- 5. Language in the joint explanatory statement directs NIJ to report on the projected workload, backlog, personnel, workforce, resources, necessary turnaround times for law enforcement officers and officers of the court, and equipment needs of forensic science providers and forensic medical service providers. *Response in progress*; Preliminary report transmitted to Congress in April 2025.
