Office on Violence Against Women

- OVW is a component of the United States Department of Justice (DOJ).
- Created in 1995, OVW administers grant programs authorized by the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and subsequent legislation and provides national leadership on issues of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.
- OVW grants support coordinated community responses to hold offenders accountable and serve victims.

OVW Priority Areas

In FY 2023, OVW is interested in supporting the priority areas identified below:

Advance racial equity as an essential component of ending sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking.

Increase access to justice for all survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, including through exploration of survivor-centered criminal justice system reform.

Strengthen efforts to prevent and end sexual assault, including victim services and civil and criminal justice responses.

Expand economic justice and financial advocacy for survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking, including as a tool for violence prevention.

Improve outreach, services, civil and criminal justice responses, prevention, and support for survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking from underserved communities, particularly LGBTQ and immigrant communities.

Program Description

The purpose of the Research and Evaluation (R&E) Initiative is to research and evaluate approaches to combatting domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. The initiative is designed to support researcher-practitioner partnerships to study VAWA-funded strategies for serving victims and holding offenders accountable.



What's New About This Program

The 2022 reauthorization of the VAWA Act and the FY 2023 Appropriations Act established several new OVW programs that involve research and evaluation.

Policing, prosecution, and trauma-informed criminal justice responses

LGBT-specific services, outreach, training, education, and prevention

Restorative Justice

Language access in responses to VAWA crimes



Purpose Area(s)

Additional topics for R&E include:

Evaluations of VAWA-funded interventions

Evaluation of training curricula, tools, and other technical assistance (TA) resources developed and implemented with OVW grant funds

Secondary data analyses related to domestic/dating violence, sexual assault, and/or stalking

Research, evaluation, and data analysis related to domestic violence homicide prevention



Purpose Area(s) cont'd.

Evaluations of Emerging Innovations

- Flexible financial assistance or other ways of mitigating survivors' financial insecurity resulting from their victimization.
- Strategies for serving justice-involved, incarcerated, and/or formerly incarcerated survivors.
- Means of supporting survivors' recovery that are outside the mainstream, including but not limited to: art therapy, writing workshops, yoga, massage, animal-assisted interventions, selfdefense/martial arts classes, somatic interventions, community engagement, and ways of healing that are rooted in cultural traditions.



Purpose Area(s) cont'd.

Evaluations of Emerging Innovations

- Approaches to addressing the safety, healing, and justice/legal needs of survivors whose lives intersect with the child welfare system (including protective parents whose children are removed from them, youth in foster care and youth aging out of foster care, including pregnant and parenting youth.)
- Engaging culturally specific, community-based organizations and youth in prevention and response programming.
- Engaging community violence intervention programs in the prevention of, and response to, VAWA crimes.



Activities that Compromise Victim Safety and Recovery or Undermine Offender Accountability OVW does not fund activities that jeopardize victim safety, deter or prevent physical or emotional healing for victims, or allow offenders to escape responsibility for their actions.

Applications that propose any such activities may receive a deduction in points during the review process or may be eliminated from consideration.

Please note that OVW will support survivor-centered alternative pathways to justice and non-criminal approaches to accountability that fall within the statutory scope of this program.

Out-of-Scope Activities

The activities listed below are out of the program scope and will not be supported by this program's funding. See also the list of unallowable costs in the Funding Restrictions section of the FY 2023 R&E solicitation.

Applications that propose activities deemed to be substantially out-of-scope may be eliminated from consideration.

- Proposals to conduct needs assessment activities exclusively for the purpose of program improvement. (Refer to the OVW research decision tree in the Solicitation Companion Guide.)
- Proposals primarily to purchase equipment, materials, or supplies. (A budget may include these items if they are necessary to conduct the proposed study.)
- Proposals that are not responsive to this specific solicitation.
- Programs or services unrelated to the scope of the research project or the intervention being evaluated.
- Training in support of programs or direct services unrelated to or, unassociated with, the proposed research project.

Award Period and Amounts

- The budget cap of \$450,000 includes direct and indirect costs
- Budgets, including the total estimated funding requested on the SF-424, must reflect the requested project duration (no more than 36 months)
- R&E awards typically are in the range of \$300,000 to \$450,000
- All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.
- Budgets should include funding for accessibility and compensation for project partners and research participants.



Eligible Applicants

The following entities are eligible to apply for R&E Initiative funding:

- Nonprofits, including culturally specific and population specific organizations, with 501 (c)(3) status with the IRS
- Nonprofits, including culturally specific and population specific organizations, without 501(c)(3) status with the IRS
- Private institutions of higher education
- Public and state-controlled institutions of higher education
- City or township governments

- County governments
- State governments
- Native American tribal governments (federally recognized)
- Native American tribal organizations (other than federally recognized tribal governments)
- Faith-Based and Community Organizations (must meet eligibility requirements)



Ineligible Entities and Disqualifying Factors

Applications submitted by ineligible entities or that do not meet all program eligibility requirements will not be considered for funding.

An application deemed deficient in one or more of the following categories may not be considered for funding:

- Activities that compromise victim safety
- Out-of-scope activities
- Unallowable costs
- Pre-award risk assessment
- Completeness of application contents
- Timeliness



Mandatory Program Requirements

Methodological Principles

Any project funded under this solicitation must adhere to the methodological principles listed below. OVW will only support research methods that:

- Are well-matched to the purpose of the research and build on existing evidence;
- Uphold victim safety as the paramount objective, with the understanding that scientific progress is always subordinate to that objective;
- Are likely to yield findings that have practical utility for victim services providers and justice system professionals;
- Are developed collaboratively between researchers and practitioners;
- Place as minimal a burden as possible on crime victims, offenders, and systems;
- Operate from a cogent theoretical framework; and
- Have been approved by an Institutional Review Board (IRB) if they involve human subjects research.



Methodological Principles cont'd.

OVW will not support research that:

- Prioritizes scientific rigor over practical value or ethics, ethics being broadly defined and not limited to published standards;
- Is minimally useful to practitioners;
- Offers minimal cost benefit;
- Lacks a clear theoretical foundation; and/or
- Is designed to generate descriptive findings that emphasize vulnerabilities and neglect strengths
 of specific populations. (For instance, a study that examines risk-taking behavior among
 members of a certain population, without testing any strategies for serving the target
 population, is not of value to OVW.)



Confidentiality and Human Subjects Protection

Any recipient of an award under this solicitation will be required to comply with DOJ regulations on confidentiality and human subjects' protection. See Human Subjects and Privacy Protection, at: <u>https://nij.ojp.gov/funding/human-subjects-and-privacyprotection</u>.



Expected Products

OVW expects products to result from each award under this solicitation, taking the form of all the following:

- One or more presentations made via webinar or conferences.
- One or more products written in layperson's terms and intended for practitioners and/or the general public; and
- One or more scholarly products, meaning publishable, peer-reviewed, scientific journal articles, and/or (if appropriate) law review journal articles, book chapter(s) or book(s) in the academic press.



SAM and Grants.gov Registration

Registration

Applicants must register with the systems listed below to successfully apply. The two-step registration process includes:

Step 1: Register with the System for Award Management (SAM) includes receiving a UEI, and Grants.gov no later than **June 29, 2023, 11:59 p.m. ET**

Step 2: Register with JustGrants no later than July 3, 2023, 9:00 p.m. ET

NOTE: Registration with SAM and Grants.gov must be completed before an applicant can register with JustGrants. **Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin the registration process or ensure that all accounts are active and up to date by June 12, 2023.**

Applicants must complete the following forms in Grants.gov:

- Application for Federal Assistance (SF-424)
- Disclosure of Lobbying Activities (SF-LLL)

Application Components

Letter of Intent (LOI)

Potential applicants are encouraged to submit a non-binding letter of intent by June 1, 2023, to <u>OVW.Research@usdoj.gov</u>. Interested applicants who do not submit a Letter of Intent are still eligible to apply.



Application Contents

Proposal Abstract

Proposal Narrative

Budget Detail Worksheet and Narrative

Appendices (required)

Proposal Abstract

- The abstract (no more than 400 words) should summarize the proposed project in plain language, including its purpose primary activities, expected outcomes, intended beneficiaries, and subrecipient involvement.
- If the application is funded, the abstract typically will become public information and be used to describe the project.
- The abstract does not count against the page limit for the Proposal Narrative.



Proposal Narrative

The proposal narrative must include these five sections:

I. Statement of the problem (10%)

- The topic the proposed project will address
- Purpose, goals, and objectives of the proposed project
- A review of relevant literature
- Statement as to how the study is expected to contribute to one or more of the six Areas of Study

II. Project design and implementation (50%)

- An explanation of the theoretical foundation on which the proposed study is based
- A description of a sound research design and appropriate analytic methods, including research questions, hypotheses, description of sample, and analysis plan, all of which must align with the Methodological Principles in the Program Requirements section of this solicitation
- A discussion of potential pitfalls of the proposed project design and how the applicant will minimize and/or mitigate them
- An explanation of how people with direct experience with the issues being studied, and connection to the communities being studied, are involved in project design and implementation (other than as study participants)



Proposal Narrative cont'd..

III. Potential impact (15%)

Implications for practice and policy in victim services and the justice system's response to VAWA crimes.

IV. Capabilities and Competencies (20%)

- Description of the applicant's qualifications and the qualifications of key staff and partners.
- An approach and a management plan that reflect a strong researcher-practitioner partnership.

V. Dissemination plan (5%)

• A brief description of a plan to produce at least one scholarly product (see Expected Products) and make findings available to broader audiences, including practitioners, through written material and interactive formats, such as conferences or webinars.



Budget Worksheet and Budget Narrative

- Applicants must submit a detailed budget and budget narrative and must upload the associated documentation as an attachment in JustGrants.
- The budget narrative must describe each line item requested in the budget and explain all costs included in the budget, including how the costs of goods and services are determined and how they will fulfill the objectives of the project.
- Budgets, including the total estimated funding requested on the SF-424, must reflect the requested project duration (no more than 36 months)

Additional Application Components

Additional Application Components

Letter of Nonsupplanting

 Applicants must attach a letter to OVW's Director, signed by the Authorized Representative, certifying that federal funds will not be used to supplant non-federal funds should a grant award be made.

Confidentiality Notice Form

- All applicants are required to acknowledge that they have received notice that grantees/ subgrantees must comply with the confidentiality and privacy requirements of VAWA, as amended.
- Applicants must upload and attach, under Additional Attachments in JustGrants, the completed acknowledgement form available on the OVW website. This form must be signed by the Authorized Representative.



Additional Application Components

Pre-award Risk Assessment

- Each applicant must submit, as an attachment, a mandatory Pre-award Risk Assessment
- Do not submit responses from a prior fiscal year without updating them to be responsive to all questions listed in the questionnaire
- Provide complete responses that address all questions

Summary Data Sheet

- Each applicant must submit, as an attachment, the Summary Data Sheet, which should be one to four pages in length (single or double spaced).
- Quick synopsis of key aspects of the proposal.
- Answer each criteria included.
- Data is used in the initial review of the application.



Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (if applicable)

- Applicants that intend to charge indirect costs must have a current, signed, federally approved indirect cost rate agreement and must upload and attach a copy of the agreement to their application in JustGrants.
- Applicants rate may elect to charge a de minimis rate of 10% of modified total direct costs, which may be used indefinitely.
- Organizations that wish to negotiate an indirect cost rate should contact OVW's Grants Financial Management Division at <u>OVW.GFMD@usdoj.gov</u> or 1-888-514-8556.



Summary of Other Federal Funding

- Applicants must disclose all current and recent OVW awards (if applicable)
- If the applicant has a current grant or cooperative agreement under any OVW grant program or an award that closed within the 12 months before the date this solicitation closes, the information must be provided in a table using the sample format found on the OVW website.
- Applicants also must disclose all other federal grant programs from which the applicant currently receives funding or for which it has applied for funding in FY 2023 to do similar work.
- A determination by OVW that an award under this solicitation would duplicate other federal funds received by the applicant may be removed from further consideration.



Applicant Financial Capability Questionnaire (if applicable)

All nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations that apply for funding from OVW and have not previously (or within the last three years) received funding from OVW must complete an *Applicant Financial Capability Questionnaire* and attach it to their application in JustGrants.

Note: Applicants may be required to submit their current year's audit report at a later time.



Disclosures and Assurances

Each applicant must review, complete, and submit all disclosures, assurances, and certifications a described below:

- Disclosure of Lobbying Activities (SF-LLL)
- DOJ Certified Standard Assurances
- DOJ Certifications Regarding Lobbying; Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matters; and Drug-Free Workplace Requirements
- Disclosure of Process Related to Executive Compensation



Key Submission Information

Formatting and Technical Requirements

- 1. Double-spaced (charts may be single-spaced)
- 2. 8½ x 11-inch pages
- 3. One-inch margins
- 4. Type no smaller than 12 point, Times New Roman (TNR) or Arial font, except for footnotes, which may be in 10-point font
- 5. Correctly numbered pages
- 6. No more than 30 pages for the Project Narrative (excludes the title page and table of contents and figures)
- 7. Documents in the following formats: Microsoft Word (.doc), PDF files (.pdf), or Text Documents (.txt)
- 8. Headings and sub-headings that correspond to the sections identified in this section of this solicitation



Submission Information

- The complete application package (this solicitation, including links to required forms) is available on Grants.gov and on the OVW website.
- All applications must be submitted electronically first in Grants.gov (SF-424 and SF-LLL) and then in JustGrants.
- OVW will not accept applications after the JustGrants deadline, except for severe inclement weather or natural or man-made disaster.
- The Grants.Gov deadline is 4 days before the JustGrants application deadline.



Submission Information

Applications will be submitted to OVW in two steps:

Step 1: Submit the required Application for Federal Assistance standard form (SF-424) and the Disclosure of Lobbying Activities form (SF-LLL) in Grants.gov https://www.grants.gov/web/grants/forms/sf-424family.html.

Step 2: The applicant must then submit the full application, including attachments, in JustGrants at justicegrants.usdoj.gov no later than July 5, 9:00 p.m. ET.

NOTE: For the application to be on time, the full application must be submitted in JustGrants by the JustGrants application deadline. JustGrants functions better using a PC with Chrome or Edge web browser.
