connection with the payment for health care benefits and services, namely, statements on a Home Health Certification Order that Beneficiary GW was confined to the home and needed skilled nursing services;

COUNT EIGHT

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count One is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about November 20, 2015, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, knowingly and willfully made and caused to be made a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, and made and caused to be made a materially false writing and document, knowing the same to contain a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, in a matter involving a health care benefit program in connection with the payment for health care benefits and services, namely, statements on a Home Health Certification Order that Beneficiary WT was confined to the home and needed skilled nursing services;

COUNT NINE

The SPECIAL DECEMBER 2017 GRAND JURY further charges:

- 1. Paragraph 1 of Count One is incorporated here.
- 2. On or about December 7, 2015, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,

RUBEN INOCENCIO,

defendant herein, knowingly and willfully made and caused to be made a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, and made and caused to be made a materially false writing and document, knowing the same to contain a materially false, fictitious, and fraudulent statement and representation, in a matter involving a health care benefit program in connection with the payment for health care benefits and services, namely, statements on a Home Health Certification Order that Beneficiary TJ was confined to the home and needed skilled nursing services;

COUNT TEN

- 2. On or about December 21, 2015, in the Northern District of Illinois, Eastern Division, and elsewhere,
