PROPOSED DECISION

This is a claim against the Government of Hungary under Section 303(1) of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, for \$29,193.00 by MAGDALENA GERO KELLER, a citizen of the United States since her marriage to a citizen of the United States on August 22, 1922, for loss of property in Hungary during World War II.

The Commission finds that the claimant was the sole owner of certain items of personal property and owned a one-half interest in certain other items of personal property in Hungary and Northern Transylvania, Rumania, which were lost as a result of World War II and for which loss no compensation has been paid by the Government of Hungary. The Commission further finds that the loss actually sustained amounted to nine thousand one hundred and fifty-three dollars (\$9,153.00) and concludes that claimant is entitled to an award under Section 303(1) of the Act. Under this Section awards are limited to two-thirds of the loss or damage actually sustained.

AWARD

Pursuant to the provisions of the International Claims Settlement Act of 1949, as amended, an award is hereby made to MAGDALENA GERO KELLER in the amount of six thousand one hundred and two dollars (\$6,102.00).

Payment of any part of this award shall not be construed to have divested the claimant herein, or the Government of the United States on her behalf, of any rights against the Government of Hungary for the unpaid balance of the claim, if any.
