- We can file lawsuits based on **EEOC charges**, and we can bring **systemic cases** that are not based on EEOC charges.
- We work **alongside** private plaintiffs' counsel, sharing the workload. We offer years of **experience** in disparate impact litigation and bring **resources** like expert witnesses.
