PAKISTAN AUTHORITIES TRANSFER SHEIKH TO SAFEHOUSE ON PRISON COMPOUND

(SBU) Sindh government officials confirmed that over the weekend Pakistani authorities transferred Omar Sheikh and his three co-conspirators to a newly built facility within the Karachi Central Prison compound. In an order issued February 6 (below), the Sindh Home Department asserted this facility satisfies the criteria of a government safehouse, further adding "NO internet, telephone and for that matter any device/means of communicating with outside world is to be provided" (emphasis original). The detainees' families will be placed in nearby accommodation. The Sindh Home Department order outlined strong security measures including an inner cordon (police) and outer cordon (Rangers) of physical security; family members are also not permitted to bring any item into the prison facility, and any food or medicine brought will be thoroughly inspected by a doctor before it is provided to the detainees.

(SBU) The order lists a fifth detainee to be housed at the newly constructed facility: Abdul Hameed Bugti, remanded to protective custody following his acquittal by the Sindh High Court on April 2, 2020 over charges he participated in the 2005 bombing of the Pakistan Industrial Development Corporation. (COMMENT: The move to house the detainees at a purpose-built facility on the grounds of Karachi Central Prison seeks to comply with the Supreme Court's order while permitting the Sindh government to maintain maximal security measures. END COMMENT)

Subject: [EXTERNAL] Request for U.S.-Mexico Migration meeting here in Mexico-North American Leaders Meeting

Dear Secretaries Blinken, Mayorkas, Attorney General Garland, and NSC Chair Sullivan,

Congratulations on what appears to be shaping up as a historic G-20 and COP-26.

Here in Mexico we continue to build on the momentum and success created by you and your teams through the HLED, HLSD, and John Kerry's visit to the Yucatán. We together have spent many hours with Mexico's President and his cabinet on the economic, security, energy and climate change, and migration initiatives.

In my view, we are set for a transformational and durable change in the U.S.-Mexico relationship.

Since Secretary Kerry's visit to southern Mexico, we have-

- 1. Organized and hosted a high level meeting in the south with 7 governors from southeast Mexico, United States business leaders, and GOM with S. Ebrard and S. Clouthier to chart the path forward for development in the south. We will all meet again on November 29 to continue to flesh out commitments.
- 2. We have organized meetings in the narrow Mexican isthmus between the Pacific and the Gulf/Atlantic to learn about the more than one billion dollars being invested in the Transoceanic Corridor (known as El Corredor de Tehuantepec). The railroad has existed since 1907, and the current complete renovation and upgrade is two thirds complete with modern infrastructure. The railroad is expected to be completed March 2022. And the expansions of the two ports on either side of the isthmus are underway. The security team for the Corredor Project is developing a state of the art security program, that will create a beltway of security in the south.
- 3. On the U.S.-Mexico border, we have organized meetings along both sides of the border in the three northeastern Mexican states (Nuevo Leon, Tamaulipas, and Coahuila). We will host a meeting in Monterrey on December 7th, with the three Governors, the City of San Antonio and the U.S. business community.

4. In Tamaulipas, the border cities of Laredo and Nuevo Laredo are now hoping to organize a binational greenbelt effort that would address the security, migration, and environmental issues on both sides of the border. The City of San Antonio has agreed to help with their expertise from the San Antonio Riverwalk. We will convene the meeting to review the plan with the affected interests including the Border Patrol on December 6th.
