In re: Civil Action No. No. 12-cv-00395-RPM-MEH

I am asking you to set aside the settlement between the Department of Justice and defendants Gunnison Energy Corp. and SG Interests.

GEC and SGI colluded to fix the bids on gas development leases. Yet, with this settlement, they have been allowed to keep those leases after paying the difference between what they paid originally and the price that should have been obtained. They remain in good standing with the BLM, eligible to bid on future leases and, they hold numerous leases from previous auctions.


As a comparison, this same department sentenced Tim DeChristopher to a 2-year sentence with a \$10,000 fine for his protest of BLM leasing.

In setting aside the settlement, I request that these criminals be prosecuted to the full extent of the law, including:

- Permanently rescinding the leases involved,
- Levying of a significant fine in line with the ruthlessness and audacity of the crime,
- Investigation of previously acquired leases to determine if they were obtained by similar illegal activities and,
- Jail time for the perpetrators.

Only with these steps will the severity of the crime be recognized and similar attempts to circumvent the law be averted in the future.
