## AFFIDAVIT

- I, James M. Green, being duly sworn, state under oath that:
- 1. I am a Special Agent (SA) with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) and have been employed by ATF in excess of eighteen years. I am currently assigned to the Career Criminal Section (CCS) of the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department (KCMOPD). As part of my duties, I conduct investigations involving alleged violations of federal firearms and narcotics laws. This complaint is the result of an investigation conducted by the Affiant and other law enforcement officers.
- 2. On November 22, 2010, KCMOPD CCS investigators and U.S. Marshals were conducting surveillance of a residence located at 5017 South Benton, Kansas City, Jackson County, Western District of Missouri, for a subject wanted in connection with a home invasion in Seattle, Washington. At approximately 1400 hours, a silver Chevrolet Impala, bearing Missouri license WE2-U5X, arrived at the residence occupied by two subjects. The subjects were observed to enter the residence. After approximately 20 minutes the subjects exited the residence and got into the Impala. Investigators were unable to determine if either subject was the wanted individual due to the subjects' clothing.
- 3. Career Criminal Section investigators followed the vehicle from the residence to Go-Chicken-Go located at 5101 Troost Avenue, Kansas City, Missouri. After the vehicle went through the drive-thru of the business, it exited the premises and proceeded southbound on Troost. At approximately 1443 hours, Street Crimes Unit (SCU) 1910 Tactical Squad officers stopped the vehicle at 63rd Street and Troost Avenue to identify the occupants. As the SCU Tactical Officers approached the car, the vehicle took off westbound at a high rate of speed.
- 4. Officers pursued the vehicle west on 63rd Street to Main Street where it turned south. The vehicle went west on Linden Road to Meyer Boulevard where it turned east. The vehicle proceeded east on Meyer at a high rate of speed until it became involved in a vehicular accident at Meyer and Oak. The two occupants of the vehicle exited the front passenger window of the vehicle and attempted to flee northbound on foot.
- 5. As Police Officer (PO) Hendershot was chasing the driver of the vehicle, who was subsequently identified as Issac J. FISHER (B/M, DOB: 03/16/1983), FISHER was observed to throw a clear plastic bag with a green leafy substance and some U.S. Currency to the ground with his right hand. After a brief chase, both subjects were taken into custody at 412 East 63rd Street, Kansas City, Jackson County, Western

District of Missouri. A computer check revealed that FISHER was wanted for a Kansas City Bench Warrant and also had a pickup order for Vandalism from South Patrol Property Crimes. The passenger of the vehicle was identified as Jason L. JONES (B/M, DOB: 01/23/1983), and a computer check revealed four active Kansas City warrants for his arrest.

- 6. While conducting an inventory search of the subject's vehicle prior to towing, a clear plastic bag containing a green leafy substance weighing approximately 365 grams was found on the rear passenger floorboard. An H&K brand, 9mm caliber semi-automatic pistol, Serial Number 27-039943, loaded with one live round of ammunition was located underneath the center console of vehicle. A subsequent computer check on the H&K firearm revealed it to be a stolen firearm out of South Dakota. A second firearm, a Glock, Model 23, .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol, Serial Number NYU075, containing a magazine and 15 live rounds of ammunition, was located between the front passenger seat and the passenger door. Both subjects were transported to Research Hospital via ambulance for treatment of their injuries from the accident.
- 7. On November 22, 2010, at 2105 hours, KCMOPD Detective Robert Browning and I, the Affiant, responded to KCMOPD Headquarters, 1125 Locust, Kansas City, Missouri, to interview FISHER. After being advised of his constitutional rights per the *Miranda* decision, FISHER denied the guns belonged to him but did admit that his DNA might be on the firearms as he touched the firearms two days ago at Jason L. JONES' house. FISHER also admitted to having a felony conviction out of Jackson County, Missouri, for Possession of a Controlled Substance.
- 8. A criminal history inquiry by the Affiant revealed that in 2005, Issac J. FISHER was previously convicted in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri, of the felony offense of Possession of a Controlled Substance in Case Number 16CR03005629-01 and received a four year Suspended Execution of Sentence.
- 9. A criminal history inquiry by the Affiant revealed that Jason L. JONES has been convicted of numerous felony offenses in the Circuit Court of Jackson County, Missouri. In 2009, JONES was convicted of Trafficking Drugs in the Second Degree, Case Number 0816-CR01939-01, and received a ten year Suspended Execution of Sentence. In 2007, JONES was convicted of Possession of a Controlled Substance, Case Number 16CR03007002-01, and received a five year Suspended Execution of Sentence and shock incarceration. In 2004, JONES was convicted of Possession of a Controlled Substance, Case Number 04CR203682-01, and received a five year Suspended Execution of Sentence. I verified that JONES has been previously incarcerated in the Missouri Department of Corrections.

10. On November 23, 2010, I contacted ATF Special Agent (SA) Matt Wilson, who advised that the Glock and H&K brand firearms were both manufactured outside the State of Missouri and would therefore had to have traveled in interstate commerce at some point to be physically present in the State of Missouri.
