FACTUAL BASIS

Were this matter brought to trial, the United States would prove, through competent evidence, the following beyond a reasonable doubt.

On November 20, 2014, Agents with the Office of Border Patrol (OBP), Customs and Border Protection (CBP), Department of Homeland Security (DHS) were conducting transportation checks at the Union Passenger Terminal (UPT) in New Orleans, Louisiana. Agents encountered and questioned the defendant **JUAN CARLOS SALAZAR-GARCIA (SALAZAR-GARCIA)** who admitted that he was a Mexican citizen without immigration documents that would permit him to be in the United States.

Records checks revealed that **SALAZAR-GARCIA** is, in fact, a citizen of Mexico illegally present in the United States and that he had been deported from the United States previously on or about February 7, 2014.

Since his deportation, **SALAZAR-GARCIA** did not receive the requisite consent from the U.S. Attorney General or his designated successor, the Secretary of the Department of Homeland Security, to apply for readmission or receive permission to reenter the United States.
