".....The day of the U.S. election, the news site The Hill published an article by Lieutenant General Michael T. Flynn, who has since been named as Trump's national security adviser. "The forces of radical Islam derive their ideology from radical clerics like Gülen, who is running a scam," Flynn wrote. "We should not provide him safe haven.... It is imperative that we remember who our real friends are." (Flynn, who runs a consulting firm hired by a company with links to the Turkish government, seems unaware that radical Islamic groups like the Islamic State, or ISIS, are more likely to decapitate someone like Gülen.)

That article, according to the financier with contacts in the Turkish government, led Erdogan and his associates to believe a Trump administration would not demand more evidence to justify deporting Gülen. So, almost immediately, Erdogan stopped condemning Trump and instead voiced support for him. The day after the U.S. election, Turkish Prime Minister Binali Yildirim issued a statement directly linking his country's good wishes for Trump with its desire to get Gülen back. "We congratulate Mr. Trump. I am openly calling on the new president from here about the urgent extradition of Fethullah Gülen, the mastermind, executor and perpetrator of the heinous July 15 coup attempt, who lives on U.S. soil."

In a telephone call that same day with Erdogan, Trump passed on compliments to the Turkish president from a senior official with his company's business partner on the Istanbul project, whom the president-elect was reported to have called "a close friend." The official, Mehmet Ali Yalcindag, is the son-in-law of Dogan Holding owner Aydin Dogan and was instrumental in the development of the Trump complex in Turkey. That Trump delivered messages from his business partner to Erdogan has been reported in numerous media outlets in Turkey, including some closely tied to the government, and has not been denied by Turkish officials or the Trump transition team. According to the Middle Eastern financier with contacts in the Erdogan administration, Trump's casual praise of a member of the Dogan family prompted Erdogan to believe this relationship might give him leverage over the president-elect. In the past, Erdogan has placed enormous pressure on the Dogan Group, which owns media operations that have been critical of him, by imposing a \$2.5 billion tax fine and calling for supporters to boycott its newspapers and television stations. Then, just weeks after hearing Trump's kind words about his Dogan business partner, Erdogan lashed out at the Turkish company again.

On December 1, authorities detained Barbaros Muratogl, a 28-year veteran of Dogan who was the company's representative to Ankara. His alleged crime? Maintaining links to the movement led by Gülen, thus connecting the Dogan executive to the attempted coup. In response, Dogan shares fell 8.6 percent. (The purported evidence against Muratogl: public accusations from an editor at a newspaper owned by a company that competes with Dogan.) Once again, follow the dominoes as they tip over. Erdogan is frustrated in his efforts to grab Gülen; Trump praises a Turkish executive who works with his business partner there, Dogan. A few weeks later, a senior Dogan executive is detained on threadbare allegations. If Erdogan's government puts more pressure on the company that's paying millions of dollars to Trump and his children, revenue flowing from the tower complex in Istanbul could be cut off. That means Erdogan has leverage with Trump, who will soon have the power to get Gülen extradited. The financier with contacts in the Turkish government explained the dynamic to *Newsweek*: "Erdogan has something he believes Trump wants, and Trump has someone Erdogan desperately wants."....."

Aleksandr Torshin, Public Relations Specialist/ Patriotic Politician

Among Russian politicians offering solutions to conflict in the North Caucasus, Senator Aleksandr Porfiryevich Torshin stands out. As head of the Caucasus Commission and former lead in the investigation of the 2003 (?) terrorist attack on a school in Beslan, North Ossetia, Torshin has experience on the region and has offered solutions focused on further integrating the North Caucasus into Russia. Research into his political connections, ideological stance and possible financial interests reveals a man who has performed publicrelations for two presidents and has maintained a "leftist-patriotic" political convictions while adapting his party affiliation to prevailing winds.

Does he have political connections providing clout to carry out his plans? Currently his main patron appears to be his boss, Federation Council Speaker Sergey Mironov. A LOOK AT HIS CAREER SUGGESTS THAT, Rather than adhering to a particular political clan, Torshin has loyally served several administrations, adapting to prevailing political winds.

- He joined the Communist Party before the age of 20 and was entrusted with teaching jobs at a
 prestigious law school and at the Central Committee's Academy of Social Sciences.
- In 1990 Gorbachev tapped him, as one of the country's few political scientists, to handle relations with
 political parties and social movements in the new multi-party system.
- Torshin continued this public relations work after the breakup of the Soviet Union, serving as "_____ for relations with political parties and social movements" for Yeltsin's Presidential Administration, the Council of Ministers, and the Central Bank [DATES]. He happened to be out of town during two major public relations failures, the 1991 putsch and Yeltsin's 1993 confrontation with parliament.
- He served as deputy head of the Agency for Restructuring Credit Organizations, a state corporation for helping troubled banks founded in March 1999. In naming him, Russian Federal Property Fund chief and presidents Yeltsin and Putin entrusted Torshin with sensitive information and financial flows.
- Torshin gained a Senate seat in 2001 on the coattails of Mari El republic governor Leonid Markelov, whom he identified as a promising politician and helped into office. Markelov was a member of the nationalist Liberal Democratic party at the time, and Torshin's support for him may have been opportunistic, as he had correctly predicted the LDPR's rising popularity in _____ and _____ and may have wanted to ride this wave.
- His main patron today appears to be his boss, Federation Council Speaker Sergey Mironov. Though technically in different parties--Mironov heads the leftist loyal opposition party Just Russia while Torshin belongs to the ruling United Russia party-- their leftist-patriotic stance is similar.
- His being entrusted with pedagogical and public-relations work, and his long survival through different administrations, suggest possible KGB/FSB ties.

What is his political orientation?

Torshin has held leadership posts in leftist-patriotic groups. ---Conservative-patriotic ---Eurasianist.

What is the Caucasus Commission?

If it is true that the Russians hacked the Republican National Committee as well as the DNC, then their power over POTUS potentially knows few bounds.

Former and current U.S. national security officials and experts say that if it is true that the Russian government possesses documents belonging to the Republican National Committee, Donald Trump's incoming administration may be the most compromised in U.S. history.

A senior U.S. administration official confirmed to The Daily Beast that the CIA believes the Russians hacked the RNC. He spoke anonymously because he was not authorized to discuss the matter publicly.

On Friday, Dec. 9, <u>The New York Times reported</u> that hackers connected to two separate Russian security services allegedly broke into the computer systems of the RNC, but chose not to disclose the digital contents of those systems, in marked contrast to the gradual release, via WikiLeaks, of emails belonging to the Democratic National Committee throughout the spring and summer.

As a result, the report said U.S. intelligence agencies concluded with "high confidence" that the Kremlin's motive in these cyberattacks was to get Trump elected, not just do harm to his rival Hillary Clinton or undermine American democracy, as the agencies had previously concluded with only "confidence," when they announced concerns over <u>Russian interference in October</u>. One senior U.S. official told the <u>Washington Post</u> for its own story on the matter, "It is the assessment of the intelligence community that Russia's goal here was to favor one candidate over the other, to help Trump get elected."

"There's a real revolt going on," said a former intelligence officer of the CIA leaks, citing discussions with former colleagues. "They don't like [National Security Adviser nominee Michael] Flynn and they hate Trump's guts. This is their whole life's work being thrown out the door. They feel like the whole intelligence committee is on probation." The ex-spy spoke anonymously because he was not authorized to discuss the agency's internal anguish publicly. The DNC hacks, it is widely believed, were perpetrated by two independent organs of Russian intelligence. First, COZY BEAR, a hacker working for the FSB, the domestic intelligence arm, broke into the Committee's servers in mid-2015. Around the same time FANCY BEAR, a hacker affiliated with the GRU, Russia's military intelligence agency, also penetrated the servers. To drum up plausible deniability, the haul from these hacks was then sent to WikiLeaks and uploaded by two suspected cut-outs of Moscow, "Guccifer 2.0" and a newish website called DCLeaks.com.

The White House and Congress were informed by the Central Intelligence Agency and National Security Agency that the Russian officials responsible for both the RNC and DNC breaches were identified, according to the *Times*, although their names have not been publicized.

"[CIA director] John Brennan does believe the Russians are behind it," said ret. Col. Tony Shaffer, who briefed Trump National Security Advisor Michael Flynn this past week at Trump Tower. "He did brief the senate on his belief that the Russians were involved, but he did not provide any specific evidence. My understanding is the data provided was only of opinion in nature, not details of specific attacks. The American people are owed an answer, but my understanding is they are never going to get an answer because there's no basic data to back up the allegation," said Shaffer, who is a member of the New York-based London Center for Policy Research where Flynn is a fellow. House Homeland Security Committee Chairman Mike McCaul told Politico during the election he'd informed Trump that Russia was attempting to influence the elections.

"Now he hasn't had the briefing I had, but I made it clear that in my judgment it was a nation-state," McCaul said in October. His office declined to comment on the matter Saturday.

The CIA also declined to comment Saturday.

The Russians hacked our democratic institutions and sought to interfere in our elections and sow discord," said House intelligence committee Ranking Member Adam Schiff (D-CA) Saturday, citing the Director of National Intelligence James Clapper's public statement. "Sadly, in this effort the Russians were spectacularly successful. One would also have to be willfully blind not to see that these Russian actions were uniformly damaging to Secretary Clinton and helpful to Donald Trump. I do not believe this was coincidental or unintended." Schiff would not confirm that the CIA specifically believes Russia was behind the hacking related to the election. The DNI is charged with marshaling the total view of the 16 intelligence agencies his department oversees. An official close to Clapper pointed out that he has brought uncomfortable, unwelcome news to the Obama White House before, including the assessment that ISIS was rising— though not delivered as forcefully as then DIAdirector Flynn thought it should have been. Clapper also told the White House more recently that the Syrian regime was using chemical weapons on the battlefield, despite a much-heralded deal negotiated by Russia where Syria supposedly gave up all of its chemical weapons stockpile in return for avoided bombing by the U.S. The official spoke anonymously because he was not allowed to discuss the sensitive communications between Clapper and the Obama White House publicly.

In a joint bipartisan statement issued on Sunday, Dec. 11, U.S. Senators John McCain (R-AZ), Chairman of the Senate Committee on Armed Services, Lindsey Graham (R-SC), Member of the Senate Committee on Armed Services, Charles E. Schumer (D-NY), Senate Democratic Leader-elect, and Jack Reed (D-RI), Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Armed Services <u>wrote</u>: "For years, foreign adversaries have directed cyberattacks at America's physical, economic, and military infrastructure, while stealing our intellectual property. Now our democratic institutions have been targeted. Recent reports of Russian interference in our election should alarm every American."

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Trump's transition team is having none of these revelations. Having serially denied or downplayed Russia's involvement in steering the U.S. election, the team issued an unsigned statement casting doubt on the competence of the very intelligence establishment the president-elect will inherit to help him run the country in a month and a half. "These are the same people that said Saddam Hussein had weapons of mass destruction," the statement read. "The election ended a long time ago in one of the biggest Electoral College victories in history. It's now time to move on and 'Make America Great Again."

"We need a new election," said Bob Baer, a former CIA operative who himself used to interfere in the affairs of foreign governments. "This is a constitutional crisis. It's unprecedented. If the CIA had hacked and steered a democratic election in a foreign country, say France or Germany, that country would demand a new election. No question," he said in an interview.

Baer said that he agrees with Trump in the sense that, once Trump is in charge, the Agency may bend to his wishes—which makes the airing of the evidence the agency has imperative before December 19th when the Electoral College is set to certify Trump's presidency. "We cant wait until after he becomes president and has a political appointee decide whether the evidence we have on the Russians is legit or not."

In essence, Moscow's security organs could now be in possession of what the KGB used to call *kompromat* — compromising personal material — on Trump and his staff, which could then be used to blackmail them into doing Russia's bidding.

The mere possibility that Putin now knows the secrets of the RNC and the inner workings of the victorious party of the 2016 election is bound to color U.S.-Russian relations for the next four years, regardless or whether or not those secrets are in any way scandalous. Any perceived tilt by Washington toward Russia, or any accommodation struck with the Kremlin on the ongoing wars in Syria or Ukraine can now be interpreted as quid pro quo for Putin's keeping silent on what's he got on the sitting commander-in-chief or the latter's inner circle.

Tom Nichols, a professor of national security affairs at the U.S. Naval War College, told The Daily Beast, representing his personal views and not those of the War College: "The worst possibility is that the Russians are holding back what they've stolen from the RNC because it's valuable enough to keep in reserve until the presidentelect is sworn in. This is a frankly terrifying possibility."

Nichols has been an outspoken "Never Trump" Republican and written numerous articles explaining why he thinks

the president-elect is unfit for office. The Trump transition team's response to the *Times* bombshell only solidified that view. "Their answer is to 'move on,' which might be a sensible thing to say to political opponents who didn't like the outcome of the election, but it is a unimaginable answer in the face of an open Russian attack on the U.S. political system. The Russians have made it clear they have no intention of 'moving on,' and no amount of hand-waving will change that."

Trump had campaigned beyond a platform of being in favor of improving relations with Russia, and has often taken to praising Putin personally, comparing his leadership style favorably to that of Barack Obama and casting doubt on the Russian government's well-documented human-rights abuses, including allegations of the Kremlin having ordered the murder of dissidents and muckraking journalists. Trump also denied that Russia had any role in the downing of the MH17 in July 2014 in the skies above east Ukraine, despite independent international investigations saying that a Russian-imported missile was used to shoot down the commercial airliner. He has also said that Crimeans wanted to be annexed by Russia while denying that Russia had invaded Ukraine.

And then there's the fact that Trump's rumored favorite for Secretary of State, Exxon Mobil CEO Rex Tillerson, once received Russia's Order of Friendship award from Putin himself.

A former CIA operative stationed in Moscow during the height of the Cold War said that it was too soon to tell how Langley came to the conclusion that Trump was Putin's favored candidate. "They're ascribing motives to the Russians, but I'd like to see the evidence. In committee meetings and review sessions that go over this kind of thing, it's a circumstantial point to say 'they did it because of x or y.' In the absence of an intercept or of extremely reliable sources — more than one — you're making an inference that one could quibble with."

As to what kompromat might do to Trump's decision-making, the former operative says it may not carry much weight at all.

"You're making an assumption that Trump will respond to *kompromat* and not to something else, such as his business interests in Russia. He clearly has a blind spot on the country. You can be manipulated by the Chekists in many ways," the source said, using the catch-all term for Russia spies, "not just through blackmail. We also don't know what is in the RNC emails."

Or, for that matter, who will ultimately be affected by them.

The DNC hacks led to the resignation of then-chairperson Debbie Wasserman-Schultz but it is entirely unclear if they really were the decisive factor that swayed the election in Trump's favor. Other analysts have pointed to Clinton's exceedingly poor outreach to white working-class voters in battleground states such as Ohio, Michigan and Pennsylvania, all of which Trump won by narrow margins. Others have also argued that FBI Director James Comey's eleventh-hour letter notifying Congress that the investigation into Hillary Clinton's email server was still active did more to damage the Democratic nominee's chances just before voters went to the polls, than did anything contained in the DNC emails, or in campaign chairman John Podesta's personal correspondence.

Andrei Soldatov, co-author of <u>Red Web</u>, a book about Russia's cybersecurity and use of the Internet to silence dissent, thinks that the likelier target of Moscow is not Trump but rather his now powerful party. "I doubt there can be any *kompromat* on Trump which can hurt him," Soldatov said. "But the Republican Party is a different story." For Soldatov, the threatened publication of documents confirming rumors or alleged ties between Trump's cabinet picks and the Russian government could be a useful tool to keep the administration in check. "Remember the story about a former Defense Intelligence Agency chief giving interviews to [Russian state propaganda channel] RT and being paid for that?" Soldatov said, referring to Flynn, who is now Trump's national security advisor. "It would be bad enough simply to produce documentary evidence confirming things we already knew."

A former Russian spymaster agrees with that assessment.

Oleg Kalugin was a KGB general in charge of operations in the United States; he also ran the First Chief Directorate's K Branch, or arm of counterintelligence, which got up to the very sort of dirty tricks, or "active measures," that state hacking of a political party amounts to. "In the old days, in my time, we relied on human efforts: penetration, handling, manipulating people from the inside," Kalugin told The Daily Beast, noting that he wasn't personally convinced the DNC and RNC hacks were done by the Russian government and not by "individual actors."

Nevertheless, Kalugin allowed that if the FSB and GRU were responsible and Putin was now sitting on crucial information about various GOP officials, it would be reckless and dangerous to try and blackmail the White House directly. High-level officials, such as cabinet secretaries, have rarely been cultivated as spies or informants of Moscow, owing to what Kalugin characterizes as "potential repercussions."

Middle and lower-cadre officials in the State Department or military-industrial complex are deemed easier and better marks for the spooks.

In this hypothetical, a heretofore semi-anonymous RNC staffer who may have written something professionally or personally damaging to himself is likelier to find himself approached by a Russian operative and offered a chance to switch sides than a member of the National Security Council.

"Just one man can destroy everything," Kalugin said. "He doesn't have to be the president."

Blood And Gold: Smuggling And Murder In Ukraine's Grey Zone

[Some excerpts]

......This de-facto border Ukraine shares with a lawless proxy non-state runs through devastated and heavilydepopulated tracts of land, dominated by warlords and gangsters. It is a haven for criminality.....To combat smuggling, the Ukrainian authorities created a system of what they called "mobile groups" — small, mixed teams, consisting of personnel from the military, the Ukrainian Security Service (SBU), the State Fiscal Service, the State Border Service and civilian volunteers.....

[Sept 2015 near Schastye a mobile group was blown up]....

While some media outlets were swift to blame the killings on Russia-backed forces — a plausible assumption given the proximity of the incident to the front line, some commentators, including Yuriy Biryukov, an adviser to President Petro Poroshenko, suspected that the mobile group had been betrayed.....[One of those killed, Galushchenko, had earlier said of similar attacks]....."// think there are criminals among either the 92nd Brigade or the border guards:.....Two weeks before his death, Galuschenko visited his daughter in Kiev, and told her: "We've come across something really big, kid." Later, just two days before his death, he rang her and said: "In a couple of weeks we will get the upper hand on the whole smuggling trade."....

In May Heorgiy Tuka, who had been dismissed as Lugansk governor by President Poroshenko a few days earlier, told Hromadske TV that people in "the highest offices" were "managing and shielding" smuggling rackets on the front line.....

Rodion Shovkoshytnyi, leader of the mobile group deployed near Verkhnyetoretskoye that was threatened on video, has said that there were repeated instances of collaboration between members of the SBU and some military personnel in protecting smuggling activities. In particular, his claims concern certain members of the Interior Ministry's Dnipro-1 regiment.

Shovkoshytnyi wrote in June this year about the smuggling trade in the village of Novoluganskoye, northeast of

separatist-held Gorlovka. According to the Ukrainian government, the village is under Kiev's control, however the streets are effectively controlled by Russia-backed fighters and there are no Ukrainian checkpoints in the settlement. As a result, the village has become a thoroughfare for smugglers as they can legally travel to the "government-controlled" village without having to pass through any frontier checkpoints.

Shovkoshytniy said:

"If problems arise, an SBU colonel arrives immediately with two teams of troops from Dnipro-1, headed by a certain Gotsman. He's been involved in this for more than a year already. He has a business in Bakhmut [formerly Artyomovsk]. Lives in Dnipropetrovsk. The SBU know him very well. Last summer they caught him with a huge cache of weapons from Debaltsevo. And nothing. As normal."

.....The corruption was most prolific among the local "territorial" structures of the SBU, who are enmeshed in the local rackets that have origins predating the outbreak of the war......

Last month, the Russian investigative journalist Yulia Polukhina wrote an astonishingly detailed report on the smuggling trade in the Lugansk region for Novaya Gazeta. (https://www.novayagazeta.ru/articles/2016/10/24/70277vlast-vzyala-kontrabanda) In particular, Polukhina discusses the smuggling of gold and silver jewelry, manufactured at the Agat plant in separatist-held Rovenki, into Ukrainian government-controlled territory.

The plant was owned by one Aleksandr Rak, a former gangster, councilor and member of Viktor Yanukovych's Party of Regions. Rak, who enthusiastically supported the *Russkiy Mir* movement and maintained his own large security apparatus after going into legitimate business, disappeared in early 2014 after a power struggle with local Cossack paramilitaries, leaving his wife in charge of Agat.

The jewelry seized by the border guards near Stanitsa Luganskaya last August bore the hallmarks of the Agat plant....

he Chief Military Prosecutor, Anatoliy Matios, told Bobrovnikov in January that the scheme in the Schastye area was just "the tip of the iceberg." According to Matios, investigators had uncovered a transnational criminal operation, involving the delivery of drugs from Asia to Europe, via the occupied regions of the Donbass, claiming "we know all of the logistics."...

But most baffling of all was the Military Prosecutor's Office's declaration that, despite having reached the conclusion that Ukrainian servicemen were responsible, they had "sent a formal request for international legal assistance to the Russian Federation."

That seems like an incredibly remote prospect while the two countries are engaged in an undeclared war. Until such assistance is received, the case appears to be on the back burner.....

several key figures involved in both the smuggling operations and the effort to curb them have met premature deaths in recent months.

On September 18 of this year, the deputy head of the Ukrainian Presidential Administration, Andriy Taranov, <u>died in</u> <u>a freak accident</u> while riding a water scooter on the Dnieper river in Kiev. Taranov is believed to have been closely involved in overseeing the formation of the mobile groups and the wider fight against smuggling.....

That same month, Yevgeny Zhilin, former commander of a separatist paramilitary unit, was shot dead in a Moscow restaurant. Russia's <u>Kommersant reported</u> that Zhilin's death was likely linked to a dispute over fuel smuggling on the front line in the Donbass. Polukhina found that Zhilin had been managing gas stations in the occupied territories that were owned by Sergei Kurchenko, a businessman and MP with close links to Yanukovych, who himself died in July this year, apparently having fallen from his horse.

Then, at the beginning of October, a Russian militant, Armen Bagiyan, nicknamed Bagi, was killed near the village of Zhyoltoye,....

According to Polukhina's sources, Bagiyan was in charge of smuggling operations in this area, in particular the trade of gold and silver to and from the Agat factory.

The criminal trade along the front line not only enriches warlords and gangsters on the occupied side of the frontier, but it also compromises some of the troops defending the Ukrainian lines and their superiors, damaging Ukraine's national security.

Secondly the introduction of Ukraine's troops to the smuggling trade can do nothing but harm to the longer-term prospects of the fight against corruption. Nor does the apparent complicity of some within higher positions help. But worst of all is the damage to the authority of Ukraine's judicial and law-enforcement systems..... justice is demonstrative rather than effective. If murder and treason can go unpunished, then what hope is there for wider reform? The resulting lawlessness or *bespredel* (literally "boundlessness") is by far the greatest obstacle facing Ukraine in its path to escaping the corrupt post-Soviet realm.
