FINDING & JUDGMENT

There being a finding of NOT GUILTY. Defendant is discharged. GUILTY.

Defendant has been convicted as charged of the offense(s) of conspiracy to violate the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, in violation of 15 USC 78dd-2(a)(1) and (3) and 78dd-2(b) & 18 USC 371, as charged in Count 1 of the Indictment, and violations of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, in violation of 15 USC 78dd-2(a)(1) and (3) and 78dd-2(b) and 18 USC 2, as charged in Counts 2-16 and 18-48.

SENTENCE OR PROBATION ORDER

The court asked whether defendant had anything to say why judgment should not be pronounced. Because no sufficient cause to the contrary was shown, or appeared to the court, the court adjudged the defendant guilty as charged and convicted and ordered that the defendant pay a fine in the amount of \$10,000 as to Count 1, and \$75,000 as to each of Counts 2-16 and 18-48 for a total fine in the amount of \$3,460,000. Said fine is to be paid to the U. S. District Clerk within one (1) year.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS OF PROBATION

In addition to the special conditions of probation imposed above, it is hereby ordered that the general conditions of probation set out on the reverse side of this judgment be imposed. The Court may change the conditions of probation, reduce or extend the period of probation, and at any time during the probation period or within a maximum probation period of five years permitted by law, may issue a warrant and revoke probation for a violation occurring during the probation period.

The court orders commitment to the custody of the Attorney General and recommends
