It has taken nearly three years for justice in the case of Bobbie Jo Stinnett's murder. During that time, many people worked very hard to bring this case to a close, and we are grateful for their dedication.

We will never forget the members of law enforcement who found Bobbie Jo's murderer in less than 24 hours and returned Victoria Jo safely to us. Sheriff Ben Espey's determination in getting an Amber Alert issued was crucial in locating Victoria. So were the media's help in broadcasting that Amber Alert and the calls that came in from people who saw it.

Many different people in law enforcement collected and processed all kinds of evidence - from DNA to computer files - to make sure Bobbie Jo's killer would be convicted. Finally, the outpouring of support and love from family members, friends, and even total strangers has helped us to get through this terrible time.

This case has finally come to a close, but we will never stop missing Bobbie Jo. She was a sweet and loving wife, daughter and sister, and would have been a wonderful mother.
