Dear Chairman Bishop and Ranking Member Grijalva:

The Department of Justice wishes to notify Congress of a constitutional concern with H.R. 2199, the "Federal Lands Asset Inventory Reform Act of 2017," as ordered reported by the Committee on Natural Resources. We have the following constitutional concern and recommendation.

Section 2(c)(7) would violate the Recommendations Clause by requiring the Secretary of the Interior to submit a report to congressional committees that includes "recommendations for any legislation necessary to increase the cost-savings and enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of replacing, eliminating, or consolidating real property inventories or any components of a cadastre currently authorized by law or conducted by the Department of the Interior." U.S. Const. art. II, § 3 (obligating the President to "recommend to [Congress's] Consideration such Measures as *he shall judge* necessary and expedient") (emphasis added). "[L]aws that purport to require the President"- or his agents in the Executive Branch — "to propose legislation to Congress, regardless of whether the President judges such legislation necessary and expedient[,] . . . are unconstitutional." Application of the Recommendations Clause to Section 802 of the Medicare Prescription Drug, Improvement, and Modernization Act of 2003, 40 Op. O.L.C. __, *9 (Aug. 16, 2016),

<u>https://www.justice.gov/opinion/file/929881/download</u>. To make the recommendation of legislation in section 2(c)(7) discretionary rather than mandatory, we recommend inserting "and appropriate" after "necessary."
