As discussed earlier, please see below a short description of DEA resources being deployed to assist law enforcement efforts in Washington DC.

DEA is marshaling significant resources in support of our federal, state, and local counterparts to help quell the social unrest in the Washington, DC area. In addition to the resources we deployed in the last several days, below please find the additional support being provided as of June 1:

- Deploying (b)(7)(E) per DEA DEA Special Agents to accompany the Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) and National Guard units, [starting this afternoon](#). This doubles the number deployed Sunday night.

- o Activating an addition (b)(7)(E) per DEA Special Agents (for a total (b)(7)(E) per DEA) to provide additional support as needed [on June 2](#) and 3. These additional activations will allow DEA to rotate staffing and ensure adequate travel and rest time prior to deployment.

- o Agents are being pulled from Washington, DC; Baltimore; Richmond; Norfolk; Hampton; Roanoke; Bristol; and Headquarters units, including the Special Operations Division (SOD), Office of Training, and Operational Support Division.

- Activating (b)(7)(E) per DEA quick response teams that will rove the area and respond to high risk situations and any requests for assistance requiring specialized (SRT) training, including Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

- Coordinating all efforts with the Metropolitan Police department (MPD) as requested by the U.S. Attorney's office and other federal, state, and local counterparts, as well as the Department of Defense.

- Staffing the FBI SIOC with DEA intelligence personnel to provide analytic support and facilitate real-time sharing of information.

DEA continues to field requests from other partners around the country and stands ready to assist as needed.

Rachel, Quick summary:

ATF NCR EFFORTS

ATF has been coordinating enforcement operations with the D.C, Metropolitan Police Department (MPD), U.S. Park Police, United States Secret Service and FBI since the outset of civil unrest in Washington, D.C. In addition to enforcement operations targeting criminal activity such as act of arson, ATF provided 25 special agents and a fully equipped Special Response Team (SRT) with an armored vehicle to support security operations at the RFK building and White House from March 20 to June 1st. As of June 1st, ATF deployed the following additional resources to assist federal and local law enforcement in Washington, D.C.

- ATF redeployed its SRT and armored vehicle to exclusively support enforcement operations in the Capital, and deployed approximately 80 additional agents from regional field offices to support enforcement operations with MPD, the D.C. National Guard, and federal partners.
- Approximately 25 additional agents are in route from outside the region, arriving ASAP, to further support operations.
- ATF repositioned its Joint MPD Arson Task Force to directly support operations in the vicinity of the White House and has deployed members of its National Response Team to support the Arson investigations, including placement of a NRT response vehicle at the White House. The response vehicle contains specialized equipment allowing prompt processing of arson and explosives scenes.
- ATF continues to coordinate all efforts with MPD, the D.C. USAO, DC National Guard, and federal partners. To facilitate this coordination, ATF has established an electronic Virtual Command Center that is live-streamed to the FBI SIOC and accessible to partners. The VCC consolidates investigative and intelligence information.
- ATF has expanded its Internet Investigations Center (IIC) to 24/7 operations with a focus on developing information relative to illegal activity associated with the civil unrest, particularly in the DC region.
- ATF's IIC and 25 Crime Gun Intelligence Centers are consolidating intelligence information and providing to the FBI SIOC Center on a continual basis.
- ATF has staffed the Attorney General's D.C. Operations Center and FBI National SIOC with SES

personnel who are authorized to secure and deploy additional resources as necessary.



At least (b)(3) per ATF firearms have been stolen in these thefts. ○ ATF has sent more than (b)(7)(E) per ATF alerts to FFLs in areas impacted by civil unrest. Additionally, ATF Industry Operations Investigators (IOIs) have proactively reached out by telephone to FFLs in impacted areas to reinforce best practices and measures to secure firearms from theft. ATF's proactive measures and resulting steps taken by FFLs to secure firearms have proven highly successful; no firearms have been successfully stolen in several of the FFL burglaries to which ATF has responded. ○ ATF is investigating the origin and cause or is providing investigative support to state and local law enforcement and fire service organizations at approximately 847 suspected incendiary fires in 37 cities. ATF has the only federally trained and certified fire investigators in the U.S. Government. ○ ATF has responded to at least (b)(7)(E) per ATF incidents involving the illegal use of explosives associated with the unrest; the majority of these incidents involved the use of explosive materials to gain entry to ATM machines during thefts. ○ ATF has responded to assist in the investigation of numerous shooting scenes at disturbances in dozens of cities; assistance has included conducting urgent firearm traces and collection and processing of shell casings and ballistic evidence for DNA analysis and entry into NIBIN. ○ Shooting investigations that ATF has assisted in include the May 29th shooting of two Federal Protective Service officers at the Ronald V. Dellums Federal Building (Oakland, California), in which one officer was killed and another seriously wounded. ATF's role included processing of all ballistic evidence for DNA and National Integrated Ballistic Information Network analyses.

SUBJECT: Attorney General’s Civil Unrest Daily Briefing for June 7, 2020, as of 7:10 a.m.

I. Overview

- **Nationwide “Black Out Saturday.”** Protests in D.C. Saturday were peaceful, with no reported clashes with police. The Washington Post estimates 10,000 people showed up. There were fewer police and National Guard than in previous days. The tan tankers were gone. Some reportedly embraced a party atmosphere while others were upset about the less somber tone. By midnight there were only a few hundred people still standing around Black Lives Matter Plaza near the White House. (News Reporting)
- **George Floyd Funeral. (Houston):** Previous reports indicated there would be a small private service for Mr. Floyd at the Ft. Bend Memorial Planning Center in Houston on Monday, June 8, followed by another service at Fountain of Praise Church in Houston. Mr. Floyd’s funeral is reportedly scheduled at the Houston Memorial Gardens in Pearland on Tuesday, June 9. (USAO ATAC Notification, 3 JUN 1134 & 1813, SIOC SITREP, 3 JUN 2000)
 - Note: [very sensitive information] Former VP Biden will arrive in Texas on Monday at 0900 and attend a private meeting with the family then depart the same afternoon and is not planning attending any of the public events at this time. (USAO Activity Report. 6 JUN 1817)
- **Viral Protestor Videos.** Potential flashpoints that we are seeing more and more individual police-protestor interactions captured on video, which then goes viral, sparking new civil unrest that is quickly organized around that new incident.

Gutzwiller was killed; a second deputy was shot and/or hit with shrapnel from the explosions, and is currently hospitalized. A third law enforcement officer (California Highway Patrol) may have been shot in the hand. (As of 6/7/20 at 0311)
 - ***Las Vegas, NV.*** On Monday, June 1, Officer Shay Mikalonis of the Las Vegas Police Department was shot in the head on the Las Vegas strip while attempting to disperse a group of protestors near a high profile casino. Officer Mikalonis remains in critical condition; the assailant has been arrested and held without bail. (Police Injury Report June 6 1100)
 - ***Oakland, CA.*** On Friday, May 29, a contract officer with the Federal Protective Service in the Department of Homeland Security was shot alongside Officer Patrick Underwood (see below), while guarding the Ronald Dellums Federal Building in Oakland. The contract officer remains in critical condition. (Police Injury Report June 4 0800)
 - ***New York City.*** At approximately 2345 on 3 June, three NYPD officers were hospitalized after an unprovoked knife attack by a suspect in Brooklyn. All are expected to survive. The suspect was shot and taken to the hospital in serious condition. (1500 CTS Intel Summary June 4)

I. USA District Highlights (selected)

- **Santa Cruz, California:** (As of 6/7/20 at 0311) On June 6 at about 1:30 p.m., the Santa Cruz County Sheriff’s Office responded to a call about a van containing weapons and bomb-making materials in Ben Lomond, CA. Deputies located this van at a local residence, where they were ambushed with gunfire and multiple IED explosions. Sgt. Damon Gutzwiller was killed during this initial ambush. A second

deputy was shot and/or hit with shrapnel from the explosions, and is currently hospitalized. A third law enforcement officer (California Highway Patrol) may have been shot in the hand. The suspect identified as Steven Carrillo fled. Carrillo is the only confirmed suspect at this time. At some point, Carrillo carjacked a vehicle and attempted to carjack another vehicle during his flight. Also during his flight, Carrillo exchanged gunfire with law enforcement. Carrillo also may have attempted to deploy a pipe bomb and shoot a civilian who tried to restrain him. When Carrillo was ultimately arrested, he had been shot by law enforcement, and survived. Carrillo made anti-law enforcement statements. The Santa Cruz County Sheriff's Office has announced that Carrillo will be booked for the murder of Sgt. Gutzwiller.

- **Note:** (As of 6/7/20 at 03:51) Although a direct connection to the civil unrest has not been confirmed, local federal authorities are currently treating the murder as connected due to the incident's timing, proximity to the officer's death in Oakland, and the suspect's anti-law enforcement statements.
- ***Western District of Pennsylvania*** (As of 6/7/20 at 0145): Self-identified "FAR LEFT" member (Brian Jordan Bartles) goes to March on downtown Pittsburg. Things were relatively calm until Bartles provides the catalyst for violence (walks to police cruiser, opens backpack and uses spray paint on cruiser, throws object at vehicle and breaks window, jumps on vehicle and breaks windshield, and then riot ensues. This one act then created massive property damage. Bartles went to the protest with backpack with rocks and spray paint. Charged with 18 U.S.C. 231 (Obstruction of Law Enforcement During Civil Disorder).
- ***District of Oregon*** (As of 6/6/20 at 1949): Dire circumstances in Portland and Hatfield Courthouse which was badly "tagged" before was the subject of gunshot on the evening of June 5/6th. USA is appalled and fencing company can't come and even put fence up because of death threats; FPS is overwhelmed and not enough resources exist to secure courthouse. (Governor refuses to call up guard despite this literally assault on the rule of law.) We, DOJ, worked all the logistics of getting additional resources out to Portland. Largely unfair because this is National Guard Work. We should, however, be proud that AG had vision to setup SIOC model serving as nationwide resource center for USAs.
- ***District of Colorado*** (As of 6/6/20 at 1934): Federal District Court granted TRO enjoining Denver PD from using less-lethal and chemical agents without Captain level approval (Captain must be on the ground and personally witness acts of violence or destruction of property) before can deploy. Second, only officers with body worn cameras (BWC) can be deployed with demonstrations. This is a fine policy, but since National Guard and Park Rangers don't have that equipment and likely can't get it in real time, this requirement and the above will absolutely hinder efforts at crowd control).

SUBJECT: Attorney General's Civil Unrest Daily Briefing for June 6, 2020, as of 1400

I. Overview

- ***George Floyd Funeral. (North Carolina):*** There will be a memorial service for Mr. Floyd today at the Cape Fear Conference B Headquarters in Raeford open to the public from 1100-1300 followed by a private family serve. The remains will then be flown from Fayetteville to Houston on Saturday night, June 6. Previous reports indicated there would be a small private service at the Ft. Bend Memorial Planning Center in Houston on Monday, June 8, followed by another service at Fountain of Praise Church in Houston. Mr. Floyd's funeral is reportedly scheduled at the Houston Memorial Gardens in Pearland on Tuesday, June 9. (USAO ATAC Notification, 3 JUN 1134 & 1813, SIOC SITREP, 3 JUN 2000)
 - Note: There is a tropical storm forecasted in the Gulf between June 7 and 9, which could impact activities in Texas. (USAO ATAC Notification, 3 JUN 1134 & 1813, SIOC SITREP, 3 JUN 2000)
- ***Nationwide "Black Out Saturday."*** Multiple sources are reporting a planned nationwide "Blackout Saturday" protest today in Washington DC and other locations. Some reporting highlighted extremely large numbers of possible attendees in Washington DC, as high as one million. The DC Chief of police remarked in a press conference that it could be, "one of the largest that we've had in the city." (Multiple Sources)
- ***Viral Protestor Videos.*** Potential flashpoints that we are seeing more and more individual police-protestor interactions captured on video, which then goes viral, sparking new civil unrest that is quickly organized around that new incident.

- **Minnesota.** Corroborated information indicates anonymous-affiliated cyber actors conducted DDoS attacks against two Minnesota banks, the City of Minneapolis experienced an electronic ‘mailbombing’ attack by unknown actors and a DDoS attack was unsuccessful against a Minnesota state network. (CETC SITREP, 4 JUN 1700). Over the past 48 hours there have been an increase in reports of vehicles fleeing law enforcement officers. Some of these vehicles have rammed squad cars or attempted to ram squad cars. Other vehicles have come close to officers on foot. This appears to be an emerging trend. In one instance the vehicle attempting to ram squad cars had stolen license plates. (USAO Activity Report June 5 0800)

G. Potential Catalysts

- **Chauvin et al. Case Developments.**
 - On June 3, charges for second-degree murder were added for Chauvin. The other three officers were charged with aiding and abetting second-degree murder as well as aiding and abetting second-degree manslaughter. (June 3 SITREP 2100)
 - Minnesota defines second-degree murder, in relevant part, as “caus[ing] the death of a human being, without intent to effect the death of any person, while committing or attempting to commit a felony offense other than criminal sexual conduct in the first or second degree with force or violence or a drive-by shooting.” (combined briefing memo June 4)
 - On Thursday June 4, a judge set bail for the three officers charged in George Floyd’s death at \$1 million each. (CNN June 4 2340)

LAW ENFORCEMENT SENSITIVE

- **Million Man March (aka Blackout Saturday).** Over one million people expected to protest in DC. Saturday, June 6 (intel from USPP and MPD). They plan to gather at the White House at 12pm.
- **Ahmaud Arbery Case Update.** During a June 4 hearing, the investigator testified that Arbery, who was shot and killed in Glynn County, GA on February 23, was hit with a truck before he died, and his killer allegedly used a racial slur. The judge ruled all three defendants Travis McMichael; his father, Gregory McMichael; and William “Roddie” Bryan would stand trial on all charges. (CNN)
- **Confederate Monuments and Symbols.** Flashpoints for protests in Birmingham, Richmond, Philadelphia, and in Mississippi. The mayors of Birmingham and Philadelphia had the monuments removed on June 2 and 3. Additionally the Governor of Virginia announced the removal of the Gen. Robert E. Lee statue in Richmond. (Combined briefing memo June 4)
- **New York.** On June 4, a 75 year old man was injured by Buffalo Police in a protest related encounter outside city hall. Police shoved the older man causing him to fall and injure his head. The event was captured on video and posted to social media and viewed 29 million times. (FBI SIOC SITREP, 5 JUN 1200)
- **California.** A looter in Vallejo CA was shot and killed while on his knees after officers believed he had a handgun. It turned out to be a hammer tucked into his waistband. (USAO Activity Report, 4 JUN 0344)

- **Denver, Colorado:** A federal judge in Denver granted a temporary restraining order late Friday (June 5) evening prohibiting the use of “chemical weapons or projectiles of any kind against persons engaging in peaceful protests or demonstrations.” The TRO applies to the Denver Police Department and those assisting the Department. The ruling came after four Denver residents who participated in demonstrations following the death of George Floyd, filed a complaint Thursday challenging the Denver Police Department’s use of chemical agents and rubber projectiles during protests. (USAO Activity Report 6/6 1200hrs)
