## Meeting topics:

Nokia has been supporting the U.S. government's diplomatic efforts on trusted wireless equipment suppliers for more than two years. As the U.S. searches for concrete proposals to support Western suppliers as alternatives to Chinese suppliers, a wide range of potential options have been advanced, but none address the "on the ground" (b) (4)

Nokia was a key presenter at an October bilateral meeting between the U.S. and Australian governments that was led by AG Barr. During that meeting financing support from Western governments for Western suppliers was advanced as an option. (b) (4). We have shared these findings with various government officials and begun extensive discussions with the ExIm bank and Development Finance Corporation and State Department. Deals are being moved for consideration. We have also begun to reevaluate our U.S. presence with an eye toward increasing a variety of activities done in the U.S. including building upon our extensive R&D presence. We believe there are several actions the U.S. can take that would facilitate decisions in that regard and strengthen the existing suppliers and the U.S. vis-à-vis the Chinese. Specifically, we would propose to:

- Update the AG and staff on the state of the market globally with timelines for deal decisions;
- Outline how the ExIm and DFC programs can aid Western suppliers in winning a substantial portion of upcoming deals;
- Discuss proposals we anticipate bringing to the White House and Congress that:
  - Provide R&D support for Western suppliers in 5G;
  - Begin providing support for 6G foundational research to prevent China and its current subsidy regime from establishing a lead;
  - Initiating R&D support for open networks (ORAN) for longer-term ecosystem development
- Provide a current summary of our financial position to inform what have been inaccurate statements (not by DoJ) regarding our viability and strategy.
- Answer questions for the AG and his national security and policy staff.

**I. PURPOSE**

You will provide brief remarks and take individual photos with 26 U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) employees who received The Attorney General's Distinguished Service Award for their work in support of the nomination of Brett M. Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court of the United States. You will also take individual photos with 10 DOJ employees who were also involved in the project. During the award presentation and/or photo, you will be assisted by the respective employee's Head of Component or U.S. Attorney in attendance. Heads of Component and U.S. Attorneys do not have a speaking role. Please see the attached list of award/photo recipients and Heads of Component/U.S. Attorneys in attendance.

**II. BACKGROUND**

The U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) recognizes employees who have demonstrated exceptional achievements, leadership, and heroism on an annual basis. Approximately 859 individuals were nominated for the annual awards program this year. Of those nominees, 294 DOJ employees were selected to receive special recognition in 29 separate award categories. Sixty-two individuals from outside the Department were also selected for recognition.

The Kavanaugh Distinguished Service Team is recognized for its exceptional work in support of the effort to appoint then-Judge Brett M. Kavanaugh to the Supreme Court of the United States. Each member of the team demonstrated exemplary leadership, organization, coordination, and professionalism. Together, the team filed a Senate Judiciary Questionnaire that was over 100 pages, produced over 440,000 pages to the Senate, and responded to over 1,200 questions for the record submitted by the Senate in just three days. The nominees completed an unprecedented amount of work under demanding, extraordinary, and unprecedented circumstances, maintaining the highest standards of excellence, commitment, and civility. The team exemplified the fundamental principles of dedication and service that are the hallmark of the U.S. Department of Justice.
