SIR: I have the honor, in answer to the Senate resolution of inquiry passed at the present session, concerning the amounts paid or allowed in the various departments for attorney and counsel fees, exclusive of the regular salaries paid to the Attorney General and the respective district attorneys, during the fiscal-year ending June 30, 1864, and, so far as practicable, from that period to the 1st of January, 1865, to transmit herewith the accompanying schedule, containing, as far as this department is concerned, the statement called for.

This schedule would have been transmitted long since, but, as the answer of the Secretary of the Treasury to the same resolution contained, in detail, all the information possessed by this department, it was believed that it was not necessary for the Attorney General to make a report, that must, as far as his own office is concerned, have been identical with that.
