I have just returned from a trip to Newark, New Jersey and am informed that during my absence you telephoned long distance relative to any memoranda of law I may have prepared covering the admissibility of expert testimony, or written transcriptions of inaudible recordings.

In the Gillars case the appellant stipulated the accuracy of the written transcripts of all the recordings involved and it was not necessary to try to prove by expert "listeners" what the recordings said. I did make some brief study of the law but did not prepare anything in written form. The only case I found directly on the subject was United States v. Schanerman, 150 F.2d 9hl. We obtained the briefs in this case but the point was not treated at any length in the briefs and they shed no further light on the subject. I do not think this case will help you but you may find it of interest.

We have been receiving excellent reports about the progress of the Tokyo Rose trial and expect at the conclusion to hear of her conviction. Keep up the good work!

We have made further study of the question of the defendant's alleged expatriation by her marriage to a Portuguese national in April 1945. We have come to the following conclusions.

Section 3 of the Act of September 22, 1922 (42 Stat. 1021-1022) provides for the loss of citizenship by an American woman by marrying an alien ineligible for citizenship. Section 4(a) of the Act of March 3, 1931 (46 Stat. 1511) amended Section 3 of the Act of 1922 above, deleting the provision for loss of citizenship by marriage to an alien ineligible for citizenship. The present Nationality Act of 1940 specifically repealed both of the above cited Acts. We therefore conclude that since the present law, the Act of 1940, is silent on the subject of loss of citizenship by marriage to any alien, such loss of citizenship cannot take place.

The various methods by which citizenship can be lost under the present law which is applicable to the date of the defendant's marriage are set out in Section 801 of Title 8. They

do not include loss by marriage to an alien. Section 808 provides that the loss of nationality shall result solely from the performance of the acts or fulfillment of the conditions specified in that chapter. We therefore conclude that these means are exclusive and that this Section operates to prevent the defendant's alleged loss of citizenship.

For your information this question was discussed in great detail with Messrs. Yingling and Keegan of the Legal Division of the Department of State. Both men, who are experts in the field of nationality and expatriation, concurrentirely in the views outlined above.



This will acknowledge your letter of November 16, 1948, relative to the above case.

We concur in your conclusion that the defendant has not lost her American citizenship by marriage to Philip D'Aquino.

The Section cited by the defendant; namely, 8 U.S.C. 717 (a), is not applicable because it relates to the regaining of citizenship already lost by marriage.

The Nationality Act of 1940 repealed and amended many previous statutes on the subject of nationality. Among those repealed was the Act of March 3, 1931, except Section 9. That section, which was not repealed, provides that an American citizen does not lose citizenship by marriage to an alien after March 3, 1931, in the absence of a formal declaration of renunciation before a court having jurisdiction over naturalization. Therefore, we hold that this defendant is and has been, as alleged in the indictment, a citizen of the United States.



Re: United States v. Iva Toguri D'Aquino

You will recall that we have had previous correspondence with you concerning Mrs. Iva Toguri D'Aquino presently a defendant in a prosecution for treason in the Morthern District of California, with particular reference to her application for an American passport and her attempts to return to the United States after the outbreak of hostilities, December 7, 1941.

Information has come to our attention indicating that this defendant, probably under the name of Kiss Ikuko Toguri; on March 30, 1912 filed an application for evacuation at the Swiss Consulate in Tokyo, together with other documents in support of that application. Late in 1912 it is believed that the defendant filed a document withdrawing her application for repatriation to the United States.

We have been previously informed that these documents are not in the files of the Department of State. This is to request that through appropriate channels the Department of State ascertain whether or not these documents are in the possession of the Swiss Foreign Office, or of the Swiss Consulate in Tokyo. If such is the case, it would be of considerable help to the Government in the prosecution of this case if the original documents or certified copies thereof could be obtained and forwarded to this Department.


