



Statutes Found to Qualify Under Exemption 3 of the FOIA

Exemption 3 of the Freedom of Information Act incorporates certain nondisclosure provisions contained in federal statutes other than the FOIA. To assist agencies in properly processing FOIA requests and in preparing their Annual FOIA Reports, the Office of Information Policy has compiled a list of statutes currently in effect that courts have found to qualify as Exemption 3 statutes. This chart does not include statutes that have been found not to qualify under Exemption 3, nor does it include any statute which has not yet been considered by a court as a possible Exemption 3 statute. In addition, on occasion, a statutory provision has been found to qualify under Exemption 3 by one court and found not to qualify by another. Those statutes are marked with asterisks. Generally, to determine which cases are listed, if there is a Supreme Court case that determines a statute qualifies as an Exemption 3 statute, that will be the only case listed. If there is no Supreme Court case, but circuit court cases exist, the circuit court cases will be listed. If there is no circuit court case for a particular circuit, multiple district court cases from within that same circuit may be listed.
