- 9) the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and

- 5. Access to Financial Information You shall provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information, including personal income tax returns, authorization for release of credit information, and any other business financial information in which you have a control or interest.
- 6. Employment Restriction You shall be restricted from engaging in employment, consulting, or any association with any real estate, property management, or HOA-related business for a period of three years.
- 7. You shall not have contact, directly or indirectly, or associate with any co conspirators associated with any related cases identified in the presentence report or be within 500 feet of any co conspirators associated with any related cases identified in the presentence report, their residence or business. And if confronted by any co conspirators in a public place, you shall immediately remove yourself from the area.
- 8. Community Service You shall complete 100 hours of community service, as approved and directed by the probation officer.

Note: A written statement of the conditions of release was provided to the Defendant by the Probation Officer in open court at the time of sentencing.

However, Defendant Gregory should have received a credit for the \$450,000 paid to Silver Lining Construction but ultimately recovered by the Vistana HOA, and his restitution amount is hereby reduced by that amount.

The Court originally ordered Defendant Levinson to pay \$19,000,000 in restitution. However, given that Defendant Leon Benzer was ordered to pay \$12,228,913.40 in restitution and Leon Benzer was the leader of the conspiracy, Defendant Levinon's restitution award should not exceed Defendant Benzer's.
