21	California, and elsewhere, within the State of California, before the making of this criminal			
22	complaint, the above-named defendant, JASPREET JAGPAL (DOB 12/18/89), committed the			
23	following different criminal offenses all connected together in their commission, and being two or			
24	more different offenses of the same class of crimes or offenses, under separate counts:

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COUNT 1 Penal Code § 550(a)(5) – FELONY Fraud – 2, 3 or 5 years

On or about and between January 1, 2020 through November 21, 2020, in the County of Sutter, and elsewhere, defendant JASPREET JAGPAL did willfully, knowingly, and unlawfully make and cause to be made a writing, with the intent to present it in support of a false and fraudulent claim, in violation of section 550(a)(5) of the Penal Code, a felony; to wit: minor child L.E. did not receive applied behavior analysis services for which JAGPAL billed, and as a result JAGPAL fraudulently received approximately \$49,169.

COUNT 2 Penal Code § 550(a)(5) – FELONY Fraud – 2, 3 or 5 years

On or about and between March 29, 2020 through August 1, 2020, in the County of Sutter, and elsewhere, defendant JASPREET JAGPAL did willfully, knowingly, and unlawfully make and cause to be made a writing, with the intent to present it in support of a false and fraudulent claim, in violation of section 550(a)(5) of the Penal Code, a felony; to wit: minor child A.A. did not receive applied behavior analysis services for which JAGPAL billed, and as a result JAGPAL fraudulently received approximately \$32,554.

COUNT 3 Penal Code § 550(a)(5) – FELONY Fraud – 2, 3 or 5 years

On or about and between March 29, 2020 through August 1, 2020, in the County of Sutter, and elsewhere, defendant JASPREET JAGPAL did willfully, knowingly, and unlawfully make and cause to be made a writing, with the intent to present it in support of a false and fraudulent claim, in violation of section 550(a)(5) of the Penal Code, a felony; to wit: minor child B.D. did not receive applied behavior analysis services for which JAGPAL billed, and as a result JAGPAL fraudulently received approximately \$31,562.

COUNT 4 Penal Code § 550(a)(5) – FELONY Fraud – 2, 3 or 5 years

On or about and between March 29, 2020 through August 1, 2020, in the County of Sutter, and elsewhere, defendant JASPREET JAGPAL did willfully, knowingly, and unlawfully make

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and cause to be made a writing, with the intent to present it in support of a false and fraudulent claim, in violation of section 550(a)(5) of the Penal Code, a felony; to wit: minor child K.M. did not receive applied behavior analysis services for which JAGPAL billed, and as a result JAGPAL fraudulently received approximately \$25,062.50.

COUNT 5 Penal Code § 550(a)(5) – FELONY Fraud – 2, 3 or 5 years

On or about and between March 29, 2020 through August 1, 2020, in the County of Sutter, and elsewhere, defendant JASPREET JAGPAL did willfully, knowingly, and unlawfully make and cause to be made a writing, with the intent to present it in support of a false and fraudulent claim, in violation of section 550(a)(5) of the Penal Code, a felony; to wit: minor child B.P. did not receive applied behavior analysis services for which JAGPAL billed, and as a result JAGPAL fraudulently received approximately \$28,408.

SPECIAL ALLEGATION Aggravated White Collar Crime Enhancement Penal Code §§ 186.11(a)(1) and (a)(3)

It is further alleged, pursuant to section 186, subdivisions (a)(1) and (a)(3) of the Penal Code, that the offenses alleged in Counts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are felonies, a material element of each Count is fraud, that JASPREET JAGPAL engaged in a pattern of related felony conduct, and the combined pattern of related felony conduct resulted in a loss to the victim of more than \$100,000.

SPECIAL ALLEGATION Extended Statute of Limitations Penal Code §§ 803(c) and 801.5

It is further alleged, pursuant to sections 801.5 and 803, subdivision (c) of the Penal Code, that the offenses alleged in Counts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are felonies, and that no victim of said violation and no law enforcement agency chargeable with the investigation and prosecution of said violation had actual and constructive knowledge of said violations prior to August 6, 2020 and August 20, 2020. On August 6, 2020, the mother of K.M. informed Anthem that Anthem had been billed for services not rendered to K.M. On August 20, 2020, an employee of Anthem relayed the information provided by the mother of K.M. to a special agent for the Division of Medi-Cal Fraud and Elder Abuse (DMFEA), California Department of Justice. These offenses

1	were not discovered earlier because neither Anthem nor DMFEA were aware that JASPREET		
2	JAGPAL fraudulently billed for services not rendered during the early months of the COVID-19		
3	pandemic due to JAGPAL deliberately providing false information to Anthem when JAGPAL		
4	claimed to have provided services JAGPAL did not, in fact, provide.		
5	SPECIAL ALLEGATION		
6	Extended Statute of Limitations Penal Code §§ 803(c) and 801.5		
7	It is further alleged, pursuant to sections 801.5 and 803, subdivision (c) of the Penal Code,		
8	that the offenses alleged in Counts 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 are felonies, and that each offense was		
9	completed no earlier than the date below, on which JASPREET JAGPAL claimed to have		
10	provided applied behavior analysis services to the minor child listed in each Count, services that		
11	JAGPAL did not, in fact, provide:		
12	for Count 1: November 21, 2020;		
13	for Count 2: August 1, 2020;		
14	for Count 3: August 1, 2020;		
15	for Count 4: August 1, 2020; and		
16	for Count 5: August 1, 2020.

- 4. Any reports or statements of experts made in connection with the case. [Pen. Code § 1054.3, subd. (a).]
- 5. Any results of physical or mental examinations, scientific tests, experiments or comparisons which the defendants intend to offer in evidence at the trial. [Pen. Code § 1054.3, subd. (a).]
- 6. The opportunity to view any real evidence which the defendants intend to offer in evidence at the trial. [Pen. Code § 1054.3, subd. (b).]
