Mission:

The mission of the FBI is to protect the American people and uphold the Constitution of the United States. The FBI's vision is to stay ahead of the threat. The FBI's dedicated focus to this mission is leading to historic results in the safety and security of the American people.

Organization:

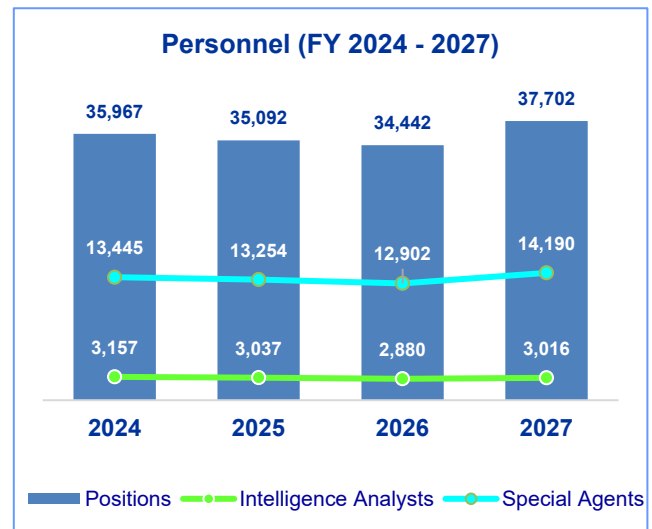
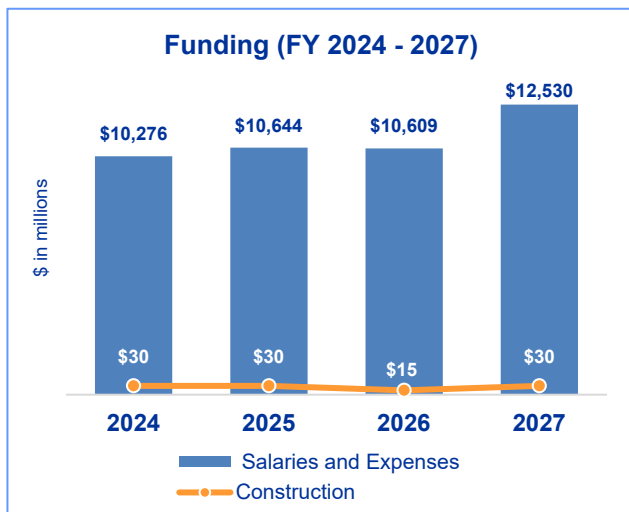
The FBI is headed by the Director, who is appointed by the President and confirmed by the United States Senate. The FBI operates in 56 field offices (FOs) in major U.S. cities and approximately 350 resident agencies (RAs) – or satellite offices – throughout the country. The FBI also operates 63 Law Enforcement Attaché (Legat) offices and 37 sub-offices in 84 foreign countries around the world that enable law enforcement partnerships and capabilities. FBI operations are coordinated and managed by its multi-site FBI Headquarters (HQ), which was streamlined and re-organized to enhance organizational efficiency. Over the past year, the FBI consolidated HQ organizational structure and redirected over 1,500 positions from HQ functions to expand Field Office investigative capacity – directly supporting the safety and security of American communities from coast to coast – and the FBI's presence at the Richard Shelby Center for Innovation and Advanced Training in Huntsville.

Resources:

The FY 2027 FBI budget request totals \$12,530 million, a 17.8 percent increase from the FY 2026 Enacted.

Personnel:

The FBI's direct authorized position count for FY 2027 is 37,702, including an increase of 3,206 positions from the FY 2026 Enacted level of 34,442 direct authorized positions.



FY 2027 FBI Strategy:

The mission of the FBI is to protect the American people and uphold the Constitution of the United States. The FBI strategy has four priorities to drive our work and support our no-fail mission to make America safe.

- **Crush Violent Crime:** The FBI will destroy the ability of violent actors, gangs, and cartels to operate. The FBI will dismantle criminal enterprises.
- **Defend the Homeland:** The FBI will protect the U.S. from terrorist attack, foreign intelligence, espionage, foreign cyber operations, and adversarial cyber-criminal activity.
- **Rebuild Public Trust:** The FBI will increase its own transparency to the public and be responsive to Congressional oversight. The FBI will increase trust in U.S. communities and institutions by combating public corruption, white-collar crime, and civil rights violations.
- **Fierce Organizational Accountability:** The FBI will hold all employees, processes, tools, and technology to the highest standard of accountability – keeping the American public informed.

The proposed FY 2027 budget request will allow the FBI to build upon the FBI's achievements in FY 2025 and FY 2026, combatting violent gangs like MS-13 and Tren de Aragua; arresting thousands of child predators; capturing the world's most dangerous fugitives; enhancing law enforcement partnerships; disrupting acts of espionage by countries like Iran, Russia, and China; disrupting terrorist attacks; and defending critical infrastructure from cyber-attacks.

FY 2027 Program Changes:

Salaries and Expenses:

Intelligence Community Support: \$94.3 million and 44 positions (0 Attorneys; one Special Agent)

Requested resources will enhance FBI programs providing capabilities in direct support to Intelligence Community partners. The programs supported by these resources are classified.

National Security System Cybersecurity Requirement: \$105.0 million and 0 positions

Requested resources will refresh equipment and ensure robust maintenance and sustainment.

Combatting Violent Crime: \$311.7 million and 686 positions (seven Attorneys; 231 Special Agents)

Requested resources will enhance the FBI's ability to combat criminal cartels, foreign gangs, and transnational criminal organizations across the country. Specifically, the FBI will dedicate SAs to regional Homeland Security Task Forces and Field Offices to combat criminal activities including child exploitation, violent crime, narcotics trafficking, and cartels and gangs with foreign terrorist organization designations. Further, additional resources will allow the FBI to expand access to unmanned aircraft systems mitigation to Federal, state and local partners and to fund the FBI led C-UAS national training center.

Counterterrorism: \$166.1 million and 328 positions (five Attorneys; 130 Special Agents)

Requested resources will allow the FBI to develop artificial intelligence (AI)-powered, cutting-edge capabilities to respond to the impacts of global terrorism events; enhance and maintain enterprise platforms supporting the U.S. Intelligence Community; implement National Security Presidential Memorandum / NSPM-7 requirements; and lead law enforcement preparations for tactical response, explosives management, and render safe operations for the 2028 Los Angeles Olympic Games.

Cyber: \$95.6 million and 152 positions (two Attorneys; 37 Special Agents)

Requested resources will increase the FBI's capacity for both unilateral and joint-enabled, sequenced operations with other Federal, state, local, and international partners, focused on three critical areas: Victim Engagement and Incident Response; Data Management, Exploitation, and Tool Development; and Cyber Workforce Development.

Counterintelligence: \$73.2 million and 154 positions (0 Attorneys; 90 Special Agents)

Requested resources will enhance the FBI's ability to combat foreign adversary intelligence collection and subversion tactics against the U.S.

Cybersecurity: \$111.1 million and 37 positions (0 Attorneys; 0 Special Agents)

Requested resources will allow the FBI to modernize operational enclaves; secure mission-critical systems; and maintain system transparency, accountability, and operational readiness.

Field Investigative Capabilities: \$144.8 million and 515 positions (0 Attorneys; 69 Special Agents)

Requested resources will improve the FBI's investigative capabilities in digital and forensic arenas; improve hiring and retention for highly specialized roles; and support operational and technical needs for the Tactical Task Force program.

21st Century Advanced Training at Redstone: \$29.4 million and 46 positions (two Attorneys; nine Special Agents)

Requested resources will support student costs to attend training at Redstone Arsenal, as well as establish operational support units at Redstone Academy overseeing training coordination, logistics, and support; developing intermediate and advanced curricula; and managing Practical Problem Venues.

Insider Threat: \$18.9 million and 72 positions (two Attorneys; one Special Agents)

Requested resources will enable the FBI to fully comply with mandatory vetting processes and adhere to directives, laws, and policies via personnel vetting program reform for Investigative Service Providers. The FBI will navigate evolving missions, threat indicators and landscapes, workforces, and technology for sound suitability and security clearance determinations to safeguard national security information.

Transparency of Government and Promoting Public Trust: \$31.3 million and 16 positions (0 Attorneys; 0 Special Agents)

Requested resources will protect FBI networks and ensure compliance with statutory obligations for full transparency to the public. The funding will help FBI prevent unauthorized disclosures of sensitive information; mitigate insider risk and threats of workplace violence; and safeguard national security information and assets. The FBI will also reduce growing Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request backlogs through technological advancements to automate processes and maximize productivity with integrity and consistency across the enterprise.
