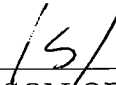

advertisements and mail-in ballots, which mail was intended to be conveyed by mail, and carried and delivered by SEEL.

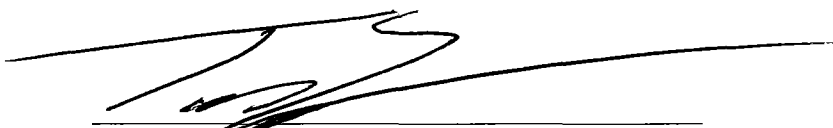
