TERMINATE LEGACY ANTITRUST JUDGMENT**

The United States moves to terminate the final judgment in the above-captioned case pursuant to Rule 60(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. As explained in the accompanying Memorandum in Support of the Motion of the United States to Terminate Legacy Antitrust Judgment, the United States has concluded that because of its age and changed circumstances since its entry, this decades-old judgment no longer serves to protect competition.
