DECREE PRO CONFESSO

The United States having filed its petition herein on June 12, 1930 and the defendant Konserv A/S having appeared by Gustav Lange, Jr., a solicitor of this Court and the said defendant having failed to file an answer or other defense and the time to answer having expired and it further appearing that on the 6th day of March, 1931 an order was duly entered directing that the bill herein be taken *pro confesso* against the defendant Konserv A/S and that more than thirty days have elapsed since the entry of said order and that no further proceedings have been had in said case, or taken since the said order was entered,

Now, on motion of George Z. Medalie, United States Attorney for the Southern District of New York, solicitor for the complainant, it is

ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED:

That the decree of this court entered on January 16, 1931 upon the consent of certain defendants enjoining and restraining further violations of law be and the same hereby is made the decree of this court as to the defendant Konserv A/S and made binding upon the said defendant in manner and form as is provided in the said decree.
