STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

As part of your supervised release, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

- 1) You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of RELEASE, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
- 2) After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
- 3) You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.
- 4) You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.
- 5) You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.
- You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with, for example), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
- 7) You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by these and the special conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
- 8) You must work at least part-time (defined as 20 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment unless excused from doing so by the probation officer for schooling, training, community service or other acceptable activities. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
- 9) You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. You must not associate, communicate, or interact with any person you know has been convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer.
- 10) If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.
- You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
- You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).

If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to a third party, the probation officer may require you to notify the
person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm
that you have notified the person about the risk. (check if applicable)

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

1. You must not maintain a position of fiduciary capacity without the prior permission of the probation officer.

- 2. You must pay any restitution and special assessment that is imposed by this judgment and that remains unpaid at the commencement of the term of supervised release.
- 3. You must provide the probation officer with access to any financial information, including tax returns, and must authorize the probation officer to conduct credit checks and obtain copies of income tax returns.
- 4. You must undergo an assessment for mental health treatment services. If services are deemed appropriate, then you must pay for part or all the cost of treatment, as directed by the probation officer. You must adhere to a co-payment schedule as determined by the probation officer. Payments must never exceed the total cost of mental health counseling. The actual co-payment schedule must be determined by the probation officer.
- 5. You must cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer.
- 6. You must submit your person, residence, office, vehicle, electronic devices and their data (including cell phones, computers, and electronic storage media), or any property under your control to a search. Such a search must be conducted by a United States Probation Officer or any federal, state or local law enforcement officer at any time with or without suspicion. Failure to submit to such a search may be grounds for revocation. You must warn any residents that the premises may be subject to searches.
- 7. You must not possess or use a computer or computer-related device without the prior approval of the probation officer. "Computer or computer-related device" means any electronic device capable of creating, accessing, storing, viewing, or transmitting material including, but not limited to, the data or material associated with the offense conduct. "Computer or computer-related device" includes (but is not limited to) desktop and tower computers, laptop computers, smartphones, security cameras (such as "nanny cams" or cameras linked to doorbells), USB or "thumb" drives, gaming platforms, compact discs, and external hard drives.
- 8. As directed by the probation officer, you must enroll in the probation office's Computer and Internet Monitoring Program (CIMP) and must abide by the requirements of the CIMP program and the Acceptable Use Contract.
- 9. You must not access the Internet or any "on-line computer service" at any location (including employment) without the prior approval of the probation officer. "On-line services" include any Internet service provider, or any other public or private computer network. As directed by the probation officer, you must warn your employer of restrictions to your computer use.
- 10. You must consent to the probation officer conducting periodic unannounced examinations of your computer equipment which may include retrieval and copying of all data from your computer(s) and any peripheral device to ensure compliance with this condition, and/or removal of any such equipment for the purpose of conducting more thorough inspection. You must also consent to the installation of any hardware or software as directed by the probation officer to monitor your Internet use.
- 11. You must not possess or use any data encryption technique or program.
