

Professor Feldman is Associate Professor of Law at U.C. Hastings College of the Law. She specializes in law and bioscience and is Director of Hastings' [Law and Bioscience Project](#) (L.A.B.). Professor Feldman also serves on the Executive Committee of the Antitrust Section of the American Association of Law Schools.
