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Dear DOJ--

My concerns about the American food supply are numerous--so I'll address just one issue here. It is stunning to me that companies like Monsanto have so much clout that the U.S. government does their bidding when it comes to the control of food labeling.

I don't want to consume any dairy products made from cows injected with Bst (an entirely unnecessary product) and I don't want to eat genetically-tinkered or irradiated foods. I believe I have the right to choose not to eat certain things.

To allow a big company to obscure the nature of its products and convey them to the world's population is wrong--especially when they know that sales of their products would suffer if their foods had IRRADIATED, GENETICALLY MODIFIED, or BST labels on them.
