PROPOSED DECISION

Claimant has presented a claim against the Hungarian Government under Section 303 of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended.

Section 303 of the Act provides for the receipt and determination by the Commission, in accordance with applicable substantive law, including international law, of the validity and amounts of claims of nationals of the United States against the Governments of Bulgaria, Hungary and Rumania.

Evidence available to the Commission establishes that claimant never acquired nationality of the United States.

The Commission, therefore, finds that this claim should be and the same is hereby denied. Other elements bearing upon the compensability of the claim have not been considered.
