I was able to enjoy best sellers at a pretty standard price of \$9.99 each. Then, along came the ipad, and all of a sudden I couldn't touch a best seller for under \$12.99, often more. Even worse, a site that I used to purchase books often no longer would apply their coupon to many books due to publisher's restrictions. On top of that, most major publishing houses will not sell ebooks to my local library.
