

JON PAUL CLEMENTS

INDICTMENT

The Grand Jury Charges:

- 1. On or about March 9, 2013, at or near Charleston, Kanawha, West Virginia, and within the Southern District of West Virginia, defendant JON PAUL CLEMENTS did knowingly possess a firearm, that is, a semi-automatic handgun, in and affecting interstate commerce.
- 2. At the time defendant JON PAUL CLEMENTS possessed the aforesaid firearm, he had been convicted of crimes punishable by imprisonment for a term exceeding one year, as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 921(a)(20), that is, convicted on or about July 8, 2002, in the Circuit Court of Kanawha County, West Virginia, of unlawful wounding in violation of W.Va. Code § 61-2-9 and First Degree Robbery with a Firearm in violation of W.Va. Code § 61-2-

In violation of Title 18, United States Code, Sections 922(g)(1) and 924(a)(2).
