3. Computer Matching Programs

a) List of Matching Programs

1. Department of Justice (DOJ) and Department of Education:

This agreement matches data from the DOJ Bureau of Justice Assistance Denial of Federal Benefits Clearinghouse with data from applications for student financial assistance under Title IV of the Higher Education Act of

1965, as amended, to identify applicants who are ineligible for benefits.

2. Department of Justice and Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service (IRS):

IRS provides DOJ with the mailing addresses of taxpayers so that DOJ may notify the delinquent debtor/taxpayer of enforcement action to collect or compromise debts owed to the United States.

3. Department of Justice and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA):

DOJ Bureau of Prisons (BOP) provides information about individuals who are in federal prison to the VA, Veterans Benefits Administration, to identify individuals who may be ineligible for benefits.

The DOJ DIB did not waive the requirement for a cost-benefit analysis for any of the approved matching agreements in 2022. The DOJ DIB required a favorable cost-benefit ratio for all approved matches. The DOJ components implementing each matching program continue to consider the programs to be cost-effective.
