Warden asked her where she wanted to go. She said warden should pick. Warden didn't want to be accused of directing this so he told her to just pick a couple floors. She said ok 4 and 7.

They went to 7 and temps were between 74-77. All cells were occupied so they opened a cell and the inmate was in boxers and a t shirt. Staffer asked inmate if he was cold and he said no.

On floor 4 temps were 73-74. Staffer didn't want to open a cell.

At the end the staffer said she had no concerns. Warden asked if they were going to post a statement saying heat is working and she didn't know but she was going to report back.

It also should be noted, the article below was updated and now quotes a visitor saying it was freezing inside and she didn't know how anyone could survive in this situation. The warden verified the "visitor" named in this article does not exist on any visiting list at MDC Brooklyn. Thus, it too appears to be a false statement that the media is reporting.

Dear Inspector General Horowitz:

We are writing to express concerns over recent events at the Bureau of Prisons' (BOP) Metropolitan Detention Center (MDC) in Brooklyn, NY. This past weekend, it was reported that over 1,600 detainees and employees at the correctional facility remained in a building that had serious heating and electrical issues for nearly a week during polar vortex conditions.<sup>1</sup> The grave nature of these circumstances were muddled until press coverage revealed the extent of the MDC's problems.

We believe there are ample grounds for your office to review the conditions at Brooklyn MDC. It is still unclear why the facility had prolonged issues with heating and electricity. It is understood that the facility kept detainees on lockdown without appropriate access to medical services. Further, attorneys and paralegal staff reported that detainees lacked access to extra blankets and could not purchase extra sweatshirts at the commissary during the height of this crisis. All the while, it is alleged that management at MDC did not activate and follow their emergency plan.

The lackluster response from the facility's leadership cannot be categorized as anything less than inappropriate given the circumstances. Instead of offering proactive solutions and executing its emergency plan, MDC Brooklyn failed in its duties until public pressure and demands for answers reached a tipping point. Leadership at BOP facilities must be consistent with our values, and ensure that detainees have access to humane shelter conditions. The arguably abusive practices arising out of this incident, including the fact that detainees were kept on lockdown in near-freezing conditions, is unacceptable.

Given the above, we request:

- the Evaluation and Inspections Division review the Management practices at this facility such review should also examine whether the MDC fully followed its emergency plans. Such inquiry, in addition, examine the chain of command at the facility, including the respective decision-making authority that is in cases when the warden is not physically present at the facility;
- a review of medical care given to detainees during this period, including the lack of electricity for CPAP machines and the exacerbation of conditions such as asthma by the cold conditions; and
- a review of the extended denial of access to counsel for detainees by MDC, leaving detainees unable to address their cases or assert their rights about these conditions during this time period;
- an audit of whether contractors at MDC fulfilled their duties related to repairing or replacing heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC), electrical, or similar infrastructure on or about the week of January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019. Such audit should also examine whether contractor malfeasance was a contributing factor leading to the loss of heat and electricity on or about the week of January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

As Members of Congress, it is our responsibility to ensure that detainees are treated fairly and afforded humane living conditions while in federal custody. Given the severity of these circumstances, we request a formal response from your office no later than ten (10) calendar days from the date of this correspondence.

The BOP will also conduct a thorough investigation of the infrastructure at the facility and review the emergency response and contingency planning for this type of incident. DOJ and BOP will continue to work to ensure that MDC Brooklyn meets all required standards.

MDC Brooklyn is an Administrative security level facility that currently houses 1,654 male and female offenders in New York, New York.

# Dear Richard:

Thank you. It may be prudent to have someone from your civil division, perhaps the civil rights unit, at the meeting as well since any possible resulting litigation will likely be handled by the civil division of your office. We would welcome anyone you so designate.

Deirdre provided a summary report of her observations by email to me last

night. I have to say that I and the few judges with whom I have shared it

thus far are appalled and distressed at the inhumane way in which the inmates are being treated.

The situation is exploding on twitter and other media. I understand that a

rally was scheduled for 1:00 pm today. It is beyond my understanding why

Nydia Velasquez was not allowed to accompany Deirdre and your investigator

as they toured the facility. The excuse given was that Deirdre and your investigator were touring the facility pursuant to court order.

It is apparent that we are not getting full and accurate information from the MDC and that the administrators are obstructing efforts at obtaining such information. The Warden's response that electricity should be restored by Monday also is unresponsive to the other issues such as why no

additional blankets were distributed, leaks in the roof that has water seeping into the cells, the damage caused by the electrical fire last weekend that left computer and phone service out of order, the failure to

dispense medication to inmates, and the lack of visitation by family and attorneys.

Have you had any discussions with your SDNY counterpart, Mr. Berman? SDNY

is dealing with this issue as well since they have inmates housed at MDC just as we have inmates housed at MCC. Hearings are scheduled in SDNY and

EDNY for early next week. Perhaps a joint call by the two of you to DOJ in

DC would send a powerful message about the dire situation being faced here.

It may go a long way in avoiding a tragedy and/or future litigation.

I appreciate that your assistants have been doing what they can to obtain

information as directed by judges on individual cases, but that approach

simply is insufficient to address the problem at hand.

# MEMORANDUM

To: Chief Judge Dora L. Irizarry

Re: Visit to West Building Housing Units, February 1, 2019
Date: February 2, 2019

Pursuant to Chief Judge Irizarry's Order, I was in the West Building of the MDC from approximately 4:15 until 8:00 p.m. on February 1, 2019. The COs at the front desk screened me as soon as I presented the Order.

When I first entered the West Building, I immediately felt the cold. The COs at the lobby desk were wearing multiple layers including scarves wrapped around their heads. The lighting was dim.

While I waited for John Ross (Senior Investigator from the U.S. Attorney's Office, EDNY) to arrive, one CO came downstairs and the CO at the front desk asked her if the inmates were getting meals. The CO from downstairs said "we are going to let them out one at a time to get their meal, and otherwise lock their asses in."

Congresswoman Nydia Velasquez arrived shortly after I did. She asked that we be able to walk around together, but Nicole McFarland from Legal refused, and said that the Court Order said that I was to inspect with the representative from the US Attorney's Office and she would not permit Investigator Ross and I to be with the Congresswoman.

Investigator Ross and I were admitted at 4:30, and escorted throughout our visit by AW King, Legal Attorney Nicole McFarland, and Legal Attorney Holly Pratesi. I asked to focus our visit on the housing units in SHU, 8<sup>th</sup> floor, 7<sup>th</sup> floor and 6<sup>th</sup> floor because inmates throughout the week who had used legal phones and come to court had reported worse conditions on those floors, with better access to heat and hot water on the 5<sup>th</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> floor housing units.

# **Observations common to all units:**

Pitch black in cells. Too dark to see medication labels or food given to eat.

No ability to make medical requests through the computer system.

Not able to obtain medication refills because the medical computer system is down. (Pill line still coming around, so those inmates who do not need new medical care or do not need a refill are receiving their medications.)

No family calls since Sunday, January 27, 2019.

No access to corrlinks since Sunday January 27, 2019.

No legal visits since Sunday, January 27, 2019.

Cannot review discovery because too dark in cells and computers not working.

No access provided to law library.

No clean clothes or sheets since Sunday, January 27, 2019. (Including no clean underwear)

Commissary closed since Friday, January 25, 2019, so cannot purchase additional clothing or food or stamps. Inmates who had not previously purchased additional clothes from commissary were wearing only short-sleeved shirt and light cotton pants. Inmates without stamps cannot write to their families.

Repeatedly required to eat meals in total darkness without being able to see their food.

No extra blankets or clothing provided.

# **Specific Housing Units:**

Heat and access to hot water for showering varied from unit to unit, as did amount of time of lockdowns since the fire.

# SHU (9<sup>th</sup> Floor)

Escorted by SHU Lt. Ramos, who seemed caring and concerned. He explained that the main power conductor for the building had burned down on Sunday evening. The inmates on this unit were largely calm and primarily worried by the dark and not being able to leave their cells for rec.

The cells are pitch black inside. Emergency lighting in hallways. Inmates do not have flashlights or any other way to see in their cells.

Lt. Ramos confirmed the following: No one in SHU has been out of their cells at all (except a couple of medical cases) since Sunday. Ordinarily have one hour of recreation outside of cell each per day, but not this week. No family calls. No legal access. No extra blankets. No laundry. Ordinarily heat food on the units, but the food heater has no power, so now the food comes up from the kitchen and loses heat rapidly, but they try to serve it as fast as they can. Most SHU cells have two inmates, which presents safety concerns without lights, so the COs are trying to walk the unit more regularly. Even the SHU medical room has no lighting. Laundry delivered to the unit February 1, 2019 (for first time in a week). Lt. hopes to distribute clean underwear, socks, etc. this weekend.

The east side of the SHU (facing away from the water) was relatively warm. The west side (Range 4) was significantly colder. Inmates on that side appeared to be wrapped in blankets and towels. (Inmates on the other side were dressed normally).

A couple of SHU inmates told me that the ceiling in their cells was leaking and water from the last rain/snow wetting their beds. This, in combination with the cold, and no laundry for a week is very difficult, they said. I asked the Lt if anything could be done about water coming down onto people's beds in the freezing cold, and he said (with sympathy) no, that the roof has significant leaks that have not been fixed. The SHU inmates were receiving a hot meal when I was there.

We were permitted in an empty cell on the east side and the temperature felt okay, perhaps in the 60s.

We tested the shower water in an empty cell, and it went up to tepid after a few minutes.

Inmates repeatedly reported they were cold, needed clean underwear at the least, and felt awful from being in total darkness.

Notes on specific inmates I was able to speak to:

Inmate i (b)(6) reported that ceiling is leaking over his bed (top bunk) and his sheets are wet, and now getting frozen. He has no other place to sleep (floor is cold concrete; he has a cellmate in the other bunk). Lt. confirms that several cells have leaking ceilings that have not been repaired.

#### (b)(6)

Has Sickle Cell anemia and has not received medical care. Is on SHU until can receive medical attention (not in SHU for disciplinary issues). Is cold and scared.

## (b)(6)

Wrapped in towels and blankets. Having trouble breathing.

#### (b)(6)

Feels his mental health degrading from sitting in cell in dark for a week

## (b)(6)

He has hot water in his shower.

## (b)(6)

Please contact my lawyer.

# **Eighth Floor Housing Units**

Everyone locked in. AW informs us this is only because of the count. We were only able to speak to the orderlies, because the count actively occurring at this time. Temperature fine in common areas. Emergency lighting in common areas. Pitch black in cells. We were not able to go into a cell.

AW informed us the inmates have had hot meals every day. The orderlies said today was the first day of hot food, previously it was cold food for every meal since the fire. They then looked at the AW and asked "are we going to get in trouble for saying that?"

# K81 (cadre unit. 21 inmates)

Everyone locked in except the two orderlies. Temperature in common room fine. **K82 (cadre unit. 78 inmates)** 

Everyone locked in. Temperature in common room fine.

# K84 (21 pre-trial inmates)

Everyone locked in. Temperature in common room fine.

# K83 (59 pre-trial inmates)

Everyone locked in. Temperature in common room fine.

# Seventh floor

Everyone was still locked in, even though the count was over, which the Assistant Warden now explained was because the elevators had been down this morning. It was again significantly colder on the unit facing the water. The inmates in the western facing unit were wrapped head to toe in blankets and towels. I spoke to many inmates through their cell doors. They said they had been locked in all day. No shower since Wednesday, and then only scant hot water. Cold food until today and they have to eat in their pitch black cells. Numerous inmates described asking for and not receiving medical care. Inmates who have run out of medication cannot receive refills, they are being told, until the computers come back up. One inmate who takes ten medications said he has his pills but can't see which is which. Inmates with asthma repeatedly reported trouble breathing in the cold. Several inmates taking medicine for bipolar disorder don't have their medication.

All were very upset about the lack of information as to when they will be able to speak to their families or lawyers.

The other side of the building was warmer. One unit on the 7th floor was let out just as we walked in. Many people wanted to speak to me, often on behalf of other inmates they were worried about for health reasons, including a young man with Crohn's Disease who looked emaciated, and a federal defender client whom I know about because he has repeatedly swallowed razor blades - he has not had psych medication for four days. An inmate with a gunshot wound to his hand showed me pus-filled bandages that have not been changed for two weeks.

# J71

Count has ended but everyone is still locked in. AW says this is because elevators were out in the building earlier in the day, with only one elevator working. Inmates are angry and pounding on their cell doors and pressing their emergency buttons. Inmates tell us that they have been locked in all day with no explanation. Pitch black in cells.

AW says hot food every day. Inmates (including orderlies serving food) say today (February 1) is first day with hot food since the fire. They were previously let out to the common area, as usual, to eat their meals, but today have been forced to eat their meals in their cells in the dark.

Same clothes all week because no laundry.

Inmates say hot water in showers for only a few minutes and they all have to share those minutes. Investigator Ross and I test water and after a few minutes, it is fairly hot.

#### (b)(6)

Tap water from the pipes seems polluted and to have particles in it.

#### (b)(6)

Feels like he is in solitary, locked in the dark, with no ability to talk to anyone.

## (b)(6)

Water very dirty. He and his cellmate experiencing constant diarrhea since Monday. Both are visibly (through cell window) wrapped in blankets and towels head to toe.

# **J72** (111 inmates)

All still locked in, despite count being over for some time. Two inmates being let out at a time to get their meals and then return to their dark cells and be locked in to eat.

We tested the shower water, which was relatively warm. Common room temperature was fine.

AW says other than today they have been out and about as regular since the fire. Every inmate (English and Spanish speakers, even an inmate I spoke to in French) contradicts this and says they have been let out of their cells in the days since the fire for a couple hours in the morning and a couple hours in the afternoon, but otherwise locked in.

Inmates on this unit report variable temperatures. On one side, their cells are very hot. No ventilation at all. On other side of the unit, feel cold wind coming out from the cracks of the cells.

## (b)(6)

Severe asthma. When at home, uses oxygen mask, particularly at night. Given inhaler here, but gasping for breath. Yesterday pressed emergency button and told CO his chest was hurting and he felt like he was suffocating. CO closed door and did not return. (b)(6) cell mate expressed concern for him and said that he hears him gasp all night.

# (b)(6)

Older man with congestive heart failure, allowed to have cell door open to speak to us. Explained he was blinded by a handball while at MDC and has hemorrhaging in his eye. Was taken to hospital 10 days after the incident, despite asking for medical care immediately, and doctors said he needed surgery or would go blind in that eye. No surgery has been provided. His eye is burning. Can't put in additional medical copouts because the computers are down.

## (b)(6)

Congestive heart failure, kidney failure, prescribed 10 medications but can't see which is which in the dark and is afraid to take wrong one / wrong quantity. Went to Kingsbrook when had heart attack but now needs follow up care.

# J73

Inmates on this unit reported more significant lockdowns. They also had been locked in all day Friday, but also were locked down on Thursday, January 31, other than to eat meals and shower.

I could feel cold air from their cells blowing out the cracks and into the warmer air of the common room.

## (b)(6)

Recently had surgery on his leg, which did not go well. He has had no follow up. He is still bleeding and needs medication.

Feeling desperate to talk to his family. Please cal (b)(6)

#### (b)(6)

Needs a refill for his medication asap

# **Sixth Floor**

Inmates had been calling our office frantically on Thursday afternoon about the cold but we had heard no word from them all day Friday. All were locked in and they said they had been since yesterday afternoon. West side of building again much colder. I could feel cold wind through the cracks in the doors and inmates were covered head to toe with blankets and towels. These units had a panicky feeling. Many inmates reported untreated colds and flu. One man showed us his infected open leg wound through the cell window and told us his colitis is so bad that he woke up bloody - and no fresh sheets are available. He shoved his medical records through the door crack and the USAO Investigator and I saw that indeed he has colitis and an infected wound and seizure disorder. No clean underwear or socks for a week. Mostly cold food. Several inmates have sentencing next week and haven't been able to speak to their lawyers. No extra blankets provided (the AW agreed with this but said she would check the heat when I pointed out the cold gusts from their cells). Many inmates noted they are pre-trial and yet being treated like they are in SHU. They were very upset to not even be allowed into the common areas that have the emergency lights. Several inmates showed me cups with brown or cloudy water from the tap and said it is not drinkable.

Acrid smell on the floor, particularly the upper tier.

The following inmates were on the sixth floor, but I did not note their units.

# (b)(6)

(b)(6) showed us his swollen leg that had an open, and visibly infected wound and described waking up that morning in a small pool of blood on his sheets from his colitis. (He also noted that because they are locked in and have no access to clean sheets, he will sleep on the bloody sheets.). (b)(6) put his medical records from Brooklyn Hospital through the crack in the door. The records indicated a wound that will not heal and requires antibiotic treatment daily, ulcerative colitis and seizure disorder. (b)(6) indicated that since returning from the hospital he has not received antibiotic cream and the wound has worsened. He has been told by the COs to wash it with soap and water. There is no longer soap available on his unit because commissary is closed and the soap has run out.

# (b)(6)

(b)(6) and designated but has not been transferred. Fell off top bunk earlier in the week and badly hurt his foot. It is swollen and bruised. He has asked for medical attention but not received it.

#### (b)(6)

So cold in his cell that water in drinking cup is freezing over. Acrid smell in his cell from the vents, and he is waking up with headaches. Wearing 7-8 layers of clothing.

Spoke to an inmate whose name I could not hear who said he has (b)(6) up befor (b)(6) and has not been able to speak to his lawyer and has not received th (b)(6).

# Unit 61

Inmates are out of their cells and receiving meals. They report having been locked down all day until we arrived. Numerous inmates complain of getting colds and flu from the cold cells and lack of hot shower water. Some inmates are dressed only in short sleeved shirts and say they did not have money to purchase warm clothes in commissary before the fire. They have run out of soap and toothpaste and commissary is closed.

## (b)(6)

Serious psychiatric history of suicide attempts. Has not received his psych meds. Needs his asthma pump. Freezing cold in cell.

## (b)(6)

Shows me severely swollen gums. Has asked for medical attention but has not received.

(b)(6)

Looks emaciated and eye sockets are hollow. Explains he has Crohn's disease. Has lost significant amount of weight since Sunday.

#### (b)(6)

Shows us bandaged hand, where was shot. Bandages not changed for two weeks. Suffers from glaucoma. Eyes swollen and red, and appear to be bulging. He says he is worried about eye pressure.

# (b)(6)

Had a seizure yesterday, pressed the emergency button. No one ever came. (history of seizures documented. Has medication but it does not always prevent the seizures).

# (b)(6)

Finger numb, needs x-ray. Was in court today and AUSA reported conditions to judge that were not accurate.

# Unit 63

Significantly colder on this unit. Cold air actively blowing out of the vents in the cells, including one we are allowed to enter.

# (b)(6)

Has not received his psych meds. Suffering dental pain.

# Unit 62

Locked in continuously since noon on Thursday. (AW says not true, they were out yesterday afternoon, but inmates of various languages and all sides of the unit confirm this lockdown. When I ask AW why our office received no legal calls at all from this unit since Thursday afternoon, she did not have a response.)

# (b)(6)

(b)(6) was wearing three sets of thermals (top and bottom), two pairs of socks and a sweatshirt and sweatpants. He reported that when they were on lockdown, he was let out of his cell to go see the psychiatrist. On the way back, he stopped at the phone that calls to the Federal Defenders Office to let us know that his unit was on full lockdown all day. When the officers saw him on the telephone, they directed him to hang up. A full team of officers then went to his cell and searched it, throwing his legal mail on the floor. (b)(6) also showed us through the cell door a cup of water he had just filled from the sink tap in his cell. It appeared brown. He asked for clean water in order to take his psychiatric medications.

#### (b)(6)

For several weeks, his toilet has been overflowing and will not flush. He had repeatedly requested it be fixed prior to the power issues, and it was not. # No Heat for Days at a Jail in Brooklyn Where Hundreds of Inmates Are Sick and 'Frantic'

More than a thousand inmates at a federal jail in Brooklyn are said to have had limited heat and power for at least this week, when the temperature plummeted to 2 degrees in New York.Stephen Speranza for The New York Times

More than a thousand inmates have been stuck in freezing cells at a federal jail on the Brooklyn waterfront that has had limited power and heat for at least this week, according to federal public defenders and leaders of the union representing the jail's corrections officers.

"They just stay huddled up in the bed," said June Bencebi, a case manager at the jail and the treasurer of the local chapter of the American Federation of Government Employees, which represents about DOV corrections officers at the Jan.

The jail, the Metropolitan Detention Center, houses more than 1,600 inmates and lies in an industrial swath near the waterfront in Sunset Park, Brooklyn. Some inmates are linked to high-profile drug trafficking and terrorism cases, while others are comparatively anonymous New Yorkers awaiting trial.

The accounts of conditions at the jail were described to The New York Times by six lawyers and paralegals with local Federal Defenders offices, who had spoken with around three dozen inmates at M.D.C.; two union leaders; and an employee at the jail who was not authorized to speak publicly.

A spokeswoman for Herman Quay, the jail's warden, said in an email that the building experienced a partial power outage on Saturday but denied that it had affected heat and hot water in the jail's housing units.

In an emailed statement, the federal Bureau of Prisons confirmed that the jail was "experiencing a partial power outage" and operating on emergency power. "Cells have heat and hot water, there is lighting in the common areas and inmates are receiving hot meals," the agency said.

The Bureau of Prisons indicated that the electrical failure was related to Con Edison, which it said had been "dealing with numerous power emergencies in the community."

A spokesman for the utility, Robert McGee, disputed the characterization and said Con Edison had not had problems in New York during the cold spell. "It's an internal problem, and their electricians will have to fix it," Mr. McGee said. "End of story."

Union leaders and defense lawyers also rebutted the account of the jail's warden and the Bureau of Prisons.

Federal defenders said they were flooded with calls from inmates this week as temperatures began to drop. "Our phone was ringing off the hook," said the lead federal defender in Brooklyn, Deirdre von Dornum. She said inmates, using a dedicated line that connects the jail to federal defenders offices, had gathered around the telephones on their floors to report poor heating, little to no hot water and no lights in their cells.

On Thursday, Rachel Bass, a paralegal at the Brooklyn office of the federal defenders, said that she had fielded calls from about 15 inmates. "In the past hour I have gotten 11 calls," she said. "People are frantic. They're really, really scared. They don't have extra blankets. They don't have access to the commissary to buy an extra sweatshirt."

She said many inmates complained of congestion and sore throats.

The president of the local chapter of the union, Anthony Sanon, said the problems began around Jan. 5 when the jail first lost power. The heating issues began last week, leaving inmates and staff to face freezing weather for the first time. "We didn't have heat in the building, we didn't have light," Mr. Sanon said. "The weather was actually unbearable."

The heat and power issues were unrelated, according to union leaders who spoke to facilities workers. The heating issues began when units that draw water up from the boilers froze. The workers said that the heat was on, but several units had been disabled.

The electrical problems originated in an electrical panel that blew out last month, the union leaders said. Although the panel was initially repaired, it caught fire on Sunday.

The jail switched over to emergency newer leaving the corridors

lit only by dim lights, the cells dark and inmates confined to poorly heated cells during the coldest days of the winter so far. This week, the temperature plummeted to 2 degrees in New York City, as frigid weather swept over the Midwest and Northeast.

"The heat isn't coming out properly," Mr. Sanon said.

One inmate told a federal defender that a corrections officer had taken the temperature in a housing unit, which was warmer than the cells, and it was 34 degrees.

New York City's Fire Department confirmed that it responded to a small electrical fire in the jail's control room on Sunday.

But the warden's spokesperson, who signed the name V. Logan, said in the email the power outage had "minimally impacted" housing units.

"All housing units have functional lighting," the email said. "Heat and hot water has not been impacted. Likewise, inmate meals are not impacted; inmates are receiving regularly scheduled hot meals each day."

Taken together, the accounts of nearly three dozen inmates given to federal defenders painted a different picture of conditions inside the jail.

Heat was the main complaint. The heat was spotty to nonexistent, depending on the floor. Hot water was scarce. Hot food had not been served for several days, with canned food handed out cell by cell. One inmate, who kept kosher, said he had only been given canned sardines.

The inmates were promised extra blankets, but they never came. The commissary, because of the limited electricity, was closed. "All said they were wearing whatever they could to stay warm," said Randi Chavis, a federal defender in the Central Islip, N.Y., office who spoke to several people. "Extra pairs of socks, towels wrapped around their heads, durags, thermals if they have them."

The conditions were aggravated by the lack of electrical power, inmates told the lawyers and paralegals. The jail had abandoned its usual routines, with inmates kept on partial lockdown for safety reasons.

Because power outlets were not working, the inmates could not use the computers that usually allow them to communicate with relatives and place requests for prescription refills.

"One man takes anti-seizure medication which he is allowed to keep with him," Ms. Chavis said. "He takes two pills a day and is down to his last three pills."

Legal visits and family visits had been canceled since Sunday, the lawyers said.

The recent events come on the heels of the government shutdown, which impeded the ability of lawyers to visit their clients in federal jails, including at M.D.C. It did not immediately appear that the power and heat issues were related to the shutdown.

On Thursday, the federal defenders filed an emergency motion to remove from the jail an inmate whose asthma had worsened from the cold. The inmate, Dino Sanchez, a Brooklyn man in his 40s, had recently entered the jail, a federal defender, Benjamin Yaster, said.

Mr. Yaster said in an interview that his client had been among those left in a dark cell, illuminated only by sunlight from the windows, virtually around the clock. "The population was kept in their cells for 23 hours," he said. "He's stuck in these cold conditions in a short sleeved jumpsuit and a short sleeved undershirt."

"He feels short of breath and is wheezing and coughing more than he normally would," said Mr. Yaster.

The federal defenders initially requested that the M.D.C. management provide backup heating or more blankets. They later requested that inmates be moved to an adjacent building, now empty but for a few dozen female inmates.

They said they received no response. "Not only have the conditions been disgraceful but we have peppered them with questions and we get nothing but silence," said David E. Patton, head of the federal defender office. The office represents thousands of indigent defendants.

"They might say, 'an incident occurred,' or 'visiting is canceled' but when we follow-up to ask if people have heat, hot water, or adequate access to their families or attorneys, they stonewall us," Mr. Patton said.

The building next door, also run by the jail, has full power and heat.

Mr. Sanon, the labor union leader, said he contacted the warden beginning early last week and toured the jail with him. He was assured heat would be monitored. "To no avail," he said on Thursday.

"This morning again I got a call," he added. "It was freezing."

Ms. Bencebi, the union treasurer, said she was particularly concerned for older inmates. "I have several inmates that are very

elderly," she said. "One of them complained that he's been sick for the last few days. He looks sickly. He's walking slower. Talking slower."

On Friday, local elected officials reacted to news reports of the conditions inside the jail. Brad Lander, a Brooklyn Democratic councilman, said on Twitter, "The freezing prisoners at the Metropolitan Detention Center in Sunset Park are banging out SOS for all of us to hear."

Representative Nydia M. Velázquez visited the jail on Friday, <u>writing on Twitter</u> that there was some restored heat in the facility, along with hot water and hot meals.

But she said she was continuing to watch the situation closely: "Still not at full capacity. Still cold & dark."

# \*\*\* Update \*\*\* Partial Power Outage at the Metropolitan Detention Center Brooklyn, NY

Brooklyn, NY: On January 27, 2019, Metropolitan Detention Center (MDC) Brooklyn experienced a partial power outage due to a fire in the switch gear room. The West building has limited power in some areas; however, the East building was unaffected. All affected areas have lights that are on the emergency lighting circuit which is being fed by the utility company.

The new electrical panel was installed by an outside contractor on February 2nd and a work ticket has been submitted by the electrical contractor to schedule a work crew to restore power to the new temporary service switch once the remaining part is obtained. Work is expected be completed by Monday, February 4, 2019.

Heating to the building is provided via a boiler, which was not affected by the power outage. Inmates have hot water for showers and hot water in the sinks in the cell. Essential personal hygiene items and medical services continue to be provided. The facility has accepted resources from the New York City Emergency Management and the New York Department of Corrections. The inmate telephones, inmate computers, and inmate televisions do not have electrical power at this time because of the electrical issue. The inmate's public defender phones are operational. Staff telephones in the unit officer stations are operational.

Medical staff have checked and continue to check each inmate cell-by-cell periodically and continue to dispense required medications and address the medical needs of the inmate population. Legal visits will be available today.

Tours of the facility were provided on February  $1^{st}$  and  $2^{nd}$  to representatives and staff from the United States Congress. All representatives were able to walk the facility, talk to inmates and staff and observe institution conditions.

## We continue to work expeditiously to restore power to the facility as quickly as possible.
